On Saturday, March 2, 2024, at the historic Hilton Milwaukee City Center, United Negro College Fund (UNCF) celebrated 80 years of empowering students and transforming the future during the 9th annual Milwaukee Mayor's Masked Ball. This year's event was Mayor Cavalier Johnson's third year of serving as the ambassador for more than 400 guests. As part of the the ball UNCF honored Dr. Joan M. Prince, Vice President Emerita, University of Wisconsin - Milwaukee, with the MASKED Award for being an advocated for minorities and women and is a proud UNCF alumina. The Corporate Honoree this year was We Energies Foundation, which supports community and neighborhood development initiatives, health and human services, education, and the environment. Former UNCF Milwaukee Area Development Director Gloria J. Ricks, was recognized as the Legacy Honoree. Ricks catalyzed UNCF in Wisconsin

and helped open UNCF's first Milwaukee office in 1978. She retired after 33 years with UNCF. Her son and a longtime UNCF volunteer, Ruby Jackson, accepted the award on Gloria's behalf.

Alzheimer's Association Wisconsin Advocacy Day at the Wisconsin State Capitol



On Tuesday, February 20, 2024, more than 150 advocates from across Wisconsin met in Madison for the Alzheimer's Association's 2024 Wisconsin Advocacy Day. These advocates met with legislators at the State Capitol to ask that Alzheimer's disease and dementia remain legislative priorities in the coming year in support of the more than 120,000 Wisconsinites and their families living with the disease. There was a strong Milwaukee contingency, including many advocates who met at St. Mark AME Church and bussed over to Madison together.

The all-day event kicked off at the Best Western Premier Park Hotel, when Governor Tony Evers and First Lady Kathy Evers greeted and encouraged attendees. A legislative panel discussion and other guest speakers illuminated best practices for sharing personal stories with lawmakers and how to ask for support for the following: funding the Wisconsin Dementia Crisis Innovation Grant program; ensuring high-quality care in assisted living facilities; and implementing the recommendations in the Wisconsin State Dementia Plan.

Mayor Johnson prioritizes public safety in Milwaukee's State of the City address

The mayor drew particular attention to the decline in violent crimes.

far northwest side, Mayor Cavalier Johnson took the podium on Monday, March 4, 2024, to deliver the State of the City address, emphasizing public safety.

"I have no higher priority than making sure Milwaukee is as safe as possible," said Johnson. This commitment comes in the wake of crime statistics released regularly by the Milwaukee Police Department indicating a nine percent decrease in violent crime, including robbery,

In a warehouse on the city's rape, and assaults, from 2022 to 2023.

> Statistics show a notable shift in the number of homicides from a record-breaking 215 cases in 2022 to 171 in

> This year's figures point to a slight decrease, with 20 homicides so far, compared to 21 at the same time last year.

> Johnson said the city has introduced additional police officers and strengthened collaboration with prosecutors and courts to ensure accountability.

"We must make sure people who commit crimes are identified and brought to justice," Johnson said. "The consequences should be appropriate and timely."

In addition to addressing crime, Johnson highlighted ongoing infrastructure efforts to combat reckless driving.

The mayor said the city is implementing 45 traffic-calming projects this year, reinforcing his commitment to Milwaukee as a "Vision Zero" city, striving for zero traffic deaths by the year



Gov. Evers signs bill reducing annual child care costs for Wisconsin families

Evers' office says Wisconsin parents and guardians paying for care will see an average benefit of \$656 per filer.

Starting 2025, Wisconsin parents will see more money in their pocket for childcare. On Monday, March 4, 2024, Gov. Tony Evers signed legislation significantly increasing the current childcare tax credit for families.

"I'm signing Senate Bill 1023 to expand our state's child and dependent care tax credit and reduce the burden on families struggling with the high cost of child care," said Evers in a press conference at La Casa de Esperanza in Waukesha.

One of the biggest reasons why the governor and his administration say they support child tax credits, it's now more expensive to send your kid to daycare than it is to college through the Uni-



versity of Wisconsin system.

"The cost of daycare in 2021, on average, was \$13,572," said Peter Barca, Secretary of the Department of Revenue. "The cost for

undergraduate tuition at UW Madison, which is more expensive than the others, is \$10,766."

The new law means the average benefit with go up significantly.

For example, a single parent an income of \$75,000 dollars a year and

\$5,000 in child care expenses would see their credit go from \$300 a year to \$1,000. A couple making \$150,000 a year, spending \$15,000 in child care for two kids, their credit could increase by 5, going from \$600 credit now to about \$3,000 per year.

The governor's office said this chance will provide tax relief to over 110,000 Wisconsin taxpayers at an average benefit of more than \$656 per filer.



Black history, women's history: Septima Clark

As Black History Month ends and Women's History Month begins, it's always a special privilege to hon-or leaders who overlap in both—black women who did their part to change American history. As we approach the 60th anniversary of the Civil Rights Movement's Freedom Summer, one of these leaders to know and honor is Septima Clark, the woman Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., called the "Mother of the Move-ment." Throughout her long life, Clark pioneered literacy and citizenship education for black Americans, including the Citizenship Schools that helped inspire the 1964 Freedom Schools.

Readers familiar with Brian Lanker's marvelous photography collection I Dream a World: Portraits of Black Women Who Changed America may remember Clark as the proud, strong, and beautiful woman with silver braids whose portrait graced the front cover of the original book and captured her indomitable spirit. Clark was born in Charleston, SC in 1898, the second of eight children and the daughter of a formerly enslaved father. She

graduated from Avery Normal Institute in 1916 with a teaching certificate, but because the city of Charleston would not hire black teachers, she found a job in a rural community on Johns Island, SC teacher in that community had only three students but was paid \$85 a month, while the black school had two teachers for 132 children, and its two black teachers were paid a combined salary of \$60. This was the first of many injustices she encountered throughout her long career, and as time went on, she just started speaking out even when others around her would not. As she put it simply years later: "They were afraid, but I wasn't."

In 1919 Clark returned to Charleston, where she volunteered for a NAACP petition effort that ultimately changed the local law prohibiting black teachers. For the next several decades she taught primarily in Charleston and Columbia while continuing her own education in the summers—at Columbia University in New York; at Atlanta University, where W.E.B. DuBois was one of her professors; at Benedict College, where she finally



received a bachelor's degree; and at Hampton Institute, where she earned her master's. But after 40 years her career as a South 'Carolina public school teacher came to an abrupt halt in 1956 when the state legislature ruled that state employees could not belong to the NAACP. Clark refused to resign or lie about her membership and was dismissed.

Clark signed her name to a letter to 726 other black teachers asking them to protest the law, but only 11 of them agreed to attend a meeting with her and the

superintendent, and on the day of the meeting only four showed up. She later said that effort was the big failure of her life, and she believed it failed because she tried to push the other teachers into something they weren't ready for. The lesson she learned was that people needed to be trained first so that they would be prepared to actand the trainings she went on to develop helped shape the course of the Civil Rights Movement.

Clark had already attended several meetings at the Highlander Folk School in Tennessee, the legendary grassroots education center devoted to social justice. In the summer of 1955, she led a workshop at Highlander on developing leadership whose participants included a shy, quiet NAACP member from Montgomery, AL, Rosa Parks. After Clark was fired from her teaching job, Highlander's extraordinary director, Myles Horton, invited her to be Highlander's fulltime Director of Workshops, where she pioneered innovative programs that combined literacy education for adults with citizenship and voter education. When the state of Tennessee forced Highlander to close in 1961, Clark continued the same work as Director of Education and Teaching for the Southern Christian Leadership Conference's (SCLC) new Citizen Education Program. Her workshops formed the basis for the Citizenship School movement she helped establish across the South.

In addition to teaching basic reading skills using familiar materials like the Sears catalog and covering practi-cal topics like how to write checks, these "schools" taught basic civics and citizenship rights and focused on the arcane voting requirements specific to each local community that were being used to disenfranchise black voters. Classes met on evenings and weekends in churches, store backrooms, and other available spaces. Lessons were written on dry-cleaning bags in place of blackboards. They relied on training local citizens to teach other community members; Fannie Lou Hamer was among the local leaders who volunteered.

Clark eventually helped establish and recruit and train teachers for hundreds of Citizenship Schools: "They were in people's kitchens, in beauty parlors, and under trees in the summertime. I went all over the South, sometimes visiting three Citizenship Schools in one day...One time I heard Andy Young say that the Citizenship Schools were the base on which the whole Civil Rights Movement was built. And that's probably very much true." Rosa Parks also said that while she may have sat down

once, Septima Clark kept on working and building: "I am always very respectful and very much in awe of the presence of Septima Clark because her life story makes the effort that I have made very minute. I only hope that there is a possible chance that some of her great courage and dignity and wisdom has rubbed off on me."

As a woman in the movement, Clark said she felt the men around her often did not do a good job of listening to or including her or other women. Yet she observed that it was largely women who got things done: "In stories about the Civil Rights Movement you hear mostly about the black ministers. But if you talk to the women who were there, you'll hear another story. I think the Civil Rights Movement would never have taken off if some women hadn't start-ed to speak up." Even later in life Clark was never hesitant to speak up. One of the injustices after her 1956 firing was that South Carolina refused to pay the pension she had earned for her forty years of teaching or the pay she would have earned in the few years before her retirement if she had not been dismissed. She did not give up on fighting for those wrongs to be righted, and in 1976 the governor reinstated her pension, and five years later the legislature approved paying her back pay.

Although her signature accomplishment may be the programs she established for black adults, she never lost her original and enduring passion for educating children. During "retirement" in her 70s she became the first black woman elected to the Charleston School Board. Near the end of her life, she said: "Education is my big priority right now. I want people to see children as human beings and not to think of the money that it costs nor to think of the amount of time that it will take, but to think of the lives that can be developed into Americans who will redeem the soul of America and will really make America a great country." This Women's His-tory Month, let's continue to honor Septima Clark's history-making legacy by making her priority our own.

In the final Book of the New Testament, John, the beloved disciple, wrote a prophetic word of encouragement to seven churches in what is now part of Turkey. At the time it was written, each of those churches was suffering from persecution at the hands of the Roman Empire. Collectively, they were known as "The Seven Sisters." The history of the African American church in Milwaukee is also one of overcoming barriers and obstruction. Eighty-seven MPS students earn highest scores at Solo and Ensemble Festival and advance to State competition

Five RSV complications in older black adults

While most adults only get mild symptoms when contracting the respiratory syncytial virus (RSV), the same can't be said of older adults. According to the Centers for Disease Prevention and Control (CDC), adults over the age of 60 should be particularly concerned when they have RSV. In previous years, there have been hundreds of hospital admissions of persons over 75 per 100,000 and those who were in their 60s weren't far behind. Black Americans, in particular, should be wary of contracting RSV as statistics show that they account for over 55 percent of all hospitalizations from the virus.


Five RSV complications for older adults

1. Worse COVID Symptoms

you already have COVID-19 and then contract RSV or vice versa, the presence of the RSV usually makes the COVID-19 symptoms worse.

Some studies also suggest that having COVID-19 can make you more susceptible to certain viruses. Since both of these illnesses can significantly affect your breathing, it's worth talking to your doctor about the steps to keep you safe.

2. Worsening asthma or **COPD**



People who have chronic respiratory conditions like asthma and COPD are likely to have their symptoms worsen when they contract RSV.

In these cases, your regular maintenance treatments or emergency inhalers may not work as well. You should talk to your doctor as soon as you start feeling ill in case you need a different treatment while you're sick.

3. Pneumonia

Your illness can develop into pneumonia if your RSV symptoms get out of control.

Some signs that you have pneumonia are a high fever that leads to shaking or chills, a loss of appetite, shortness of breath, shallow breathing, sharp chest pain, and a cough that produces green, yellowish, or bloody mucus. Pneumonia must be treated by your doctor.

4. Bronchiolitis Sometimes RSV can cause bronchiolitis, which is the inflammation of the bronchioles in your lungs. The initial signs of this illness are fever, congestion, runny nose, loss of appetite, and a cough.

As your condition worsens, you may experience wheezing, shortness of breath, and a worsening cough. You'll need medical intervention to

5. Worsening congestive heart failure

People who are dealing with congestive heart failure may experience worsening symptoms if they contract RSV. You'll need to look out for signs of heart trouble as well as issues from RSV. You should contact your doctor immediately if you have trouble breathing or have heart palpitations.

Signs you need to go to the hospital

It's common for adults to assume that they've caught a bad case of the cold or flu when they're dealing with RSV. There are a few key differences to look out for, though. For example, the fever that's associated with the flu often happens more quickly than the one with RSV.

More importantly, you need to know when it's time to go to the hospital. Some signs that your RSV is getting worse include an increasing fever, shortness of breath, wheezing, a worsening cough, and a bluish tint to your skin or lips because of poor oxygen levels in your blood.

How RSV is treated

If your symptoms are manageable, your doctor will likely recommend using over-the-counter medications until you feel better. However, once you need to go to the hospital, there are a few different treatment options available. You can't cure RSV but there are supportive treatments that help ease your symptoms and prevent complications.

Some options include IV fluids to keep you hydrated; oxygen to ensure that your blood remains oxygenated; ventilators to help you

breathe; decongestants, and immunoglobulin if you have a weak immune system.

Tips for preventing RSV infections

One thing you can do to avoid contracting RSV is to stay away from people who are sick - whether or not they've been diagnosed with the illness. If you think that you have touched someone who's sick or they have been in your home, you need to wash your hands and disinfect all the surfaces in the house. It's also a good idea to avoid touching your face regularly as this is one of the ways that germs get introduced into your system.

Additionally, RSV vaccines are now available for adults over the age of 60 as well as others who may be more susceptible to the virus. You should talk to your doctor as soon as possible to find out if they're right for you.

It's typical for many Americans to contract RSV during the fall. Most of them won't experience bad symptoms but older adults are more likely to have complications. This appears to be especially true for black people. While it's best not to get the illness in the first place, it's just as important to know how to manage the symptoms if you have it.

Four medication tips to keep you safe as you age

When settling into your senior years, you need to be especially careful when taking medicines, herbal remedies and supplements, the U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA) says.

That's because older adults are likely to use more prescription and over-thecounter medications, which increases the risk of harmful side effects and drug interactions, the FDA said in a recent news release.

For example, the liver and kidneys might not work as well as they do for younger people, which can affect how a drug breaks down and leaves the body.

Even medications that worked well for a person during their youth and middle age might need to be adjusted or changed later in life, the FDA said.

Keeping all that in mind, the FDA has some important safety tips:

1. Take medication as prescribed.

The best medicine in the world won't work unless taken correctly. Take prescriptions following the directions on the label and your doctor's instructions.

For example, medicines that treat chronic conditions like high blood pressure, high cholesterol and diabetes work only when taken regularly and as directed.

Don't skip doses or stop physical taking a prescribed drug icine as prescribed can lead to even worse illness, and potentially even hospitalization and death.

> Antibiotics are a good example of this. Many antibiotics must be taken for the full length of time prescribed, even if symptoms have gone away. Stopping before the full course is done risks the infection returning in a stronger, more drug-resistant form.

> You should also avoid taking medicine that's been prescribed to others. Doctors plan a person's medication taking into account potential side effects and drug interactions. Taking another per-



2. Store medicines properly.

Storing medications properly helps them remain safe and effective.

Most medicines are best kept in a cool, dry place. Avoid exposing drugs to extreme heat or cold. For example, don't leave meds in a car in the summer or winter.

Also keep medicines stored up and away from children, who might be tempted to take a medicine because it looks like candy.

Be sure to check the expiration date of medications and discard expired drugs promptly. Expired medicines might not work as effectively or actually do harm. Further, people with serious or life-threatening illnesses can be at higher risk of potential harm from expired meds.

3. Watch out for potential drug interactions and side effects.

Medication interactions occur when something ingested affects the way a drug functions, causing dangerous side effects.

These interactions aren't limited to prescription drugs. Over-the-counter remedies, herbal remedies and supplements can also cause a drug interaction.

Even common foods and drinks can cause serious interactions with medications. For example, grapefruit juice can affect how some medicines work.

Drug labels should contain information on potential interactions. Doctors and pharmacists also can help you avoid interactions.

Some drugs can also cause side effects that mimic other health problems, like memory difficulties, dizziness and sleepiness. You should discuss any such side effects with their doctor.

4. Keep a medication list

Writing down all the medicines you're taking can help you keep track of doses and detect any potential drug in

The list should include the name of everything you are taking, including over-thecounter drugs, vitamins and supplements. For prescription drugs, note who prescribed it and why.

The list should be shown to all healthcare providers, including physical therapists and dentists. Ideally, you should keep one copy at home and another with you at all times.
