# Milwaukee Common Council orders DPW to pick up Christmas trees, reversing controversial change

Public Works Committee called for a special meeting on Dec. 11 after the announcement by the Department of Public Works last week

Common Milwaukee Council's Public Works Committee ordered the city's Department of Public Works (DPW) to pick up Christmas trees left on the curb after the holiday, reversing a controversial change announced December 5, 2023.

The DPW announced it would no longer be able to pick up cut Christmas trees, after the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources (DNR) recently clarified a rule classifying trees as yard waste, not holiday decorations. Yard waste is subject to a statewide landfill ban.

The DNR pushed back on that, telling WISN12 News the rule is decades old, and they have always considered cut Christmas trees to be yard waste.

At a special meeting on December 11, Common Council members grilled Rick Meyers, the DPW's sanitation services manager, over the change.

"This a basic function of city government, it's not splitting the atom," said Al-derman Mark Borkowski of Milwaukee's 11th District. "I'm embarrassed and I'm discouraged."

"I've received a ton of calls, a ton of emails," said Alder-man Lamont Westmoreland of Milwaukee's 5th District. "People are pissed off. I'm pissed off about it.'

DPW said the DNR clarified to them trees would not be allowed to go into landfills last January. They held off on telling the public, saying they were waiting for more guidance from the DNR, and also didn't want to send the message so early that people would forget about it.

"What we were looking for was some space, some public messaging from the DNR that either confirmed this for all communities, businesses, everyone in the state, or something else," Meyers said. "As far as, you know, informing others, we thought that was their obligation. It is not



our obligation to inform other communities in the state and business owners of the state changing a clarification. Again, I absolutely agree, and that's on me that we did not bring this earlier."

Waiting to announce the change did not sit with the council. Now they're stepping in, demanding trees be picked up.


"The bottom line is, we are going to do a resolution at the council meeting. By immediate adoption, we're going to direct the Department of Public Works to pick up the Christmas trees like they


have in the past," said Alderman Bob Bauman of Milwaukee's 4th District. "How they pay for it, they'll have to figure out because there will be an additional cost. Maybe they have to cut back on something else in their budget to make this happen. But to allow these trees to just sit on the curb for months, is just not acceptable."


As for accountability, WISN 12 News asked Bauman if anyone would be held responsible for the confusion and frustration caused by this change.

"We'll leave the mayor to worry about that," Bauman said. "I mean, technically, all these people report to him. They're his employees. I mean, he appoints the commissioner who was absent today, the department head who's a member of the mayor's cabinet. We don't know what the mayor knew and when he knew it. That didn't come up. And that's fine. We're trying to fix the problem as opposed to trying to point fingers and serve up heads on platters. We're trying to fix the problem, and hopefully, the department and all the partners will get the message that the council should be viewed as partners, not adversaries and that we need to be in on these issues when they arise sooner rather than later."

For now, trees will be picked up on the curb by DPW. Drop-off sites to have your tree mulched will also still be open. For more information on drop-off sites, visit https://city.milwaukee. gov/holiday-trees.

# Rosalynn Carter: Honoring a legacy

Thursday, December 14, 2023

On November 28, 2023, the family of former First Lady Rosalynn Carter held a beautiful memorial service for her at the Glenn Memorial Church at Emory University. Guests included President Joe Biden and Dr. Jill Biden, Vice President Kamala Harris and Second Gentleman Doug Emhoff, former President Bill Clinton and Secretary Hillary Clinton, former First Ladies Melania Trump, Michelle Obama, and Laura Bush, and Mrs. Carter's devoted husband and partner of 77 years, former President Jimmy Carter. Several speakers paid tribute to the Carters' long love story, including their daughter Amy, who read a letter President Carter had written to Mrs. Carter 75 years ago while he was in the Navy. Mrs. Carter's friends, family, and pastor also all emphasized her lifetime of service to others, including her longtime leadership as a mental health advocate.

Mrs. Carter often spoke about one encounter that helped spark that service. During her husband's first



gubernatorial campaign in Georgia, she visited a cotton mill at 4:30 a.m. to meet with workers just finishing their overnight shifts and seek their support. When Mrs. Carter told one woman who looked especially tired that she hoped she was about to go home and get some rest, the exhausted woman explained that she and her husband had a child with mental health care needs and took turns with their shifts so while one was at work the other cared for her. Mrs. Carter later wrote that the image of that mother haunt-

ed her all day. That evening she surprised her husband by joining other voters in a receiving line at a campaign event, and when Mrs. Carter got to the front of the line to shake his hand, she asked how he planned to serve families with mental health care needs. He answered that they were going to have the best program in the country, and she was going to be put in charge of it. Rosalynn Carter followed up with decades of research, advocacy, and leadership.

In 2008, I was honored to serve as a keynote speaker for the 24th annual Rosalynn Carter Symposium on Mental Health Policy at the Carter Center in Atlanta: "Unclaimed Children Revisited: Fostering a Climate to Improve Children's Mental Health." That symposium presented new research from Dr. Jane Knitzer and her colleagues at the National Center for Children in Poverty on the status of children and youths' mental health care policy in the United States, and it built on a framework Dr. Knitzer had developed more than 25 years earlier in the Children's Defense Fund report "Unclaimed Children: The Failure of Public Respon-sibility to Children and Adolescents in Need of Mental Health Services." Dr. Knitzer had been outraged by CDF lawsuits on behalf of children and teenagers who had been sent far from home for residential treatment, and the report covered the deep need for accessible, age-appropriate mental health care and support. At the Carter Center symposium, Dr. Knitzer remembered that when the original report was published, she had said to me and our colleague MaryLee Allen that there were probably about five people in the country who would read it.



In fact, "Unclaimed Children" brought focused attention to public policy needs surrounding children's mental health care, and its impact was amplified again years later by one very influential person: Mrs. Carter and her dedicated, long-haul advoca-

In the keynote at that Rosalynn Carter Symposium, I said something Mrs. Carter also believed: if we can change things for children, we will end up changing things for everybody. Rosalynn Carter was a change agent for countless people throughout her long life of service. She shared a very simple philosophy: "I believe that one of the most important things to learn in life is that you can make a difference in your community no matter who you are or where you live." This lesson is a fitting legacy.

and Middleton joined in.



# Paying it forward: Outstanding technical diploma student ready to help others

Chardaye Hartz never got to celebrate Thanksgiving in 2021.

Instead of devouring turkey, savoring pie and enjoying her time with relatives, she was fighting for her life.

As the 20-year-old slept in the early morning hours of November 25, 2021, she suffered a series of seizures after blood clotted in her brain and triggered a stroke. Hartz plunged into a coma and awoke a week later. She had two surgeries and her brain was exposed for four months. She couldn't walk or talk as a result of the stroke. She spent the next two months in the hospital.

During her recovery, as she worked to regain her lost cognitive and mobility skills, she became acutely aware of the dedicated medical professionals caring for her almost every minute of every day.

"I watched nurses and pharmacy technicians in real-life time," Hartz recalled. "These people were making a difference for me. That's when I decided I wanted to make a difference as well."

Hartz's empathy turned into an enthusiasm and earnestness to work in healthcare. In March 2022, she had a third surgery that replaced her skull and began to think about going to school. That fall, she enrolled in the Pharmacy Technician program at Milwaukee Area Technical College (MATC).

A year later, thanks to a full-ride scholarship from the Ellen & Joe Checota MATC Scholarship Program, Hartz has completed her courses with honors and will earn her technical diploma this month. For her academic achievements, college involvement and inspiring story, Hartz also was chosen as the college's Outstanding Graduate – Technical Diploma for Fall 2023.

"She had doubts about school; she didn't think that she could make it," said Eva Martinez-Powless, Ph.D., MATC's vice president for enrollment and retention. "But her passion kept pushing her forward."

Hartz grew up in Milwaukee. As a youth, she was very involved with PEARLS for Teen Girls, a group that

helps middle school girls develop social, emotional and practical skills to be empathetic, self-sufficient leaders. She also was a top-notch majorette and coached several dance teams.

She started high school at Milwaukee Academy of Science, a charter school, and then transferred to Milwaukee Public Schools' Transition High School, where she graduated in 2019.

Unsure of her future, she worked as a cashier and a concession supervisor at Fiserv Forum. "I really didn't know what I wanted to do," Hartz said. "I really didn't feel I had a passion for anything."

Then came that fateful Thanksgiving, and she found her passion in the hospital while undergoing physical, occupational and speech therapy.

Hartz's mother told her about MATC. After some initial hesitation, Hartz started classes. "I didn't know after all I went through if I would be smart enough for college," she admitted. "At first, I felt a little overwhelmed. I struggled with essays. I had to work to get my writing skills

By spring 2023, she was excelling in the classroom thanks to her instructors, Nhat Nguyen and Jennifer

"Chardaye is a responsible, reliable, independent and respectful student and continues to set a wonderful example for her classmates," Nguyen said. "She continues to have a growth mindset

portant skill to have as a healthcare provider, and it is a hard one for many healthcare providers to incorporate in their practice," Nguyen said. "Chardaye puts her patients first and continues to think of how she would feel if she were in the patients' shoes.

"Empathy is such an im-

"She understands that some of these patients may not be at their best when they are coming into the pharmacy," Nguyen added. "Knowing that they have an empathetic healthcare provider to help the patient while they are sick provides a sense of trust and comfort for them."

"My instructors, especially Jennifer Lucas, were really in my corner," said Hartz, who went on to serve one of her clinical assignments at Froedtert Hospital. "I could not have gotten through this without their amazing help."

In the fall, she got some financial help by getting a Checota Scholarship, which paid for her tuition, books, supplies, meals and parking for the semester. The Checota MATC Scholarship Program is designed to help students earn a diploma or certificate and quickly enter the workforce.

"The Checota Scholarship was a great help," Hartz said. "I had a lot of expenses and a lot of bills. This was my most expensive semester yet, but the Checota was amazing."

After entering the workforce, Hartz plans to become a Level IV Pharmacy Technician and then return to MATC to study nursing.

"Everything worked out very, very well for me at MATC. It helped me create goals for myself. The college had teachers I loved. It was a truly peaceful experience. I never liked missing a class."



# Siebert Lutheran Foundation implements new approach to philanthropy in Wisconsin

# Three proven strategies to prevent holiday weight gain

For many, the holiday season is synonymous with weight gain. There are so many more opportunities for overindulgence in food and alcohol while enjoying the company of family and friends. Even the most experienced weight controller can be derailed during the holidays and end up with a few extra pounds. On Christmas day alone, an individual might eat as much as 6000 calories! That's three times the recommended daily allowance. However, by following a few simple tips, you can curb your overindulgence and stop the pounds from piling on at Christmas.

A new study published in the *British Medical Journal* shows that when people weigh themselves daily, monitor food intake and track how much physical activity is needed to burn off extra calories from their favorite holiday foods they are able to get through the holiday season without gaining weight.

The study was carried out in 2016 and 2017, with participants weighed and measured in November and December each year and then follow-up measurements were taken in January and February 2017 and 2018. There were 272 participants in the study.



Half received only general information about leading a healthy lifestyle. This group was called the comparison group.

The intervention group the other half, was asked to weigh themselves at least twice per week, but ideally every day, and record their weight.

To encourage mindful eating, they were asked to maintain a food and beverage diary.

They were also given 10 top tips for weight management and a list of how much physical activity would be needed to burn off calories found in favorite foods and drinks eaten at Christmas.

For example, it takes 60 minutes of gardening to burn the 330 calories in a slice of

sweet potato pie, 30 minutes of swimming laps to burn the 260 calories in 1 cup of stuffing and 30 minutes of golf to burn ½ cup of eggnog.

The results showed that on average, participants in the comparison group gained almost a pound over Christmas, but participants in the intervention group did not. In fact, those in the intervention group actually lost about one-third of a pound.

"On overage people gain a small amount of weight of up to 1kg [about 2 pounds] each year and holidays such as Christmas are responsible for most of the annual weight gain," Professor Amanda Daley with the School of Sport, Exercise and Health Sciences at Loughborough University, said in a press release.

"Weight gained during holiday periods often is not subsequently lost and, although these gains are small, over 10 years, they would lead to a significant increase in body weight."

# The 10 tips for weight management are tips you can benefit from all year long.

They include:

- Eating roughly the same time each day
- Choosing reduced-fat foods
- Walking 10,000 steps each day
- Choosing healthy snacks
- Reading food labels
- Controlling portions
  Standing up for 10 min-
- utes out of every hour
- Choosing water or sugar-free beverages

- Slowing down and practicing mindful eating
- Eating at least five servings of fruit and vegetables every day

Remember, the following strategies are proven to curb overindulgence during the holidays and prevent weight gain.

- (1) Weigh yourself at least twice per week—ideally every day, and record it.
- (2) Monitor food and drink intake by keeping a daily food diary.
- (3) Keep track of how much physical activity is needed to burn off calories in food and drinks consumed.
