

Milwaukee Bucks hire Adrian Griffin as head coach

The Milwaukee Bucks have hired Adrian Griffin as head coach, making the official announcement on Monday, June 5, 2023.

Griffin, who becomes the 17th head coach in franchise history, brings 15 seasons of NBA coaching experience to the Bucks, most recently spending the last five seasons as an assistant coach with the Toronto Raptors.

"Adrian is a widely respected coach and former player, who brings great leadership and experience to our team, said Bucks general manager Jon Horst. "His championship-level coaching pedigree, character, basketball acumen and ability to connect with and develop players make him the ideal choice to lead our team. He has earned this opportunity."

In Griffin's time as an assistant coach, the Raptors finished in the league's top 10 of both defensive rating and fewest points allowed per game in four of his five seasons, including in 2019-20 when they allowed a leaguelow 106.5 points per game. He was part of the development of a young core of players that included the league's Most Improved Player, the NBA Rookie of the Year and four players who made six All-Star appearances.

"I'm incredibly honored and grateful to Wes, Jamie, Dee, Jimmy and Jon to be named the head coach of the Milwaukee Bucks," said Griffin. "The Bucks are a championship organization and I'm thrilled to work with an established roster of high character and talented players. I'm excited to be back in Milwaukee and I can't wait to get started."

Prior to joining the Raptors, Griffin spent two seasons as an assistant coach with the Oklahoma City Thunder from 2016-18. His NBA coaching experience



also includes stops as an assistant coach with the Orlando Magic (2015-16), Chicago Bulls (2010-15) and the Bucks (2008-10). In Griffin's 15 seasons as an assistant coach, he was part of teams that made the playoffs 11 times, with two Conference Finals appearances in addition to winning an NBA title with the Raptors in 2019.

"Adrian is well-regarded throughout the NBA, and we believe that his vast experience working under and playing for successful head coaches makes him the right

person to guide our team in competing for championships," said Bucks co-owners Wes Edens, Jamie Dinan and Dee and Jimmy Haslam. "Following a widespread coaching search, we are extremely impressed by Adrian's leadership and communication skills and welcome him to the Bucks family."

A native of Wichita, KS, Griffin began his coaching career after a nine-year NBA playing career with Boston, Dallas, Houston, Chicago and Seattle from 1999-2008. He appeared in 477

regular-season games in his NBA career and averaged 4.0 points in 16.8 minutes per game. Griffin also saw action in 48 playoff games, including in 2006 when he reached the NBA Finals with the Dallas Mavericks.

Griffin played collegiately at Seton Hall for four seasons where he earned All-Big East Second Team honors as a senior and was inducted into the school's Athletics Hall of Fame in 2010. After his collegiate career, Griffin played professionally in the United States Basketball League, the Continental Basketball Association and internationally in Italy. His coaching experience also includes working with the USA men's national team that won gold at the FIBA Basketball World Cup in Spain in 2014.

A formal press conference introducing Griffin as the Bucks' head coach was held on June 6, 2023 in GATH-ER at Deer District.

What Is Juneteenth?

Juneteenth commemorates the effective end of slavery in the United States


Juneteenth (short for "June Nineteenth") marks the day when federal troops arrived in Galveston, TX in 1865 to take control of the state and ensure that all enslaved people be freed. The troops' arrival came a full two and a half years after the signing of the Emancipation Proclamation. Juneteenth honors the end to slavery in the United States and is considered the longest-running African American holiday.


Confederate General Robert E. Lee had surrendered at Appomattox Court House in Virginia two months earlier, but slavery had remained relatively unaffected in Texas—until U.S. General Gordon Granger stood on Texas soil and read General Orders No. 3: "The people of Texas are informed that, in accordance with a proclamation from the Executive of the United States, all slaves are free."

The Emancipation Proclamation

The Emancipation Proclamation issued by President Abraham Lincoln on January 1, 1863, had established that all enslaved people in Confederate states in rebellion against the Union "shall be then, thenceforward, and forever free."

But in reality, the Emancipation Proclamation didn't instantly free any enslaved people. The proclamation only applied to places under Confederate control and not to slave-holding border states or rebel areas already under Union control. However, as Northern troops advanced into the Confederate South, many enslaved people fled behind Union lines.





Juneteenth and slavery in

After the war came to a close in the spring of 1865, General Granger's arrival in Galveston that June signaled freedom for Texas's 250,000 enslaved people. Although emancipation didn't happen overnight for everyone—in some cases, enslavers withheld the information until after harvest season—celebrations broke out among newly freed black people, and Juneteenth was born. That December, slavery in America was formally abol-



ished with the adoption of the 13th Amendment to the US Constitution.

The year following 1865, freedmen in Texas organized the first of what became the annual celebration of "Jubilee Day" on June 19. In the ensuing decades, Juneteenth commemorations featured music, barbecues, prayer services and other activities, and as black people migrated from Texas to other parts of the country, the Juneteenth tradition spread.

In 1979, Texas became the first state to make Juneteenth an official holiday. Today, all 50 states recognize Juneteenth as a holiday. President Joe Biden signed the legislation in June 2021 that made Juneteenth a Federal observance.



Here's how and where to celebrate Juneteenth in Milwaukee

Juneteenth is an annual national holiday on June 19 celebrating the anniversary of when the last black people enslaved in the United States learned of their emancipation in 1865. Since 1971, Milwaukee has celebrated this holiday with parades, local food and vendors, historical talks, panels and more.

Here's a roundup on how to celebrate Juneteenth in Milwaukee this week.

A Juneteenth celebration will be held at Fondy Farmers Market, 2200 W. Fond du Lac Ave., on June 14, 2023 from 4 p.m. to 6:30 p.m. Food, giveaways, vendors, onsite clinics and more will be present during this free event.








Alzheimer's and Brain Awareness Month: A Salute to a Milwaukee Caregiver, Johnna McGee

During Alzheimer's and Brain Awareness Month, the Alzheimer's Association salutes more than 191,000 caregivers taking care of a loved one with dementia. Johnna McGee of Milwaukee, is a caregiver for two special people on this difficult journey. Her 95-year old mother, Vera Roeana and 40-year old daughter, Rhonda, are living with dementia. "When their lives began to change, my life began to change," Johnna said.

Her daughter, Rhonda, has Down syndrome, but previously was able to live alone and had a job. But when her daughter started hearing voices, she moved back in

with Johnna for support. Individuals affected by Down syndrome have a greatly increased risk of developing a type of dementia and after meeting with a doctor, they believe the voices are an early sign of dementia for Rhonda.

Johnna's mother has lived with her for more than 20 years, but was diagnosed with dementia in recent years. "My mom's mind is sharp, but she forgets we have conversations and to take her medications," Johnna said. "My life is surrounded by them now. I want to make sure they are taken care of, so my time is their time at this point in our lives."

Johnna is still working, but plans to retire early to focus on her family. She is able to work from home three weeks out of the month and her family helps when she works off-site.

Joy of caregiving
"Taking care of them is a joy for me," Johnna said. "It's a journey and every day is different. But I'm lucky to have a 95-year-old mother and a daughter with Down syndrome who will soon be


40. At this point they have more needs than I do and I'm happy to take care of them."

"I would encourage other caregivers to take time for themselves," Johnna said. "It's hard to do, but you shouldn't feel guilty that you aren't doing enough. Have a little confidence in yourself and know that you're doing all you can."

Johnna attended the Alzheimer's Association caregiver event in 2022 that was focused on self-care strategies and available resources for families.

The truth about black fatherhood

Stereotypes about black fathers

The stereotype of black fathers as "absent" and black children as "fatherless"first introduced more than 50 years ago—has, like many racial stereotypes, refused to die.

In 1965, white sociologist and Assistant Secretary of Labor Daniel Patrick Moynihan published a report called The Negro Family: The Case For National Action. This report claimed that increasing rates of "out-of-wedlock" births and single-mother homes among African Americans signaled the coming destruction of black families, and these trends were to blame for many of the issues facing the black community in America. (The report has been roundly criticized by many race scholars.)

Today, around 70 percent of black children are born to parents who aren't married. (Rates of "out-of-wedlock" births have, of course, increased among all races since 1965.) The idea that racial disparities in education, employment, income, incarceration, and more can be blamed, not on structural racism but on this "absence of black fathers" has been parroted by pundits and politicians alike.

Even black public figures have shared these statistics. In 2008, President Barack Obama said during his Father's Day speech that "more than half of all black children live in single-parent households... children who grow up without a father are five times more likely to live in poverty and commit crime; nine times more likely to drop out of schools and 20 times more likely to end up in prison. They are more likely to have behavioral problems, or run away from home or become teenage parents themselves. And the foundations of our community are weaker because of it."

This stereotype ignores clear evidence that black fathers are in fact more involved in their children's care, and their lives, than fathers of other races.

The truth: Black fathers are more involved

We can not equate the number of unmarried dads to the number of "fatherless" children. First of all, marriage rates don't necessarily reflect the number of black fathers living with their children; as writer Josh Levs points out, the majority of black dads (2.5 million of around 4.2 million) do live with their kids, even if they're not married to their partner.

And second of all, according to a 2013 report by the Center for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), black dads—whether they live with their children, or not-are

more actively involved in their children's lives than their counterparts of other

For example, the CDC reports that black fathers who live with their children are more likely than fathers of other races to provide physical care (bathe, diaper, feed) for their young children, read to their children, and help their children with their homework—all on a daily basis-than fathers of other races who also cohabitate with their kids.

The report also reveals that, among dads who don't live with their children, black dads are more likely to be involved in care, including reading to their children, helping them with homework, talking to them about their days, and taking them to activities, than Hispanic or white dads who live apart from their kids. Non-residential black fathers are also the least likely to report that they're not at all involved in the care of their children, including bathing, dressing, changing diapers, and playing with their children.

Mothers' reports echo fathers'

Lest we believe that these statistics are skewed by the fathers' own self-reporting, other studies based on maternal reports echo these findings. In a 2008 survey of low-income mothers, researchers found that "nonresident white fathers were less involved with their children than African American and Latino fathers." In a 2018 study of "nonmarital" births, mothers reported that black fathers "shared responsibilities more frequently and displayed more effective coparenting than Hispanic and white fathers."

And, it seems that the parental relationship, the strong focus of Moynihan's 1965 report, actually has less of an impact on black fathers' involvement with their kids than it does on the involvement of other fathers. In a 2009 paper about the child-rearing roles of unmarried men, authors note "...Father involvement also varies by race and ethnicity, with rates for Africans American being higher than the average American father... Father involvement drops sharply after parents' relationships end, especially when they enter subsequent relationships and have children with new partners. These declines are less dramatic for African American fathers."

As journalist German Lopez writes, when it comes to black fatherhood, "absence is not the norm. Active, involved parenthood is."

Black men's journey to fatherhood

We know that fatherhood



is an important goal for the majority of black men. In a survey of more than 1,300 black men ages 18-29, 83 percent said that having children is somewhat or very important to them.

Black men aren't significantly more or less likely to have children than other races; census reports show that about 75 percent of white men, 80 percent of black men, 81 percent of Asian men, and 83 percent of Hispanic men ages 40-49 have kids. On average, black men have or expect to have 2.4 children; that number is 2.5 for Hispanic men, 2.1 for white men, and 2.0 for Asian men, according to a 2010 report. We can conclude that fatherhood is equally important to black men as to men of other races.

Black men and fertility

But the journey to fatherhood can be bumpier for black men. We know that the infertility rate among African

Americans is higher than that of other ethnicities. Specifically, semen health parameters are poorer among black men. According to research, black men have, on average, significantly lower semen volume, sperm concentration, and total motile sperm counts than white or Hispanic men. For black men partnered with black womenwho are 2-3 more likely to experience uterine fibroids and overall more likely to report infertility—the issue can be compounded.

Why is this? Most likely, it's a complicated combination of socioeconomic, genetic, and biological factors.

Centuries of institutional racism-including lower levels of wealth and income, environmental degradation, provider racism, and other factors—have produced stark health disparities between black people and white people. We know, according to the most recent national healthcare report, that African Americans are more likely to experience heart failure, stroke, diabetes, urinary tract infection, obesity, substance abuse, cancer, and myriad other health issues.

We also know that the factors that contribute to these illnesses—lifestyle, environment, income, nutrition, activity levels, and more-also contribute to issues of fertility, especially male fertility. A man's sperm health is strongly influenced by what he eats, how often he exercises, whether or not he smokes, how much he drinks, and the quality of his sleep, among other factors. Additionally, we know that black men are more likely to be exposed to toxins that impact fertility, such as air pollution and endocrine-disrupting chemicals, in their home and work environments.

But, unfortunately, there's a lot we don't know, as well. As one researcher exploring the black experience of infertility writes, "There is an abundance of research that contributes to the body of knowledge of infertility among white people, but there is very little that examines the experience for African Americans." Even within the field of fertility and environmental toxin exposure, which we know disproportionately affects black Americans, research tends to have "greater than 80 percent white and between 2 percent and 10 percent African American participants," according to researchers.

We know that black men are active, involved fathers, and that having children is important to them—and we also know that their infertility rates are higher. What we need now, and in the future, is more research into fertility for black men and black couples, and to bust the myth of the "absent black father" once and for all.

> **Public Notification of Completion of a** National Out-of-Hospital Cardiac Arrest **Research Study in Milwaukee County**

A research study on the effect of an initial airway management strategy using laryngeal tube insertion (LTI), compared with endotracheal intubation (ETI), on survival among adults with out-of-hospital cardiac arrest (OHCA) has been completed in Milwaukee County.

About the research

This study was performed by the Resuscitation Outcomes Consortium (ROC) - a collaboration of 10 U.S. and Canadian sites that perform emergency research. A total of 3004 patients were enrolled in the study. Milwaukee County was one of the ROC sites where Milwaukee County Emergency Medical Services and the Medical College of Wisconsin performed this research.

Of the 3004 patients enrolled nationwide, 875 patients were enrolled in Milwaukee County between October 2016 and November 2017. 542 patients (61.9%) were male and 333 (38.1%) were female. 452 patients (51.7%) were White, 276 (31.5%) were Black or African American, 11 (1.3%) were Asian, and 136 (15.5%) were other or unreported race. 52 patients (5.9%) were Hispanic.

Study Results

The study found that among patients with OHCA, a strategy of initial LTI was associated with significantly greater 72-hour survival compared with a strategy of initial ETI. These findings suggest that LTI may be considered as an initial airway management strategy in patients with out-of-hospital cardiac arrest, but limitations of the pragmatic design, practice setting, and ETI performance characteristics suggest that further research is warranted.

A research study on the effect of Tranexamic Acid (TXA) versus Placebo on 6-Month Functional Neurologic Outcome in Patients with Moderate or Severe Traumatic Brain Injury (TBI) has been completed in Milwaukee County.

About the research


This study was performed by the Resuscitation Outcomes Consortium (ROC) - a collaboration of 10 U.S. and Canadian sites that perform emergency research. A total of 1063 patients were enrolled in the TBI study. Milwaukee County was one of the ROC sites where Milwaukee County Emergency Medical Services and the Medical College of Wisconsin performed this research.

Of the 1063 patients enrolled nationwide, 105 patients were enrolled in Milwaukee County between September 2015 and February 2017. 79 patients (75.2%) were male and 26 (24.8%) were female. 59 patients (56.2%) were White, 35 (33.3%) were Black or African American, 3 (2.9%) were Asian, and 8 (7.6%) were other or unreported race. 12 patients (11.4%) were Hispanic.

Study Results

The study found that among patients with moderate to severe TBI, out-of-hospital TXA administration within 2 hours of injury compared with placebo did not significantly improve 6-month neurologic outcome as measured by the Glasgow Outcome Scale - Extended (GOS-E).




