Florida approves controversial guidelines for Black History curriculum

On Wednesday, July 19, 2023 Florida's Board of Education approved new guidelines for its Black history curriculum in public schools, earning staunch criticism from activists and teachers in the state.

Corrections made to coursework on Wednesday characterized skills enslaved people learned as potentially beneficial, and added specific descriptions of the massacres of black Americans.

"The Florida State Board of Education today adopted new African American history standards. In doing so, they confirmed many of the worst fears educators had when the Stop Woke Act was signed into law last year," the Florida Education Association (FEA), a statewide teachers union, said in the July 19, 2023 press release. "These new standards are a disservice to Florida's students and are a big step backward for a state that has required teaching African American history since 1994."

The newest changes are the latest since the Stop Woke Act was enacted in July 2022. That law says discussions about race must be taught in an "objective manner" and should not be "used to indoctrinate or persuade students to a particular point of view." It also states that students should not feel guilty for actions taken in the past by people of their same race



or origin.

The Sunshine State has taken broad measures to adjust its education standards to better match Gov. Ron DeSantis's vision of a state "where woke goes to die," which has led to changes in the way public school teachers can discuss race, gender and sexuality.

Gov. DeSantis signed legislation in May, 2023 barring public colleges from using state or federal funds for diversity efforts. DeSantis also spoke out against the College Board's Advanced Placement African American Studies pilot class in January, to which he earned support from the state's education department. They said the course lacked "educational value" and refused to approve the pilot course unless changes—including the removal of topics surrounding reparations and Black Lives Matter—were

made.

The Board also approved rules that double down on existing laws regarding bathroom and pronoun use for nonbinary or transgender students and staff, among other changes.

"How can our students ever be equipped for the future if they don't have a full, honest picture of where we've come from?" said FEA president Andrew Spar. "Florida's students deserve a world-class education that equips them to be successful adults who can help heal our nation's divisions rather than deepen them."

Here's what to know about the new guidelines.

What are the Florida Board of Education's new guidelines?

As part of the new guidelines, the Board of Education is requiring middle school students to be instructed on

how "slaves developed skills which, in some instances, could be applied for their personal benefit."

For high school students, the Board of Education will now require certain events, like the 1920 Ocoee Massacre, to be depicted in a specific way, in this case as an "act of violence perpetrated against and by African Americans." The Orange County Regional History Center in Florida calls the massacre "the largest incident of voting-day violence in United States history," after dozens of black people were killed. The guidelines also have similar stipulations for lessons on the Tulsa Race Massacre and Rosewood Race Massacre.

The FEA added further criticism by saying that the new standards teach elementary school students how to identify famous African American figures, but do not push their knowledge beyond that surface-level history.

While the new regulations still permit teachers to provide instruction about Black History in schools, though the Board opted to do so in a way that the NAACP says "convey a sanitized and dishonest telling of the history of slavery in America."

"Today's actions by the Florida state government are an attempt to bring our country back to a 19th cen-

tury America where Black life was not valued, nor our rights protected. It is imperative that we understand that the horrors of slavery and Jim Crow were a violation of human rights and represent the darkest period in American history," said NAACP President & CEO Derrick Johnson. "Our children deserve nothing less than truth, justice, and the equity our ancestors shed blood, sweat, and tears for."

Earlier this year, the state's Education Department rejected social studies textbooks that encouraged parents to discuss "taking a knee to protest police brutality and racism" with their children when learning about the Pledge of Allegiance, or mentioning the use of mobile devices in capturing the death of George Floyd.

That, among other measures, prompted the NAACP Board of Directors to issue a travel advisory for the state of Florida in May.

"Florida is openly hostile toward African Americans, people of color and LGBTQ+ individuals," the notice said. "Before traveling to Florida, please understand that the state of Florida devalues and marginalizes the contributions of, and the challenges faced by African Americans and other communities of color."

Dwyane Wade, Travis Diener literacy efforts give back to Milwaukee

Twenty years after leading the Marquette men's basketball team to the Final Four, two former Golden Eagles are giving back to the community.

Dwyane Wade and Travis Diener are making efforts to boost literacy in Milwaukee.

"It's important for us to interject ourselves with the kids. They're the future, obviously. That's what we love to do," Wade said.

Slam dunks filled The Facility sports complex in Mequon as Wade and Diener hosted a young women's basketball camp.

The camp is part of a new three-day event, called 'Wade vs. Diener,' where the two compete against each other to see who will raise the most funds for youth literacy programs in Milwaukee.

"Try to catch kids at a very young age. If they're not at a certain reading level by third grade – especially in the inner city, in the cities of minority communities – going to the next grade, you get left behind," Wade said. "We want to make sure that they get the opportunity to succeed and get sped up if they're behind."



Named after his sister, Wade currently funds The Tragil Wade-Johnson Summer Reading Program through Marquette University. Proceeds from the entire Wade vs. Diener weekend will help fund literacy programs like it.

"Just trying to pay it back, pay it forward," said Diener.

"We just want to bring more awareness to the community of Milwaukee what we're doing, and it's all about the kids," said Wade.

The two former Marquette teammates showcased their bond – competing together

to show the young ladies the ropes.

"The goals of these camps is just to have a lot of fun, so you can help them navigate that passion in a positive way," Diener said.

"I remember all the camps I went to as a kid," said Wade.

Biden signs proclamation creating Emmett Till national monuments

President Joe Biden on Tuesday, July 18, 2023 established a national monument to commemorate the legacy of Emmett Till, whose murder helped ignite the civil rights movement, and his mother, Mamie Till-Mobley.

Biden signed the proclamation to create the new Emmett Till and Mamie Till-Mobley National Monument on the 82nd anniversary of the black Chicago teenager's birth.

"At a time when there are those who seek to ban books, bury history, we're making it clear — crystal, crystal clear: While dark-

ness and denialism can hide much, they erase nothing," the president said at the White House signing ceremony, appearing to reference Gov. Ron DeSantis of Florida with his remarks. "Only with truth comes healing, justice, repair and another step forward toward forming a more perfect union. We've got a hell of a long way to go."

The signing comes amid escalating tensions in the U.S. over racial issues, like the inclusion of teachings about slavery and Black History in public schools. On Friday, July 21, DeSan-

dis dismissed Vice President Kamala Harris' criticism of the Black History standards recently adopted by

the Florida Board of Education. Harris, appearing at Delta Sigma Theta Sorority Inc.'s national convention in Indianapolis on Thursday, July 20, had taken aim at the standards, which include instruction on how slaves developed skills that "could be applied for their personal benefit."

"Just yesterday in the state of Florida, they decided middle school students will be taught that enslaved people benefited from slavery," she said in her keynote address.

American soldier detained in North Korea formally lived in Racine

Pvt. Travis King bolted into North Korea while on a tour of the Demilitarized Zone on July 18, a day after he was supposed to travel to a base in the U.S.

TMJ4 News has learned that Pvt. Travis King, the American soldier who sprinted across North Korea's heavily fortified border, used to live in Racine, WI, and his family still lives there, according to a man identifying as King's brother.

A man who identifies himself as King's brother told TMJ4 News that on the condition of anonymity. The brother said King's family lives in Racine and that he used to live in Racine. The Racine Unified Chief of Schools, Jodi Bloyer, confirmed King graduated from Washington Park High School in 2020.

The brother told TMJ4 News, "We understand the gravity of the situation, it's all very unfortunate...my mom's already lost a child before, a son before. This is weighing very heavily on her."

The brother continued, "All the other stuff, just defer to the military because they have all that information in regards to that...We're not the negotiator."

"In terms of speaking on Travis' character, and all that stuff, there's nothing that I'm going to say that's going to change people's opinions on it right now. So I'm not going to comment on any of that," the brother said.

As *The Associated Press* reports, North Korea stayed silent Wednesday about the detention of an American soldier who sprinted across the Korea's heavily fortified border as members of his tour group looked on in shock. Some observers said heightened tensions between the two countries made it unlikely that he would be sent back any time soon.

Pvt. Travis King bolted into North Korea while on a tour of the Demilitarized Zone (DMZ) on July 18, a day after he was supposed to travel to a base in the U.S. He was released from a

South Korean prison July 10 after serving two months for assault and was scheduled to return to Fort Bliss, TX, where he could have faced additional military discipline and discharge.

King is the first known American held in North Korea in nearly five years. Each detention has set off complicated diplomatic wrangling, and this one comes at a time of elevated animosity. On July 19, North Korea test-fired two ballistic missiles into the sea in an apparent protest of the deployment of a U.S. nuclear-armed submarine in South Korea for the first time in decades.

"It's likely that North Korea will use the soldier for propaganda purposes in the short term and then as a bargaining chip," said Yang Moo-jin, president of the University of North Korean Studies in South Korea.

King, a 23-year-old cavalry scout with the 1st Armored Division, was supposed to leave Monday for Texas. He was escorted as far as customs but left the airport before boarding his plane.

It wasn't clear how he spent the hours until joining the tour in the border village of Panmunjom and running across the border Tuesday afternoon. The Army released his name and limited information after King's family was notified. A number of U.S. officials provided additional details on condition of anonymity because of the sensitivity of the matter.

One woman who was on the tour with King said she initially thought his dash was some kind of stunt — and that she and others in the group couldn't believe what happened.

King's stint in prison was not the first time he faced legal trouble in South Korea.

In February, a court fined him 5 million won (\$3,950) after he was convicted of assaulting an unidenti-



fied person and damaging a police vehicle in Seoul last October, according to a transcript of the verdict obtained by *The Associated Press*.

The ruling said King had also been accused of punching a 23-year-old man at a Seoul nightclub, though the court dismissed that charge because the victim didn't want King to be punished.

King's maternal grandfather, Carl Gates, said his grandson joined the Army roughly three years ago because he "wanted to do better for himself." He was drawn to service because he has a brother who is a police officer and a cousin in the Navy, Gates said.

Gates said he hoped his grandson could be brought home to get help.

"I think right now he might have a problem or something. I can't see him doing that intentionally if he was in his right mind," Gates said.

White House press secretary Karine Jean-Pierre said the U.S. government was working with its North Korean counterparts to "resolve this incident."

The American-led U.N. Command said Tuesday that the U.S. soldier was believed to be in North Korean custody.

U.S. Defense Secretary Lloyd Austin told a Pentagon news conference that the military was "closely monitoring and investigat-

ing the situation."

It wasn't known whether or how the U.S. and North Korea would communicate. The two countries have no diplomatic relations and are still officially at war because the Korean War ended with an armistice, not a peace treaty.

In the past, Sweden, which has an embassy in Pyongyang, provided consular services for other Americans detained in North Korea. But Swedish diplomatic staff reportedly haven't returned to North Korea since the country imposed a COVID-19 lockdown in early 2020 and ordered all foreigners to leave.

Some observers said North Korea and the U.S. could still talk via Panmunjom or the North Korean mission at the United Nations (U.N.) in New York.

It's rare for Americans or South Koreans to defect to North Korea, but more than 30,000 North Koreans have fled to South Korea to escape political oppression and economic difficulties since the end of the 1950-53 Korean War.

Tae Yongho, a former minister at the North Korean Embassy in London, said North Korea is likely pleased to have "an opportunity to get the U.S. to lose its face" because King's crossing happened on the same day a U.S. submarine arrived in South Korea.

Tae, now a South Korean lawmaker, said North Korea was unlikely to return King easily because he is a soldier from a nation technically at war with North Korea, and he voluntarily went to the North.

The U.S. still stations about 28,000 troops in South Korea, and tensions on the Korean Peninsula run high, with North Korea carrying out missile tests and the U.S. holding military drills with South Korea.

Panmunjom, located inside the 248-kilometer-long

(154-mile-long) Demilitarized Zone, has been jointly overseen by the U.N. Command and North Korea since the close of the Korean War.

Bloodshed has occasionally occurred there, but it has also been a venue for diplomacy and tourism, drawing visitors who want to see the Cold War's last frontier. No civilians live there, but North and South Korean soldiers face off while tourists on both sides snap photographs.

A small number of U.S. soldiers went to North Korea during the Cold War, including Charles Jenkins, who deserted his army post in South Korea in 1965 and fled across the DMZ. He appeared in North Korean propaganda films and married a Japanese nursing student who was abducted from Japan by North Korean agents. Jenkins died in Japan in 2017.

In recent years, some American civilians have been arrested in North Korea on allegations of espionage, subversion and other anti-state acts, but were released after the U.S. sent high-profile missions to secure their freedom.

In May 2018, North Korea released three American detainees who returned to the United States on a plane with then-Secretary of State Mike Pompeo during a short period of warm relations. Later in 2018, North Korea said it expelled American Bruce Byron Lowrance. Since his deportation, there have been no reports of other Americans detained in North Korea before Tuesday.

Those releases stood in striking contrast to the fate of Otto Warmbier, an American university student who died in 2017, days after he was released by North Korea in a coma following 17 months in captivity.

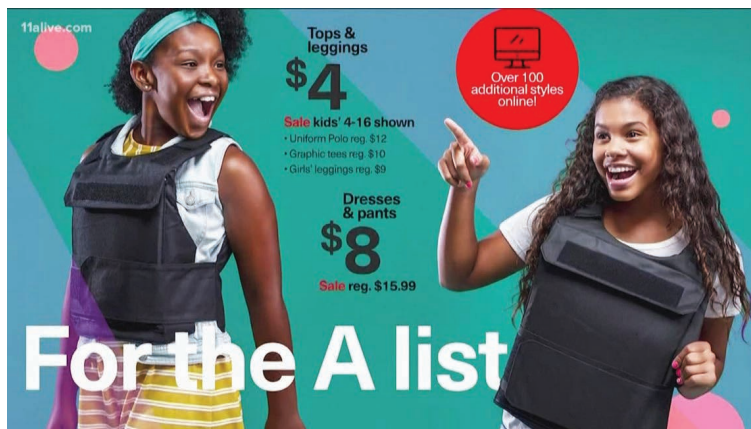

Youth aren't bulletproof

"Dear Lawmaker,

My name is Ana Rodriguez. I lost my daughter, Maite Rodriguez on May 24, 2022 in a mass shooting at her school, Robb Elementary, in Uvalde, TX . . . It was the last week of school and she was excited about watching movies with her friends and attending the honor roll ceremony. Don't imagine. Put yourself in my daughter's shoes that day: Her name is called out to receive her honor roll certificate and she walks over, wearing her green Converse with a heart on the right toe. She must feel so happy and proud of herself. After the ceremony, her class gets up and starts heading back to Room 112. I'm sure she and her friends are talking and showing each other their achievement certificates, not knowing the fear, pain and horror that awaits . . . All I have left of my daughter Maite are memories. Memories and the last pair of shoes I purchased for her, the ones she wore on that awful day—her green



converse with a heart drawn on the right toe . . ."

When 10-year-old Maite Rodriguez was murdered by an assault rifle in her fourth-grade classroom alongside two teachers and 18 classmates, her parents had to identify her body by those favorite sneakers. Maite's shoes became a symbol of the devastation of that day. On July 18, supporters of the Uvalde families brought copies of this letter from Maite's mother and lapel pins featuring Maite's green sneakers to Washington, DC, to distribute in the halls of Congress. At a moment when some

Republican lawmakers have been proudly wearing AR-15 lapel pins to work, they hoped these pins could send a different message: as the artist who created the pins said, "Maite's shoes are a symbol of her beauty and strength, and a reminder that real people are dying every day from gun violence, including small, innocent children. Instead of celebrating AR-15s, let's remember all that they have the power to destroy." Rep. Lauren Boebert (R-CO) was filmed being handed this letter and pin and immediately throwing both into a trash can.

These are the forces our children are up against from some of the adults who should be entrusted to help protect them. But our children already know they deserve better. Every year students in grades K-12 enrolled in Children's Defense Fund Freedom Schools® summer enrichment programs take part in a National Day of Social Action highlighting a critical issue affecting children's lives. This year, on July 19 thousands of scholars at CDF Freedom Schools sites across the country made signs and posters, attended marches and rallies, wrote letters, and met with elected officials to share their own direct and indirect experiences with gun violence, remind adults that #YouthArentBulletproof, and ask adults to protect children, not guns. As one child's sign read: "Protect us not guns!!! Please."

Gun violence is the leading cause of death for children in the United States, killing students like Maite in their classrooms and killing and injuring babies, preschoolers, children, and teenagers in their neighborhoods, at parks, playgrounds, and shopping malls, as they ride in their cars and play in their yards, and inside their own homes. Thousands of other children and teenagers are affected because someone they love has been killed or injured

by a gun. One young CDF Freedom Schools scholar, Andrew, read aloud this message to his city councilmembers: "I do not approve of gun violence because it puts a direct impact on kids and it makes them motherless and fatherless. It scares a lot of kids. It hurts to experience this type of violence. Please help us stop all this violence." Another scholar wrote, "I have a vision for a safe community. I care about gun violence because people's lives shouldn't be cut short because others made bad decisions."

Even while some lawmakers are ignoring pleas to protect child victims of gun violence and treating them as trash, these children are standing up for their own lives and asking adults to stand with them. The CDF Freedom Schools scholars were grateful for the lawmakers who met with them and encouraged them as they demanded change. Which side are you on?

Emmit Till monuments

“They insult us in an attempt to gaslight us, and we will not stand for it.”

The vice president rehashed those comments at the proclamation signing ceremony Tuesday.

“Today, there are those in our nation who would prefer to erase or even rewrite the ugly parts of our past, those who attempt to teach that enslaved people benefited from slavery,” she said. “Let us not be seduced into believing that somehow we will be better if we forget.”

White House press secretary Karine Jean-Pierre called the Florida governor’s remarks “inaccurate” and “insulting” during her July 24, 2023 briefing, saying they obstruct an honest portrayal of the nation’s history. She further highlighted the new monument as an “important moment” and part of depicting “the broader story of American Black oppression, their survival.”

The Till monument, the fourth national monument designated by the Biden administration, will span three sites in Illinois and Mississippi that hold historical importance to the story of Emmett Till’s life and the events surrounding his racially motivated murder in 1955.

Till was just 14 when a white female grocery clerk accused him of whistling at her and making inappropriate advances during a visit to family in the Mississippi Delta. He was then



abducted and tortured, and his body was dumped in the Tallahatchie River. Roy Bryant and his half-brother J.W. Milam, both white men, were tried on murder charges but acquitted by an all-white jury after an hour of deliberations. Months later, the men confessed to the crime in a paid interview with *Look* magazine.

Till’s death became a pivotal event in the civil rights movement, with Rosa Parks

saying his memory inspired her refusal to give up her bus seat to a white passenger in a historic act of defiance of racial segregation laws. The activism of Mamie Till-Mobley, who insisted on an open-casket funeral to show the world the brutality her son endured, helped galvanize public outrage and highlight the deep-seated inequalities of the Jim Crow South.

“It’s just barbaric what happened,” Biden said of Till-Mobley’s choice Tuesday. “All you moms out there — imagine the courage it took to say, ‘Let them see.’ The courage.”

The National Parks Conservation Association, a nonprofit that attended the ceremony and worked with Till family members for years to advocate for the national park site, celebrated its realization.

“We still see echoes of Emmett’s story and blatant racial injustice in our society today,” Theresa Pierno, the association’s president and CEO, said in a statement on Tuesday. “With this new national park site, our leaders are bringing this story back into the light so that we may all continue to learn and grow from it, just as we have at Birmingham, Stonewall, and other national monuments.”

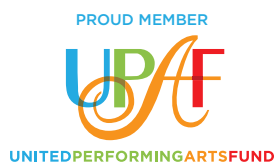
The monument’s sites encompass the Roberts Temple Church of God in Christ in Bronzeville, a historically Black neighborhood in Chicago where Till’s funeral service took place. They also include the Graball Landing site, where his body was believed to be discovered, and the courthouse in Tallahatchie, MS, where his killers were acquitted.

In March 2022, Biden signed the Emmett Till Antilynching Act, recognizing lynching as a federal hate crime.

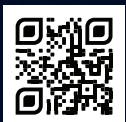
