

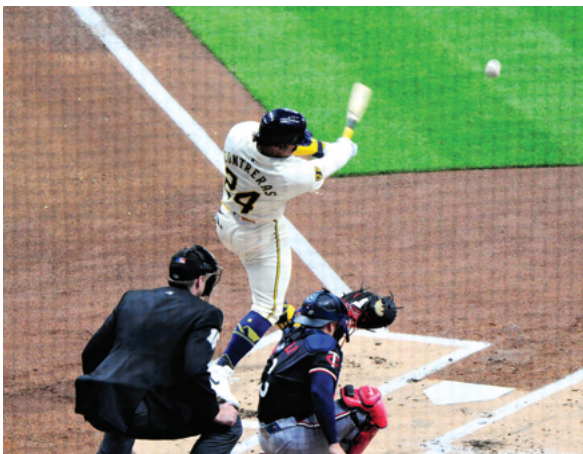

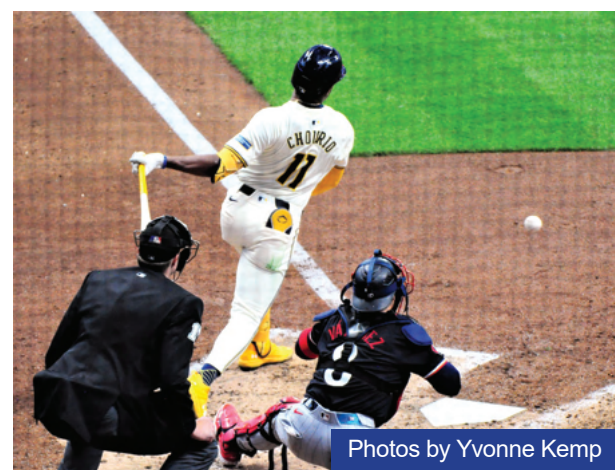
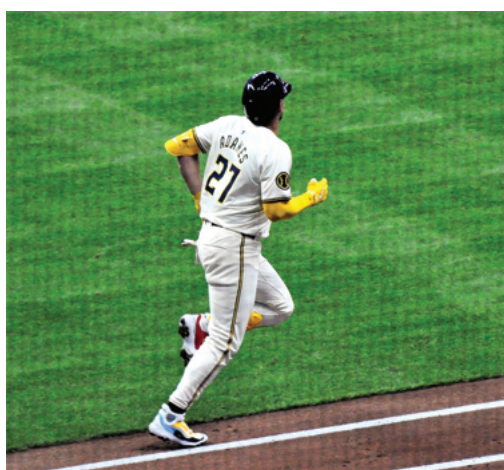

Milwaukee Brewers celebrate 2024 Opening Day at American Family Field



The Milwaukee Brewers celebrated their 2024 Opening Day at American Family Field against the Minnesota Twins on Tuesday, April 2, 2024 after a successful first series sweep over the New York Mets. Despite the rain and cold, the game was a sell-out. Jackson Chourio singled in a run in his first American Family Field plate appearance; Christian Yelich homered; and the Milwaukee Brewers beat the Twins 3-2 to open a season with four straight wins for the first time since 2006. Bob Uecker, the longtime radio play-by-play announcer for the Milwaukee Brewers, was on the microphone for the game. This is Uecker's 54th season on Newsradio 620 WTMJ.

Gov. Evers signs bipartisan “Prince Act” to expand AMBER Alert System for missing kids

Legislation comes in the wake of the tragic disappearances of Prince McCree in Milwaukee and Lily Peters in Chippewa Falls

On Tuesday, April 9, 2024, Gov. Tony Evers signed the “Prince Act”—Senate Bill (SB) 981, now 2023 Wisconsin Act 272—which aims to address gaps in the Wisconsin AMBER Alert System by expanding criteria for issuing alerts for missing children. Gov. Evers approved Act 272 at Hawley Environmental School in Milwaukee, the former elementary school of Prince McCree, whose tragic disappearance inspired his neighbor, State Sen. LaTonya Johnson (D-Milwaukee), to champion and pass SB 981 to enhance Wisconsin’s AMBER Alert System. The governor was joined for the signing ceremony by members of Prince’s family, bill co-author State Sen. Johnson, school and district officials, students, and community members, among others.

The Prince Act was created in response to the tragic disappearances and deaths of Prince McCree and Lily Peters to ensure authorities in future missing child cases have expanded resources to issue quicker and more robust alert notices to the public, hopefully ensuring kids are able to be quickly located and returned home safely in the future.

“The idea of having your child go missing is something no parent ever wants to imagine or, heaven forbid,

experience firsthand. But all too often, families are faced with these impossible situations,” said Gov. Evers. “In moments like these, when loved ones and communities are gripped by worry and fear and every moment is vital to locate a missing child, every resource should be made available to bring that kid home.

“For five-year-old Prince McCree’s family in Milwaukee last year and 10-year-old Lily Peters’ family in Chippewa Falls in 2022, heartbreakingly, this was not the case,” continued Gov. Evers. “In these tragic cases, circumstances around Prince and Lily’s disappearances were considered to not have met the threshold statutorily to issue an AMBER Alert. But today, thanks to the important advocacy and determination of many, I am proud to sign Senate Bill 981—the

Prince Act—to help ensure similar situations never occur again.”

“Prince was a light in our lives and a joy to everyone who met him. There are simply no words to describe the pain our family has experienced ever since his passing,” said Jordan Barger, Prince’s mother. “What happened to Prince shouldn’t happen to any child. The current alert system failed him and failed our family, and I hope that with this new law, more families will get the attention and resources they need to bring their kids home safely. I want to thank Sen. LaTonya Johnson for keeping her promise to our family and fighting to pass this legislation and Gov. Evers for signing these important changes into law in honor of our son.”

Individuals from Lily Peters’ family noted they are

very grateful for this bill being enacted and that the sooner the public can be made aware of a missing child, the better. They feel this bill will help many children in the future.

According to AMBER Alert Wisconsin, to issue an AMBER Alert, a child must be 17 years of age or younger, in danger of serious bodily harm or death; and the initiating agency must have enough descriptive information about the child, the suspect and/or the suspect vehicle to believe an immediate broadcast alert will help locate the child.

On Oct. 25, 2023, five-year-old Prince McCree stayed home from school because he was sick. Prince’s mother had allowed him to play video games in the basement with members of the household, which occurred regularly. Prince’s mother later could not find him and proceeded to call the authorities to report him missing. The Milwaukee Police Department requested an AMBER Alert; however, the request was denied. The next day, on Oct. 26, 2023, Prince’s body was discovered.

On April 24, 2022, 10-year-old Iliana “Lily” Peters went to visit her aunt’s house, located nearly a quarter of a mile away from her home. Lily’s father later re-

ported that she was missing at 9 p.m., after Lily had not returned home. At the time of her disappearance, the Chippewa Falls Police Department reported Lily’s case had not met the criteria for an AMBER Alert. The next morning, April 25, 2022, Lily’s body was discovered.

In the wake of both disappearances, the Milwaukee and Chippewa Falls communities, with the help of friends and relatives, helped search for and spread information about the disappearances of Prince and Lily. The outpouring of support from both these communities led to a statewide campaign to address concerns with alert notices, including AMBER Alerts.

Senate Bill 981, now 2023 Wisconsin Act 272:

- Expands the Silver Alert system to apply to certain children.
- An alert could be issued if the person is under the age of 18, their location is unknown, they do not otherwise qualify for another alert, and they are unable to return home without help because of a physical or mental condition, disability, or age (i.e., that they are under 10 years old).

Connect One BRT fare-free rides come to an end: What riders need to know

The Milwaukee County Transit System’s (MCTS) Connect One BRT is a nine-mile route that runs along Wisconsin Avenue from the Regional Medical Center to downtown. According to MCTS, the ridership for Connect One makes it one of the top 10 routes.

The Connect One has been free for riders since it debuted in June 2023, but soon they’ll have to pay.

The free fare is something that riders like Chauncey Robinson said have been a big help — Robinson takes the bus to work frequently to get to American Family Field.

“It drops me off probably a half a mile before the stadium and I just walk the rest of the way there,” said Robinson.

Robinson said he actually prefers riding the Connect One because the experience has been pleasant.

“It has more like a trolley type of feel to it,” he said.



bus stop stations, using the Umo app or your WisGo card.

The fare will cost two dollars per trip and capped at four dollars daily. MCTS said when riders prepay before boarding, it speeds up the boarding process.

Julie Conner said she already pays for her other rides using her WisGo card and says it’s been a smooth process. She anticipates the Connect One process will be the same.

“I haven’t had any problems with it. The bus drivers are really nice,” said Conner.

MCTS officials said, during the first week of payment, ambassadors will be located at some of the Connect One stations to help riders through the payment process. Most riders say they were happy to enjoy the bus while it was free.

“It’s been excellent; you know it’s a nice comfortable ride. The bus is quite clean. They have new features, such as you can charge your phone,” said rider Leon Hill.

Angel Aguirre also takes the bus daily, but to get to school.

“I take it to go to law school at Marquette,” said Aguirre.

He says the Connect One has been a convenient choice and he has some friends who take it instead of Route 30, which also runs along Wisconsin Avenue, because it’s free. However, he knew sooner or later MCTS would start collecting on their investment.

“I was always wondering when they were gonna start charging us,” said Aguirre.

According to MCTS, riders will have to paying before they board starting on April 15, 2024. MCTS said there are three ways to do this: at the kiosk validator located at





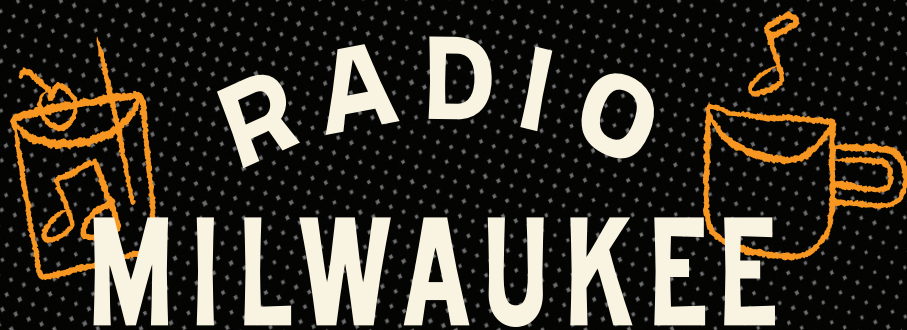

New street signs arrive to honor Dr. Lester Carter

On Friday April 5, 2024, crews installed the new street signs that bear the name of Dr. Lester Carter Jr., a pioneering pharmacist who served Milwaukee's black residents for decades.

In 2023, the Common Council voted to rename N. 24th St., from W. Keefe Ave. to W. Center St., as 'N. Dr. Lester Carter Drive' Previously, N. 24th St. held an honorary name of 'N. Dr. Lester Carter Dr.' per a resolution passed unanimously by the Common Council in October 2017.

A longtime resident of N. 24th St., Dr. Lester Carter, Jr. was a pharmacist and pillar of the Milwaukee community for more than 50 years. It was on the corner of N. 24th and W. Burleigh Streets where Dr. Carter lived and opened his pharmacy in 1968, a time when there were few black residents in the neighborhood and fewer black doctors in the city.

Remembered fondly for sporting a bow-tie and white lab coat, the late Dr. Carter was a trusted physician, herbalist, and a fixture in Milwaukee's black community who was perhaps best known for his holistic approach to healing and his natural remedies to people's health challenges – remedies that often resulted in more positive health outcomes. Dr. Carter dedicated his life to the health and wellbeing of his patients and neighborhood. His legacy is a testament to a long life of service undeterred by adversity.





MPS Turnaround Arts students will performed at the Kennedy Center in Washington, D.C.

Eleven Milwaukee Public Schools (MPS) students from Roosevelt Middle School of the Arts presented an original musical work recently at the Kennedy Center for the Performing Arts in Washington, D.C., considered America's national cultural center.

The performance — on Sunday, April 7, 2024 at the Kennedy Center's Eisenhower Theater — was for the Turnaround Arts 2024 Student Showcase. The event featured young performers from schools around the country that take part in the Kennedy Center's Turnaround Arts program.

People in Milwaukee watched the showcase, as well. The 2024 Showcase be livestreamed on The Kennedy Center YouTube channel and Facebook on Sunday at 2:00 p.m. Central time.

Turnaround Arts is in 57 schools in nine states. It was founded in 2011 by the President's Committee on the Arts and the Humanities, under the leadership of then-First Lady Michelle Obama.

Since 2016, MPS has been the home to all four Turnaround Arts schools in Wisconsin: Roosevelt, Sherman Multicultural Arts School, Lancaster School, and Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., School.

Roosevelt serves as the hub for the MPS Turnaround Arts schools because it had the infrastructure for arts in place, even though budget cuts in previous years had set it back, said Ja'Rahn Leveston, the local program director for Turnaround Arts schools in MPS since 2019 and an educator and teaching artist in the program since 2016. Roosevelt has an auditorium outfitted for performances, along with two professional-grade dance studios and a



recording studio.

The program's purpose is two-pronged: to improve academics and arts climate at schools.

Turnaround Arts encourages academic success by engaging children through the arts and integrating arts into the curriculum. (MPS also integrates the arts into the curriculum at some other district schools.) Besides their intrinsic value, the arts have been shown to benefit students in other areas of study, as well.

The arts can be "an academic tool in itself, just of a different kind," Leveston said.

The 11 Roosevelt 7th and 8th graders, who had been rehearsing since mid-March, left Milwaukee for the nation's capital on Friday, April 5. They're all veteran performers at Roosevelt; and Turnaround Arts even has been a springboard for some to perform at First Stage Children's Theater.

Last fall, Caiden Chambers played the leading role in "Dream, Quickie! Dream!" based on the life of Green Bay Packers great Donald Driver, and Ricki Simonton performed in "The Forgotten Girl."

"We've really been trying to broaden opportunities for our students and also serve as a conduit for First Stage Children's Theater," Leveston said.

In Washington, the Roosevelt students performed a musical short called "Frederick," which celebrates the life of escaped slave, abolitionist, and writer Frederick Douglass in the hip-hop style of "Hamilton." "You can be the difference, be the change," is a line they deliver in unison.

A different group of students, from Roosevelt, Lancaster, MLK, and Sherman, performed "Frederick" in 2018 in Washington, the first and only other Kennedy Center performance by MPS students before the pandemic interrupted the Turnaround Arts showcase. Leveston wrote "Frederick" and produced it with Roosevelt's orchestra teacher at the time.

At the students' rehearsal in early March at Roosevelt, music instructor Brandite Reed guided them. She looked delighted as the students' voices harmonized and rose. Reed noted that, incredibly, it was the troupe's first time singing the piece on stage. Earlier, they had learned their parts and practiced their blocking — synchronizing their movements around the stage.

The Kennedy Center performance, before an audience of 1,100, is a highlight in a busy year for MPS students in the Turnaround Arts program:

An acting troupe from Washington, D.C.," visited Roosevelt Middle School of the Arts and Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., School. The troupe specializes in playback theater, which gets the audience involved in the performance. The troupe also performed for the school district's Principal Leadership Institute in February.

Roosevelt's multifaceted black history concert, including a drumline, returned to the stage for the first time since the pandemic began.

Next, students will rehearse for plays that cap the school year at Roosevelt, Sherman, Lancaster, and MLK schools. The plays are open to the public.

The Black History concert at Roosevelt on March 1, "African Americans and the Arts," featured 16 acts that included African dance, singing, and choreography by students, taking place against projected backdrops of legendary performers such as Tina Turner. The concert was a lesson in history and popular culture, as well.

In the middle of it was an exhilarating drumline performance. The students, instructed and led by Anthony Hibbler of the Paradigm Entertainment Co., flooded down the aisles of the auditorium while playing their drums and cymbals. They performed their choreographed number at the front of the hall, punctuated with high kicks and fancy stick work.

About 65 students auditioned for the concert, and

42 were selected to perform. Roosevelt's Arts Leadership Team chose the musical and dance numbers, considering artists who would be familiar to the students and artists they should be familiar with, to further make it a learning experience.

"It was exciting to see the number of students who were taking part," especially because the concert hadn't been held since before the pandemic, Leveston said. That meant it was a new experience for every student there.

For students like those at Roosevelt Middle School of the Arts, the arts are a way to express themselves, and more.

"The idea behind the (Turnaround Arts) program is to culturally change how these schools utilize the arts," Leveston said. That is, to incorporate the arts throughout. Even for children who have no interest in stage programming, for instance, they still are exposed to the arts and visual thinking, which helps them understand complex topics.

"What I found is, through the stage and the opportunity the arts present, the students are able to set standards for themselves that apply to the classroom" and beyond, Leveston said. The skills they learn might translate to writing an essay, for example.

Participating in the arts "makes the non-arts stuff more approachable," he added. A student might think, "I was able to memorize my lines and perform on stage, so I can give that report." That empowerment, Leveston said, is the most significant outgrowth he's seen from arts education.

Three types of pain that could mean irritable bowel syndrome (IBS)

As many as 60-million people – that's 20 percent of Americans – deal with irritable bowel syndrome (IBS).

IBS is a chronic condition that affects the lower gastrointestinal tract. It also causes the colon to be irritable and spastic, which causes the abdominal discomfort associated with changes in the consistency and/or frequency of bowel movements.

The causes of IBS are not fully known, but are believed to be a result of a combination of factors, including bacterial imbalance, food allergies and parasites. IBS has three subcategories:

- pain associated with diarrhea;
- pain associated with constipation;
- pain and diarrhea alternating with constipation

How does IBS affect people? People who suffer from IBS are plagued by uncomfortable and disabling symptoms like abdominal pain (the most commonly reported), bloating, and both diar-



rhea and constipation.

These symptoms cause them to be affected in their daily life and they also miss approximately twice as many work days per year as non-sufferers. They also report more fatigue, lack of energy, and also decreased physical functioning, and overall general health.

Treating IBS

Although there are plenty of treatments for IBS, many do not address the underlying causes of the digestive system.

The lining of the colon, or the gut, is affected in IBS and when it breaks down it can cause "leaky gut" syndrome that eventually exposes the immune system to bacteria. This lining can break down from toxic diets, too much sugar, not enough fiber and also stress.

When this happens, the immune system responds and causes changes in the body such as increased allergies, sensitivities, mood disorders, and even depression.

To balance the gut's ecosystem, it must be controlled

and the overgrowth of bacteria must be in balance. This balance will help to resolve bloating and overall symptoms of IBS by clearing out the overgrowth of bacteria.

The best way to attack these symptoms is to repopulate your digestive tract with good bacteria. Probiotics are a great way to accomplish this, as they help to further normalize gut function.

Probiotics are live microorganisms that can be therapeutic for gastrointestinal diseases such as IBS. They help the bowel by suppressing the growth of bad bacteria, improving the leaky gut, and helping alter the immune system. The use of probiotics may also improve bowel motility.

You can also repopulate your digestive tract with good bacteria by increasing fiber and decreasing sugar in your diet. The soluble fiber in vegetables and fruit adds healthy bulk to the diet. Another beneficial option is taking digestive enzymes with meals to help break down

food faster as the gut heals.

Other nutrients that can help heal the lining of the gut include fish oil and the fatty acid Gamma linolenic acid (GLA) commonly found in evening primrose oil, zinc, vitamin A, and glutamine.

Make sure to also drink plenty of water, exercise regularly and decrease your alcohol intake to promote regularity and minimize your IBS symptoms.

If you suspect that you may have IBS, consult with your doctor so they can do a careful physical examination with a complete history and an initial evaluation with lab work. For some patients, this may mean a colonoscopy if there is a family history of colon cancer.

Visiting your doctor as well as eliminating certain foods to treat the underlying causes of IBS can dramatically improve your health and help you overcome your digestive problems.

How diverse clinical trials can advance black health

Clinical trials are one of the foundations of modern medicine. Data from clinical trials provides insights on how people are likely to respond to a treatment, which helps doctors understand when to use the treatment, how to advise patients who may receive it and what outcomes to expect from it.

"If we don't have adequate representation in the trial, we can't be sure how the treatment will affect people from different backgrounds," said Zul Surani, associate director of Community Outreach and Engagement at the Cancer Research Center for Health Equity at Cedars-Sinai Cancer in Los Angeles.

"There are historically marginalized communities all around us. Striving for equity means ensuring all persons get quality care. Clinical trials are a major part of that, as they can hold the key to a healthier future."

Why diversity matters in clinical trials

As valuable as clinical trials are, they have long been limited by one shortcoming: a lack of ethnic, racial, sex and gender diversity. Participants have been mostly white, heterosexual males.

"If we're testing treatments almost only on white males, we're left with big gaps in knowledge," said Dr. Robert Haile, director of the Cancer Research Center for Health Equity. "Genetics, environmental factors, lifestyle, gen-

der and ethnic origin may all influence how individuals react to a drug."

Study sponsors look for what's called "generalizability." This is when a trial is run with so many participants that if the drug works for most of them, researchers can assume it'll work for most of the general population, too. That's harder to determine if your trial volunteers don't represent the whole community. For example, black patients often need a different dose of drugs that treat asthma, blood pressure or heart disease than non-Hispanic whites, Asians or Hispanics do. Sometimes they need a different drug altogether.

"If we're testing treatments almost only on white males, we're left with big gaps in knowledge," said Dr. Robert Haile, director of the Cancer Research Center for Health Equity. "Genetics, environmental factors, lifestyle, gender and ethnic origin may all influence how individuals react to a drug."

"For that reason, Surani, Dr. Haile and the rest of their team at the Cancer Research Center for Health Equity are committed to making sure more people know about clinical trials and understand their benefits.

"It's always difficult to recruit large numbers of volunteers for clinical trials," said Surani. "It's even harder to recruit volunteers from groups that are underrepresented in



clinical trials because of limited access or mistrust."

For example, many study sponsors recruit patients from large academic medical centers, but the patient populations at those centers don't necessarily represent the general population in the surrounding communities. Underrepresented groups may lack insurance and stay away from these medical centers because they think they can't get treated there. Undocumented persons may be worried about the consequences of registering at a hospital.

"We also see mistrust of the healthcare system in the LGBTQIA+ community because many of those individuals have had bad experiences with it," said Surani. "A few important cancer screenings also are framed in historically gendered language, and LGBTQIA+ individuals don't necessarily feel included in those conventional framings."

A tailored outreach strategy

Recognizing the unique concerns of LGBTQIA+ patients, Surani and Dr. Haile are involved in plans for a dedicated LGBTQIA+

health center at Cedars-Sinai. However, there is no one-size-fits-all solution to increasing the participation of underrepresented groups in clinical trials.

"We have to tailor our approach to each individual community," said Dr. Haile.

That includes working with dedicated outreach professionals as well as organizations that are trusted by the local community and serve as hubs for it, such as churches, barber shops, schools or non-profit groups.

"We've seen the impact it makes," said Surani. "Korean Americans have noticeably low rates of breast cancer screening. Working with local Korean churches and getting their input on research protocols, we've been able to bring this lifesaving preventive service to more people."

Why community partners matter

Another success story involves the center's work with Federally Qualified Health Centers (FQHCs). These community-based providers receive federal funding to offer primary care in underserved areas.

South Los Angeles has a higher incidence of late-stage lung cancer diagnosis than any other part of Los Angeles County. FQHCs now bring services to 40,000 individuals in the black community in South L.A.

"By being present and working with L.A.'s diverse communities, we develop trusting relationships with the healthcare system and open the door for discussions about the importance of joining clinical trials," said Surani.

An optimistic outlook on the future of clinical trials

Cedars-Sinai's efforts are part of a nationwide movement to broaden clinical trial participation, a challenge long recognized by health agencies. In 1993, the National Institutes of Health (NIH) adopted a policy requiring all federal grants for clinical research to include women and marginalized individuals. The US Food and Drug Administration (FDA) later introduced policies to analyze the barriers for—and increase participation among—more diverse participants.

While the challenge persists, Surani and Dr. Haile are optimistic. They agree that there's already been a positive change and that there's more awareness than ever about the importance of diversity in clinical trials. And greater awareness means more progress is on the horizon.

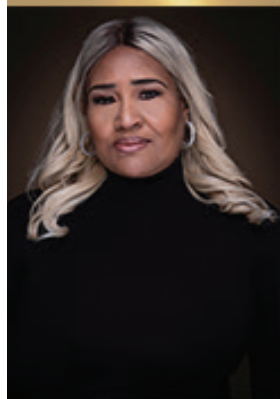

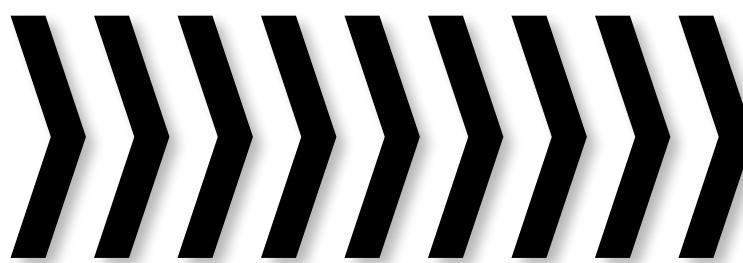

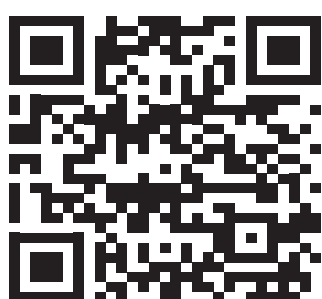
