A Parrish family legacy

Atty. Sheila Parrish-Spence has been sworn in as a Milwaukee County Supplemental Court Commissioner by the Honorable Milwaukee County Circuit Court Judge Ana Berrios-Schroeder. Atty. Parrish-Spence continues the family legacy of her father, the late Milwaukee County Circuit Court Judge Clarence Parrish. He was the first black lawyer in Milwaukee County to win an election - it was a contested judicial race, too. He graduated from St. John's University School of Law in Queens, New York, and furthered his legal education and graduated from the University of Wisconsin School of Law. Before being elected as a Milwaukee County judge, her father was a magistrate and a judicial court commissioner. Atty. Parrish-Spence's mother, Mildred Parrish, served on the board of trustees at Alverno College under Sister Joel Read and served on Marquette University committees with Father Raynor, president and chancellor of the Marquette University. Mildred was also owner and publisher of Excellence Magazine and a Marquette University graduate. Those in attendance in person or by Zoom included Judge Lena Taylor, Atty. Parrish-Spence's son, Jonathan Clarence Parrish Spence, who lives on the East Coast, relatives, friends, and members of Alpha Kappa Alpha



Sorority, of which Atty. Parrish-Spence is a Golden Soror for 50 years of service, and Karuna Rekhraj, CFRM, of North Carolina Central University School of Law. Other organizations that Atty Parrish-Spence is a part of are the Milwaukee Links, Inc. and Cream City Links, Inc., Top Ladies of Distinction, a member of both St. Mark AME Church and Christ the King Baptist Church, which were in attendance at the swearing in. Atty. Parrish-Spence is a graduate of North Carolina Central University School of Law, an historically black college and university (HBCU).

Reminders of renewal

As Christians this past weekend celebrated Easter, in the midst of this holy season for so many faith traditions, I return again to the Easter Sunday service of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. preached in April 1957 at Dexter Avenue Baptist Church in Montgomery, Alabama, titled Questions that Easter Answers." Dr. King said one of these questions is "Is the universe on the side of the forces of justice and goodness?":

"Sometimes it looks dark and sometimes people come to feel that the universe is on the other side, that the universe seems to say 'Amen' to the forces of injustice . . . Every now and then I feel like asking God, 'Why is it that over so many centuries the forces of injustice have triumphed over the Negro and he has been forced to live under oppression and slavery and exploitation? Why is it, God? Why is it simply because some of your children ask to be treated as first-class human beings they are trampled over, their homes are bombed, their children are pushed from their classrooms, and sometimes little children are thrown in the deep waters of Mississippi?' . . . I begin to despair sometimes, it seems that Good Friday has the throne. It seems that the forces of injustice reign supreme. But then in the midst of that something else comes to me. And I can hear something saying, 'King, you are stopping at Good Friday, but don't you know that Easter is coming?"

Dr. King continued: "This is the meaning of Eas-

ter, it answers the profound question that we confront in Montgomery. And if we can just stand with it, if we can just live with Good Friday, things will be all right. For I know that Easter is coming and I can see it coming now. As I look over the world, as



I look at America, I can see Easter coming in race relations. I can see it coming on every hand. I see it coming in Montgomery. I see it coming in Alabama. I see it coming in Mississippi. Sometimes it looks like it's coming slow, but it's still coming."

Easter is still coming.

Sometimes it may still feel as if the forces of injustice and those who are afraid of the light and the truth are winning for a day. But the message of this joyous season of renewal in many traditions, with family and community rituals centered on the promises of exodus, deliverance, new hope, and rebirth, is that darkness will not prevail. Death-dealing empires and injustice do not have the last word. Good will triumph over evil. A new day is still dawning.

I end with two prayers for renewal:

God, guide our faith that by it we might make our children and nation whole again.

God, help us to believe with every ounce of our



being that we, with Your help, can save our children and make them well.

God, renew our spirits—Your spirit within us—and make us worthy carriers of Your message of love and hope and life in all we say and do this day and forever more.

God, please help us remember that all the darkness in the world cannot snuff out the light of one little candle. Help us to keep lighting our little candles until a mighty torch of justice sweeps our nation and the world.

CIVIC MUSIC MKE honors two MHSA singers as Young Artist scholarship winners

Some songs demand more of their singers. Consider:

- A song in German written by Richard Strauss in 1885 that's an outpouring of longing.
- A Langston Hughes poem set to music that reveals a hidden sadness.
- An operatic aria in Italian by Handel that mines the pain of separation.
- A 1905 song ultimately about human connection, in a brisk delivery that also tests a singer's range.

These four works that make emotional and technical demands of their singers were worth the effort for two students from Milwaukee High School of the Arts.

Lex V. Crump, a junior and a mezzo soprano, and Jae Carter, a senior and a tenor, were named the Young Artist Scholarship winners for voice at the annual CIVIC MUSIC MKE competition for high school students. The competition is open to vocalists and instrumentalists in grades 10 to 12 who live in Milwaukee, Waukesha, Washington, Ozaukee, and Racine counties.

Lex and Jae were among a dozen vocalists auditioning in late January for CIV-IC MUSIC's high school showcase recital. Both were awarded \$250 to participate in the recital, and all vocalists received a mini master class from the judges after auditioning.

Ten musicians were invited to perform at the recital, which was held before an audience of 120 people on February 10 at the Milwaukee Youth Arts Center. There, Lex and Jae were named the scholarship winners for voice. Lex was awarded an additional \$500, and Jae was awarded an additional \$250. Two instrumentalists also received scholarships.



"Their performances brought forth their exciting voices and their deep understanding of the art of interpretation and storytelling that true artists consistently display," Raymond Roberts, choral director at MHSA, said of Jae and Lex. "They represented themselves, their families, MHSA, and MPS remarkably."

Lex sang "Dove Sei Amato Bene?" from the opera "Rodelinda," written in 1725. "I really love that one because the words are so beautiful, and it showcases a lot of my range," Lex said.

"I love singing opera because, I think, it's all relatively new to me," she added. "I never thought I would sing opera," never expecting to like it or be good at it. "I enjoy that the sound is different - more unique," Lex said.

Her selection in English, "Love's Philosophy," is a Percy Bysshe Shelly poem set to music by British composer Roger Quilter. Roberts, who was the pianist for Lex and Jae at the audition and recital, described the song as having "a very bright tempo and large, sweeping intervals into the upper register."

Lex said she found "Love's Philosophy" the more intimidating of her two selections:

outpouring of words, sung quickly, with some of the notes quite high. "I've really grown to love the high A's. That's my money note at this point," she said.

Roberts described Lex's voice as "vibrant and pure with ample range and a beautiful warm tone throughout all registers."

Performing "Zueignung," by Richard Strauss — known as "Devotion" in English was familiar territory for Jae, but territory that Jae wanted to know better.

Jae first sang it for the Wisconsin School Music Association last year. "How am I going to sing this hard song with a high A?" she wondered. Jae said, "I was my own worst critic" on that first pass at "Zueignung." She didn't know the translation as well back then and didn't have time to put herself into it. "This year, I really developed my technique... I really wanted to show my devotion

"I just love the message. It's a very beautiful song," Jae

Roberts noted that " 'Zueignung' features a dramatic climax on A4, High A, which suits Jae's extraordinary 'ringing' tenor tone."

Jae came to see opera's beauty after being unfamiliar at first with the tone and technique. "I've really grown to love opera and the way it sounds, and the technique of it. It really has a special place in my heart," Jae said.

Jae felt drawn to "Minstrel Man," the Langston Hughes poem on the unseen pain felt by an entertainer, which was set to music by Margaret Bonds in 1959 for her "Dream Portraits" song cycle. Jae found the work heartfelt and touching; the performance of it that he heard was sung with great passion.

"When Mr. Roberts offered it to me, I was like, yes, I'll do it right now," Jae said. "I want to sing with that much passion and that much

Both Jae and Lex say their education at MHSA has been valuable to their growth as

"I started studying at a more intense level, and it made me more passionate than I already was" about singing, said Lex, who began voice lessons at age 9.

Jae, who had been singing in a gospel choir at church, was intrigued by MHSA after hearing about it from a friend who went to school there. "I heard Mr. Roberts

was an amazing teacher, and I had to see it for myself," said Jae, who is in Advanced Chorus, Vocal Jazz Ensemble, and Opera Workshop, and is a teacher's assistant for Intermediate Choir.

Jae, who vocalizes around the house to relax, has added jazz to her R&B favorites to sing, after being exposed to jazz at MHSA and "seeing the beautiful people make beautiful sounds. I'm really gravitating toward it," Jae

At MHSA, Lex said, "We get such a cross-training experience" — jazz, pop, musical theater, and more. Lex is in Advanced Chorus, Opera Workshop, and Vocal Jazz Ensemble.

"In any creative aspect, an ensemble is so important," Lex said. "Coming into school and getting to sing with people I love is really valuable to me."

MHSA, she said, takes into account a singer's tone a singer's distinctive vocal quality — "more so than other schools might." And, Lex said, "I'm 17 and relearning how to breathe for singing.'

Jae wants to continue studying music after graduating in the spring, and Lex, too, hopes to major in vocal performance after she graduates. "I just want to sing for the rest of my life," Lex said.

CIVIC MUSIC MKE, in its 105th season, was founded in 1918 by the dean of Marquette University's College of Music. The organization in 1923 secured high school credits for MPS music students and in 1926 presented its first high school awards to graduating MPS seniors. The organization expanded the awards to all public high school students in Milwaukee County in 1941 and later added the rest of the five-county area.



Seven reasons why you can't sleep

Sometimes you are dehydrated and sipping water can help give you that energy boost you're crav-

4. Noise Too little or too much noise can also interfere with your sleep. I personally need white noise to block out any outside noises. When I am first falling asleep, even just footsteps can keep me awake as well as karaoke night at the bar next to my apartment building every Tuesday night. This is why I must have a fan on at nighttime. Once I fall asleep, I typically can sleep through anything as long as a fan is on in my bedroom. Any time I am in a new place where there is no fan or noise machine, I have difficulty falling asleep. In this case, I will download a sound machine app on my phone. I recommend turning on a fan or sound machine to anyone who has a sleep disorder to get the best quality of sleep each night.

5. Light exposure

Watching television, playing on your phone, and even digital clocks may be another surprising reason why you can't sleep at night. Studies have shown that these types of lights interfere with signals in your brain telling your body it is time to shut down and go to sleep. I am guilty of scrolling through social media on my cell phone in bed before going to bed and even leaving the TV on from time to time. However, in the evenings I am exposed to these bright lights, I find that I have more difficulty falling asleep. Try setting a cut-off time for all electronics 30 minutes before bedtime. Instead, try meditating, journaling, or reading a book to reduce the amount of brightness you are getting at night.

6. Irregular sleep schedule

Sometimes there are nights you seem to be restless for no apparent reason. Perhaps you have used all of the above suggestions, but are still tossing and turning. You may not feel stressed or even anxious but still can't seem to fall asleep anyway. If this is the case, you may need to evaluate your activity that day. Try to avoid naps if possible in the afternoon. Sometimes a power nap is necessary to re-energize before a workout or dinner date. However, anything more than 20 minutes could interfere with your sleeping patterns. You should also try to stick to the same sleep schedule each night, especially during the week. Although life tends to happen and you may find yourself staying at happy hour a few hours longer than expected, try to go to bed and wake up at the same time each day. Maintaining a consistent sleep schedule is a smart move.

7. Uncomfortable bedroom environment

comfortable. At nighttime, I choose to keep the temperature cool. There's nothing worse than waking up in a pile of sweat at nighttime. I love snuggling into my blankets and feeling a slight breeze. I also try to keep my bedroom dark. If you do not have the proper blinds in your bedroom, try blackout curtains. I also wear an eye mask at night to keep the light out. Lastly, try to keep your bedroom organized. Reducing clutter can help to keep you relaxed and feel more at peace before going to bed.

Nine smart ways to spend your tax refund

Receiving a large tax refund can feel like you won the lottery. For many of us, it's the biggest paycheck we receive all year. That's a lot of "extra" money at our disposal.

In the autumn of 2021, some 63 million Americans (29 percent of the adult population) reported it was difficult to pay for household expenses such as food, rent/mortgage, car payments, medical expenses, and student loans.³ No doubt the effects of the pandemic played a pivotal role in these difficulties.

On the other hand, some people who had stable jobs



during this time were able to build up their savings because they weren't spending money discretionary expenses, such as eating out, vacations, and other recreation.

If you are one of the lucky ones with a steady income, consider using the money from this year's tax return to build up your emergency fund. For years, financial experts have recommended that people squirrel away three to six months of expenses in a money market or savings account for that rainy day — or year. Maybe this is finally your year to do so.

Don't feel overwhelmed by this amount. Even if your emergency savings are close to zero, any amount you start with will help. Also, your tax refund could amount to a week's — or even a month's — worth of expenses. That's a great foundation to build upon.

And you'll feel more prepared when the unexpected happens.

3. Add it to your retirement savings, or jumpstart your retirement plan

Retirement might seem like that fool you into thinking it is. Are you on track with saving enough money for when that time comes?

A traditional or Roth IRA can help supplement your retirement savings. In 2023, if you're under the age of 50, you may contribute up to \$6,500. If you're older than 50, that amount can increase to \$7,500.4

4. Start a business

While spending more time at home during these last few years you might have discovered or developed a talent, such as woodworking, painting, or baking with sourdough. And now you want to turn your hobby into a side business. Your tax return

could serve as seed money to build up your inventory or develop a website for your new money-making gig.5

5. Fund a college education

The price of a higher education is expensive. Setting up a college funding account with your tax refund may ease the future financial burdens of an education.

According to U.S. News data, the average annual tuition at public and private schools in the 2022-2023 academic year has increased. Tuition at a private college averages about 4 percent more than the previous year versus just 0.8 percent and 1 percent (for in-state and out-ofstate students, respectively) at a public school. Currently, the average annual cost of a private college education is \$39,723 and a public college education is \$10,423 (for instate students) and \$22,953 (for out-of-state students).

Many Americans use student loans to help pay for their education. In fact, more than 42 million borrowers have federal student loan

To help offset the price, a long way off. But don't let consider investing in a tax-advantaged vehicle, such as a 529 plan, well before your loved one heads to the halls of academia. Tax benefits include tax-free earnings and withdrawals for qualified educational expenses. Also, a 529 plan will not negatively impact your child's ability to qualify for federal aid.8

> In the end, don't let the high price of a college education scare you. Every dollar you save is one dollar less you have to borrow. If you're able to contribute \$265 a month (or \$3,200 a year, which is the average amount of many family's tax returns each year), your child will be well on his or her way to saving for college.

Work with a financial professional to determine which investment vehicle is right for your situation. 529 Plans aren't the only option out there.

6. Add it to your HSA

Some health insurance features a high deductible plan that offers a heath savings account (HSA). There are some medical expenses that you might expect — like your child needing braces. But there are others that come out of left field — like your child being hit in the mouth with a baseball and needing emergency dental work.

And if you have private health insurance with a high-deductible plan, that trip to the ER (or any medical treatment) can come at a high price. A high medical bill might mean that you have to put off something else that you were looking forward to like a much-needed family vacation or a home remodel.

7. Invest in your home

Your tax refund isn't going to get you a new kitchen or bathroom. But it can open the door to smaller remodeling projects that are on your home improvement to-do

And some improvements will save you money down the road — allowing your tax refund to make an even greater impact. For example, you might want to replace your old appliances with energy-efficient models. Or, perhaps you're ready to replace that drafty entry door.

Also, replacing a tired-looking backsplash, getting new faucets or adding a coat of paint to well-worn walls can do wonders for a home. Or sprucing up your yard with some pretty perennials will leave you feeling good.

8. Invest in your family

The main reason we work is to care for the needs of our loved ones. So, it's no wonder that we think of them when we receive a large tax refund.

When we have their physical needs covered, sometimes the best thing we can provide them with is time spent together doing something fun. In fact, research shows that experiential purchases contribute more to our overall happiness than do material purchases. One reason is because we're more likely to second-guess our material purchases than our experiential ones.9

Now that the world has opened up, you can choose from a plethora of fun experiences — such as visiting a zoo or a museum, attending a play or a concert, or taking a cooking or an art class. Thinking bigger? Use that tax money to start a vacation fund. Whatever experience you choose, you can revisit it again and again by talking about it with friends and family.

9. Help others

It's more clear than ever that we need each other. Consider donating to an organization in your community that you connect with.




