Bipartisan lawmakers pushing for tougher penalties in police chases

Lawmakers from both sides of the aisle are asking Governor Tony Evers to sign tougher legislation when it comes to reckless driving.

Senate Bill 514 would increase punishments for criminals who flee from police when the chase results in injury or death. Both Republican and Democratic state lawmakers came together at the Greenfield Police Station to ask Evers to sign the bill.

It's already been passed by the Senate and Assembly — lawmakers hope it will stop criminals from running from police.

The bill was created after the death of Erin Mogensen, who was killed during a

police chase in November, 2023. Wauwatosa police were trying to pull over a driver who was in a stolen car

who refused to stop.

After police called off the pursuit, the driver hit and

killed Erin and her unborn child. Officers said the driver reached speeds of more than 100 miles per hour.

State Representative Bob Donovan said he's proud to see something tragic turn into an effort to create change.

"These people have organized. They have decided to do their best to make a difference in this community and I can't thank them enough," he said.

The bill is awaiting Governor Evers' signature.

Ella Baker

As Women's History Month continues, I wanted to highlight again another transforming woman whose name I hope young people will learn: Ella Josephine Baker. Ella Baker said this 60 years ago as she was speaking about the murders of Freedom Summer workers James Chaney, Andrew Goodman, and Michael Schwerner, who disappeared together in Mississippi in June 1964. During the nationally publicized weeks-long search for Chaney, who was black, and Goodman and Schwerner, who were white, FBI investigators also found the bodies of several other murdered black men whose disappearances had not received the same attention. Ella Baker's statement was a rallying cry that has never stopped resonating. She was a lifelong warrior against injustice and inequality, a mentor for my generation of civil rights activists, a powerful advisor to colleagues like Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., and always, always, unwilling to rest.

Bernice Johnson Reagon featured those words in the stirring "Ella's Song"—we who believe in freedom cannot rest until it comes—and she and I were both among the hundreds of young people Ella Baker mentored. Ella Baker believed in servant leadership and shared leadership rather than charismatic leadership, and always encouraged young people to find and lift their own voices and join them with others.



Ella Baker grew up in Norfolk, Virginia, and graduated as valedictorian of her class at Shaw University in Raleigh, NC, before moving to Harlem, where her life as an activist took root over several decades. She eventually worked with the NAACP as a field secretary, National Director of Branches, and director of the New York office, pushing for organizational structure just as she would do when she helped establish both the Southern Christian Leadership Conference (SCLC) and the Student Nonviolent Coordinating Committee (SNCC).

She was the one who sat down with Bayard Rustin and Stanley Levison to discuss how to create a continuing movement out of the Montgomery bus boycott, leading to SCLC's formation. As the first SCLC staff member, she was the one who tried to put the new organization in operating order so that Dr. King was not just a leader who reacted to and jumped from one event to the next. She worked to give SCLC the capacity to plan and implement action. And Ella Baker was the one who convinced Dr. King to bring me and about 200 other black college students who

had been arrested for engaging in lunch counter sit-ins around the South to a meeting at her alma mater, Shaw University, in April 1960—the meeting where SNCC was founded. I was a senior at Spelman College, and my first plane ride ever was from Atlanta to Raleigh for that meeting. Ella Baker fought to make sure the students retained our own independent organization rather than simply becoming the youth arm of the SCLC. Julian Bond, Diane Nash, Bob Moses, and many other fellow student activists and young activists were all influenced by her example, counsel, and convening, and we all shared a special debt of reverence and gratitude.

Ella Baker was tough and disciplined and demanded the best of the young and older adults around her. She understood that movement building was about more than protests and meetings and speeches—it was hard, daily, persistent, and sacrificial behind-the-scenes work. She was an institution builder and stressed the importance of strong institutions that could last over time rather than reliance on a single strong leader. And as a woman, Ella Baker was fully aware of but unimpressed by the men she worked with who devalued the advice of women and sometimes resented her forcefulness, prodding, and "mothering." She made no special effort to be ingra-

tiating.

She labored at SCLC as she had at the NAACP to raise money, conduct voter registration drives, speak to citizen groups (sometimes ten times a day), and travel to community after community to help people help themselves. She warned against SCLC becoming "a cult of personality" for Dr. King rather than an organized means of empowering others, and she eventually left SCLC after deciding that movement building was more important than the specific organization and personalities involved. At a gathering celebrating Ella Baker's 75th birthday, Bob Moses called her the "Fundu," the person in the community who masters a craft with the help of the community and teaches it to other people. *Fundu* became the title of a film on her extraordinary life and work.

Ella Baker remains my civil rights generation's Fundu. The Children's Defense Fund Freedom Schools® Ella Baker Child Policy Training Institute proudly honors her. Sixty years after she taught us that we who believe in freedom cannot rest until it comes, we can all honor her by keeping her belief in freedom and equality alive until it becomes the reality for every mother's child.

Outcome of April referendum will either sustain or jeopardize strides MPS has made since 2020

Milwaukee Public Schools is one of more than 90 Wisconsin school districts putting referenda on the ballot this year because of the state's continued underfunding of public schools. Milwaukee residents will vote on Tuesday, April 2, 2024, on the MPS referendum question that asks voters to raise the revenue limit to support students by \$252 million, to be phased in over four years.

The MPS tax rate has been declining since 2011, even after voters approved a referendum in 2020. The 2020 referendum was used to make substantial improvements for students at MPS, primarily by hiring additional teachers and other staff and modernizing equipment.

The revenue-limit increase that MPS is seeking in April would be used to continue the strides made by the district since 2020 — in achieving smaller class sizes, attracting and keeping high-quality teachers, and expanding student access to music, visual arts, physical education, libraries, career and technical education, and more.

Class sizes are smaller

At Gwen T. Jackson Early Childhood and Elementary School, 2121 W. Hadley St., students have become more proficient as the student-to-teacher ratio has become more favorable.

Principal Sylvia Traylor, who arrived at the school in February 2022, said: "Smaller class sizes have affected our achievement. We went from not meeting expectations on our report card to meeting expectations."

Jackson School is an achievement gap reduction school, with a ratio mostly of 18 students for every teacher in K3 and K4 Head Start classrooms; and in first through third grades, sometimes 19 or 20 students.

Starms Early Childhood Center's student enrollment has grown in recent years, Principal Regina Navejar noted, and it could grow further if the school could add educators to its staff.

"Since the 2020 referendum, we've seen an increase in our enrollment and student retention. Our current enrollment shows that we significantly exceeded our budgeted enrollment expectations," Navejar said. "Starms' history in early childhood is a rich one, and people in our surrounding community and beyond recognize this. We've had interest in our program from areas as far as Oak Creek. We're hoping to

add more staff in the 2024-25 school year to meet the needs of our increasing enrollment."

More students are learning music

Music instruction has been shown to help students in areas such as improving memory, reasoning, and problem solving, and advancing math, reading, and language skills. By the 2023-24 school year, 92 percent of MPS students were in music classes, up from 19 percent in 2018-19. Ninety schools received new musical instruments and equipment.

Eighty-First Street School received a .20 increase for a music teacher — what amounts to an extra day of instruction per week — in the 2023 fiscal year.

"Our kids are preparing for the Biennial Music Festival, which they have not been able to participate in for a while. Our music teacher is phenomenal. She brought in a pianist for our holiday concert so the kids could sing to live music. She is really collaborating with partners — and the kids benefit from this — and we are getting great compliments from parents," said Principal Qiana Durojaiye.

New this year is the Eighty-First Street School Choir, which students in grades three through five can choose as their recess club since the school has a music teacher in the building an extra day each week. Dedicated funding for teacher salaries allowed the school to use other funds to purchase African drums, ukuleles, and sheet music so students can learn and practice notes throughout the school week.

At Milwaukee French Immersion School, Principal Jenna Harer said the school now has full-time, French-speaking art and music teachers.

"As an immersion school, we have been incredibly fortunate to have both our art and music teachers speak French and instruct in French. The 2020 referendum allowed us to have those two individuals full time in our building," Harer said. "Including the arts in our immersion programming is incredibly valuable for our students, as it ensures increased vocabulary in the target language and increases our immersion programming. Unfortunately, with the upcoming budget cuts, we will no longer be able to sustain both full time."



More students have art classes

Studying and making art helps students improve critical thinking, creativity, and engagement with school. All MPS students now have art class at least once a week, and 56 schools have increased art education since 2020.

"We now have full-time art and physical education teachers through the 2020 funding. Having full-time art and phy ed — really, they are extremely important for our students' growth and development," said Clemens School Principal Garry Lawson. "For me, arts were always critical to my development. I played standup fiddle bass for seven years. Music helps so much with mathematics — learning how to read notes, I could correlate to quarter note, half note, eighth note. The arts help students in so many ways, we can't even see the full impact."

Principal Veronica Leshok at Curtin Leadership Academy observed, "The arts can connect with different learners. We've also partnered with Danceworks. Everybody can express themselves and learn in different ways. Arts @ Large is doing a school-wide mural that reflects the diversity of our school. Our students speak 14 different languages, and having space where students can share who they are — that representation — is so important."

Attention to health and wellness

Students have more access to sports, physical education, and wellness activities in 57 schools through 32 new physical education teacher positions. Students now have physical education weekly.

At Curtin School, "Our physical education teacher is really good," said the principal, who added that the school combined positions to make the phy ed post full time. "She also teaches health and collaborates with community agencies to come and work with the kids and uses curriculum from Children's Wisconsin. It's nice to have teachers who develop

their own realm of focus. You can be more creative with instruction when you are not stretched too thin with a part-time position," Leshok noted.

Getting ready for careers

Students preparing for careers have more teachers and more modern equipment. Trade, technical, and STEM (science, technology, engineering, and mathematics) facilities have been updated and expanded to better position the future workforce. For example, the Bradley Technology and Trade School weld shop has been outfitted with modern equipment, and Washington High School of Information Technology's main computer lab now includes new technology and a virtual reality area.

"With the trades, we want students to get an experience that's as close as possible to what they will experience in the working world. This means periodically upgrading and modifying equipment to make it comparable to what's available in the private sector," said Bradley Tech Principal Aaron Shapiro.

Since the 2020 vote, "referendum dollars provided additional personnel support for our trades programming," Shapiro added. "We were able to contract with MATC for a part-time instructor, and we split a manufacturing instructor between us and Barack Obama School of Career and Technical Education. In the past, we had a hard time filling that position."

At Milwaukee High School of the Arts, the Project Lead The Way lab, a STEM space focused on engineering and design, underwent a significant renovation thanks to the 2020 referendum. The area was refreshed and received six electrical pull-down cords for group projects, 3D printers, new windows and water fixtures, and space for flying drones indoors during inclement weather, and for properly storing projects and materials.

"These projects show students we are investing in

them," said Principal Larry Farris. "They see old, outdated facilities renovated into spaces that meet the demands of their generation and provide what they require to learn and prepare for college and career. When you're competing with schools in other districts that are updating their facilities to support student achievement, it's nice to give students spaces that meet their learning needs here in Milwaukee."

For city taxpayers, the MPS revenue-limit increase would mean an additional \$216 for every \$100,000 of assessed property value in the first year. In future years, however, referendum taxes would remain flat.

Without additional revenue, the school district would face a budget shortfall of at least \$200-million in fiscal year 2025. The shortfall would mean larger class sizes, cuts to teaching positions, reductions in educational programming, and less support for student mental health.

State funding of public schools has not kept pace with inflation since 2009. Additionally, the state for the first time froze per-pupil funding for two consecutive years, in 2021 and 2022. At the same time, the rate of inflation rose significantly. The state also underfunds MPS students with disabilities by at least \$50-million a year.

The Milwaukee Board of School Directors voted in January, 2024 to place the referendum on the ballot. The referendum question reads:

"Shall the Milwaukee Public Schools, Milwaukee and Washington Counties, Wisconsin be authorized to exceed the revenue limit specified in Section 121.91, Wisconsin Statutes, by \$140-million for the 2024-2025 school year; by an additional \$51-million for the 2025-2026 school year; by an additional \$47-million for the 2026-2027 school year; and by an additional \$14-million (for a total of \$252-million) for the 2027-2028 school year and thereafter, for the recurring purposes of sustaining educational programming, including offering career and technical education programs, attracting and retaining certified educators, and further improving art, music, physical education and language programs?"

Ten life-changing inventions made by black women

While you might not think about who was behind some of the technology taken for granted daily, it might surprise you to know how many come from black women. Throughout history, black women have inspired or invented more things than you know. Here are only 10 of them.

Ten inventions by black women

1. The Laserphoco Probe

Dr. Patricia Bath hit several milestones in her medical career. The ophthalmologist was the first black female physician to receive a medical patent and was the first black woman to finish a residency in ophthalmology at New York University.

She created the Laserphoco probe, which is a device that uses a small laser to remove cataracts from the eye. This invention revolutionized cataract surgery and it led to Dr. Bath's posthumous induction into the National Inventors Hall of Fame in 2021.

2. The Home Security System

Living in a high-crime neighborhood in 1966, Marie Van Brittan Brown was looking for a way to be safe. That's when she invented a security system that would give her a view of her front door. The system had a sliding camera, two-way microphones, television monitors, and four peepholes.

Using the peepholes, the camera would capture images of people outside her door while the microphone allowed her to communicate with them. According to

the Massachusetts Institute of Technology, this was the first time that a closed-circuit television was used in a security system.

3. The Illusion Transmitter

Valerie Thomas was a physicist who was only one of two women in her class at Morgan State University. After leaving university, she started working at NASA as a data and mathematical analyst.

While managing the development of image-processing systems for the 'Landsat' satellite, she saw a light illusion in 1976 and that inspired her to invent the illusion transmitter. This transmitter uses concave mirrors to project images onto a display. The technology that went into the illusion transmitter was not only used by NASA but it paved the way for the 3-D movie technology that's common today.

4. Fiber Optic Cables

Dr. Shirley Jackson was the first black woman to earn a doctorate in particle physics. As such, several of her

inventions act as the foundation on which many modern technologies are built.

Starting her career at Bell Telephone (now AT&T), Dr. Jackson helped to invent touch-tone dialing and call waiting. However, her most striking invention is fiber-optic cables, which form the basis for linking global communication systems.

5. The Fold-Out Bed

Sarah E. Goode was an enslaved woman who gained her freedom at the end of the Civil War. Once free, she opened a furniture store with her carpenter husband.

While building furniture, Goode noticed that some of her neighbors were having trouble with fitting beds into their small apartments. That led her to invent fold-out beds that were known as cabinet beds at the time. She also became only the second black woman to receive a U.S. patent for her invention.

6. Synthetic Bristle Brushes

Lydia D. Newman made

significant strides in black hair care in the 1890s. At that time, most hairbrushes were made with animal hairs and were too soft to effectively manipulate thicker hair.

These brushes were also harder to clean. As a result, Newman invented a synthetic bristle brush to use with black women's hair and received a patent for it.

7. HVAC Systems

Alice H. Parker was born in New Jersey but also lived in Washington DC. The cold weather in these regions led her to wonder if there was a way to efficiently heat an entire home that didn't involve a wood-burning fireplace. This desire resulted in an invention that became the precursor of modern Heating, Ventilation, Air Conditioning (HVAC) systems.

8. The Feeding Tube

Bessie Blount Griffin was working as a physical therapist at the end of World War II. When working with soldiers who were amputees, she noted that many of them had challenges with eating.

To help with that, she invented an electric self-feed-

ing tube that released a small portion of food when the patient bit down. This helped with their independence and nutrition.

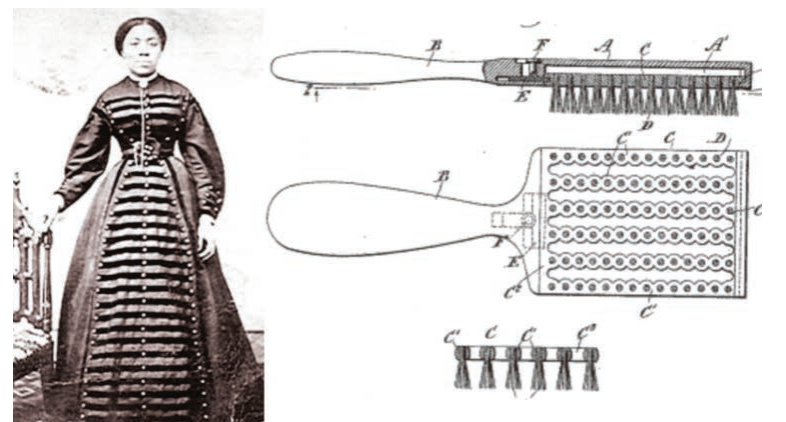
9. The Clothes Wringer

Ellen F. Englin made the process of washing clothes more manageable when she created the clothes wringer in 1888. The device was designed to remove excess water from clothes after they had been washed.

10. The Signal Chair

Miriam Elizabeth Benjamin wanted to make it easier for people to get the attention of others while at the doctor's, at the movie theater, in a meeting with government officials, or at a hotel. This led to the invention of the signal chair that is used most often on airplanes to call to flight attendants.

The interesting thing is that this is far from an exhaustive list of the contributions that black women have made. Black women have made even more contributions to technology, medicine, beauty, and more. They also continue to excel and put their marks in different industries.
