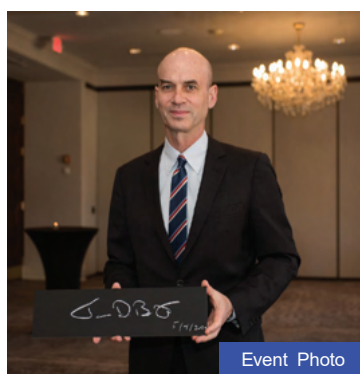

Rallies held around Wisconsin as state Supreme Court revisits ban on ballot drop boxes

The five rallies in support of ballot drop boxes are taking place in Milwaukee, Green Bay, Madison, Wausau and Eau Claire

The Wisconsin Supreme Court is hearing oral arguments Monday, May 13, 2024 regarding a case that revisits the 2022 decision to ban ballot drop boxes. As the justices listen in court, rallies are mobilizing around the state in support of the boxes.

In all, five rallies are happening across Wisconsin, in Milwaukee, Green Bay, Madison, Wausau and Eau Claire. Those attending want the Supreme Court to reinstate ballot drop boxes as an option for voters.

On July 8, 2022, the state's high court, in a 4-to-3 ruling, banned Wisconsin voters from using ballot drop boxes in the state. It was a win for Republicans, who challenged the use after the 2020 election and immense criticism from former President Donald Trump.

In 2020, Milwaukee had 15 secure boxes across the city, many located at libraries like the Center Street Library, where Monday's Milwaukee rally was held. The boxes were a place where voters could drop absentee ballots, and each one was monitored by a video camera.

The voting rights advocates demonstrating Monday at rallies say working Wisconsinites should be able to vote easily and safely. They go on

to say that making it harder to vote is out of touch with Wisconsin values.

"Our democracy is strong when all voters can cast their ballots," said the Rev. Mose Fuller, of Souls to the Polls. "Ballot drop boxes provide a safe and secure option for our hardworking neighbors to participate in the democratic process. Whether you are a single parent who can't make it to the polls in person, a hard-working health care worker who is working long hours and can't make it to the polls, you should be able to drop your ballot."

Attorneys for the Republican National Committee and Wisconsin Republican Party say changing the ruling now would unleash a new wave of legal challenges.

Supporters of the boxes feel their removal is just a tactic to make it harder for Wis-

consinites to vote.

"Our democracy is so much stronger when all voters, like I say, they can cast their ballots," said Mandela Barnes of Power to the Polls. "Those drop boxes provide a safe and secure option for hard-working people to be able to participate in the democratic process."

Only oral arguments are happening in this case on Monday. No decision will be made by the justices that day, but a decision can be expected before the November 2024 election.

If the State Supreme Court does decide to reinstate ballot drop boxes, many of them in Milwaukee will be ready to go. Most are still in place in front of municipal buildings and other locations, only locked up and covered with a tarp since the ruling in 2022.

University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee and protesters agree to end encampment

Protesters at the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee will take down a pro-Palestinian encampment that had stood for two weeks under an agreement reached with the school, university officials said in a statement on Sunday, May 12, 2024. The encampment, believed to be the last one standing at a Wisconsin college, will be gone by Tuesday, May 14, they said.

School officials had allowed the encampment to stand and occupy a broad patch of lawn between Mitchell Hall and a busy thoroughfare on the campus's southern boundary, choosing not to call in the police. That approach differed from one at the University of Wisconsin-Madison, where administrators in early May called in the police to break down the tents after negotiations failed. After the initial crackdown failed to end the encampment,

Wisconsin-Madison later came to an agreement with protesters to break down the camp voluntarily before commencement ceremonies over the weekend.

Mark Mone, the chancellor of Wisconsin-Milwaukee, said in a statement last Wednesday that the university had exercised "the widest possible amount of patience and restraint." But he also indicated that patience had nearly run out, and warned that the school might take action.

Under the agreement with the group of protesters, known as the UWM Popular University for Palestine Coalition, the university pledged to join calls for a cease-fire between Israel and Hamas; denounce the destruction by Israeli forces of schools and universities in Gaza; and meet with protest leaders over their concerns about university investments.

Appreciating teachers

May 6-10 was Teacher Appreciation Week this year, but in an era of headlines and concern about burnout and stress, I join many others who believe teachers should be applauded and deeply appreciated all year long. We know teachers are not sufficiently valued in our society if we measure their worth by money—yet after parents, teachers are probably the greatest influencers and molders of children's futures. For many teachers and educators, it is not money that keeps them in this profession, but better salaries would still enable many more qualified people to enter and remain in it. We must do much more to recognize the importance of teaching in our nation and celebrate the best educators in a very visible way. Being the kind of educator who consistently nurtures, respects, and inspires the students in their care is a special calling, and we all owe an immense debt of gratitude to every professional who answers this call.

How many of us still have wonderful memories about



our own favorite teachers? When I was a child my teachers joined our parents and other community members in weaving a seamless safety net of caring for children, and provided buffers of love and encouragement that helped combat the negative influences of segregated small-town southern life. They were role models who didn't equate book smarts with common sense or goodness, but always stressed the importance of education as a means to help improve the lives of others and leave our community and world better than we found it. They were also dedicated to work-

ing with children and young adults to set high standards and made clear their own belief that every student could achieve at high levels. All young people need adults who believe in them and expect them to achieve, who love them, and whom they love so much that they live up to their expectations of success. I wish for these kinds of teachers for every student.

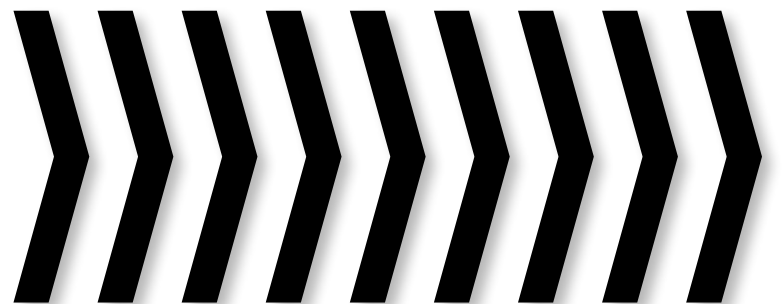

Meet Mary Hoehne: Helping make Granville a better place

You've been to the Granville Blues Fest and had a fabulous time. You've even driven through the vast manufacturing corridor in Granville. And perhaps you know a business owner interested in setting up shop in the Granville Connection. However, do you know about the hard-working woman behind the scenes to keep all of this movement going in Granville? That energetic woman is Mary Hoehne, Executive Director of the Granville Business Improvement District (BID).

"I was the director of the Granville-Brown Deer Chamber, and we knew that we didn't have any real resources or opportunity to make any difference in the community. We just didn't

have any money and we were limited in the number of people who could join the Chamber with the mix of businesses we had in the area," Mary said. "So, I was getting my degree in Urban Studies at the time and I happened to know about Business Improvement Districts. After doing my research, I told my board, 'Hey let's form a BID!' They totally trusted me, so we started the process with the city and within six months, we had formed the Granville BID."

That was 11 years ago. The four boundaries of Granville are County Line Road south to Good Hope Road, 95th street East to Brown Deer Road at 68th or 60th Streets and within these boundaries live the most diverse young

families alongside older residents from African American, Laotian, European, and Hispanic backgrounds.

According to Mary, the Granville area is important to her because Granville was neglected for so long. Once the Northridge Mall started going in the wrong direction and the commercial corridor began getting neglected, to the point where the grass wasn't even getting cut, the area was in a downward turn, businesses were leaving in very large numbers, even the industrial base was starting to move out to the suburbs and they were seeing basically an area that was once the pinnacle of Milwaukee turning in the wrong direction. The Chamber at the time wanted to stop the bleeding, only, they didn't have money to do that. So the Chamber formed the Business Improvement District, which is a tax assessment on the commercial property owners, and that gave the Granville BID the resources to begin a turnaround.

Mary explained, "It takes a very long time to turn around an entire area. We started with cutting the grass, we started picking up the litter in the area, we started marketing the area, we had the area patrolled more by the District 4 police station and then eventually we hired a security company so that residents, visitors, and business owners felt more secure. The scope was a lot larger than most people knew at the time. The perception of crime that people had said had happened over 20 years ago, however crime in the Granville area was a lot lower than most areas in Milwaukee. We started getting busy and doing events to try to get people to come up to Granville and experience first hand that it's a safe area which you'll see once you come."

There's so much happening in Granville and it's all because of the Granville BID! The Blues Fest started out as one day with only 50 people and has now grown to three days and hundreds

of people from all over. And this year Blues Fest is June 14, 15, and 16 under the big tent on Brown Deer Road. You can shop for gifts, listen to amazing, traditional, old school blues performers for free, purchase food and drink by many local chefs. Harvest Fest takes place on September 14 and 15, and it has a car show, music, karaoke for teens, fun activities for children, drive-in movies, dancing, and of course, our vendors. The Granville BID is at last showing off the "Granville Connection" in the building located at 8633 W. Brown Deer Road during Blues Fest. If you're an entrepreneur looking for a stable place to start your retail store, this is the perfect opportunity to open on Fridays, Saturdays, and Sundays.

According to Mary, Granville also has jobs, jobs, and more jobs in the modern Industrial corridor that has 95 companies. In fact, companies such as Snap On Tools, Hy-Drite Chemical, Marking Services - two locations, Hellerman Tyton, and Douglas Dynamics Western Snowplow all call Granville their home. "Big businesses really are the heart and soul of our Granville BID and their support in turn allows us to do all the things I've mentioned. Big business really funds the whole community," Mary said.

And speaking of BIG, Mary asks you to give your input on the City of Milwaukee's website regarding the biggest opportunity Granville has: the 800k square feet at Northridge Mall. In the fall of 2025, the ball drops and is tearing down the building. The Granville BID will be doing market research and studies to see what the people want, what the businesses want, and what the region wants for the next 20-30 years.

These elementary educators share 314 years of experience and gratitude

Teacher Appreciation Week spans several days in May, yet a teacher's impact can last a lifetime. Nationally, the average length of service for one teacher at one school is eight years.

The numbers look different at Byron Kilbourn Elementary School, a K3-5 school on Milwaukee's northwest side. Eleven Kilbourn teachers have more than 300 years of combined teaching experience, most of this accumulated at Kilbourn.

Sharon Redel and Sherise Randolph are K3 Head Start teachers with 64 years of experience between them, 50 at Kilbourn. They know how to help 3-year-old students develop pre-literacy skills, practice letter and number recognition, and make the transition to full-day school so they are ready for K4.

They also know the neighborhood, their students' families, and who they can rely on through decades of teaching.

"Each other," says Redel, with 37 years' teaching experience. "Ms. Randolph and I plan together, during students' rest time."

"We come together for kids every day and that's all that matters," said Randolph, who has been teaching 27 years. "We're not perfect but we're all here together."

"Just like a family!" added another Kilbourn colleague.

Ask any of the school's veteran teachers what brings them back to Kilbourn year after year, decade after decade, and they say the same thing — even when they're not crowded in one room for a recent Teacher Apprecia-

tion Week photo.

"Commitment to education, to this school, to this community," said 4th-grade teacher Stephanie Baade, with 33 years' experience. "We want to be at this school, in this neighborhood, serving not just students but multiple generations of families."

"We are a staff committed to students and each other, and we get along really well," added Redel, who also attributes her teaching tenure to being a proud Milwaukee Public Schools graduate and a longtime member and leader of the Milwaukee Teachers' Education Association.

Jason Galien grew up in the nearby Westlawn public housing project. He won a third-grade reading challenge as a Kilbourn student in the 1970s (he read 22 books and

won a softball). Now he is Principal Galien.

"I feel so secure knowing that I'm around folks who understand the dynamic of children, who understand the craft of teaching," he says.

Rozlind Davis has "only" 32 years at Kilbourn, where she's the parent coordinator. Before that, she volunteered for two years at the school she and her two oldest daughters all attended.

"Everybody was so welcoming to me then," she said. "Now, I tell new parents how welcoming we are. Everybody is important at Kilbourn: students, staff, families."

The K3-5 school serves many families from its surrounding neighborhood.

"Graduates love coming back here," said Baade. "It is good for the soul to see students' success later in life. It means a lot."

After 30.7 years at Kilbourn, second-grade teacher Christine LaMarre is set to retire.

Friendships with Kilbourn colleagues have been a constant, she says. Creating classroom routines and sharing a love for reading while teaching students how to read are standout strategies. Favorite classroom books include "The Giving Tree," by Shel Silverstein, and the "Goosebumps" series, by R.L. Stine.

"It's fun to teach children how to express feelings while they're reading," LaMarre said. "It really helps them learn."

Alida Harris is the "new" veteran teacher in the building, with 20 years in MPS and one year at Kilbourn. She assigned a planting project to her 1st and 2nd graders. What happened next was science, and Kilbourn, in action.

"After one week, nothing was growing. 'Science is like that. Science doesn't always work out and you've got to keep trying,' is what I told my students."

A Kilbourn colleague stepped in, suggesting sunflower seeds instead of beans. It worked.

Galien said he appreciates teachers' dedication to tried and true teaching practices, as well as their openness to new ways of teaching.

"They are early adopters," he said.

After five years at Kilbourn and 24 in MPS, 5th-grade teacher Anthony McDaniels is learning Project Lead The Way (PLTW) STEM curriculum. The school opens a pilot PLTW lab in fall 2024.

"Kids do very well with hands-on learning," he explained. "Many schools are trying to integrate STEM because this enhances a student's chance of succeeding."

Sherita Kostuck relies more on pencil and paper than technology in her K5 classroom. After 34 years at Kilbourn, she described herself as a "stickler for printing."

"I don't think successful strategies wear out," Kostuck said.

Relationship-building is another reliable strategy in her teaching toolbox.

"The secret to my tenure is the relationships I have with my students and their parents, past and present," Kostuck said. "The relationships we have here at Kilbourn with our staff are just like an extended family. We support each other not only at school, but we have relationships away from school, as well."

During Teacher Appreciation Week, school support teacher Tiffany Dupree-Cain, 28 years with MPS and three at Kilbourn, asked colleagues about the best way to celebrate, and be celebrated.

She summarized their timeless advice on one tiny pink sticky note: "Ultimately, teachers want to be valued, appreciated, heard, and supported!"

Medical College of WI Cancer Center hosts first-ever 'Care for the Cancer Caregiver' event

This can be hard to maintain for a long time, and it's not good for one's health. The stress can have both physical and psychological affects. That is why the Medical College of Wisconsin (MCW) Cancer Center and the American Cancer Society are partnering to provide the tools caregivers need to care for themselves as their loved one. "Care for the Cancer Caregiver-Rejuvenation, Community and Resources" is a unique event that not only celebrates cancer caregivers but offer opportunities to be nurtured and also provide them with the skills and resources to help themselves, so that they can better help their loved ones.

How Not to Drown: A Real Conversation About Caregiving

This session is intended to serve as a life preserver, teaching strategies for restructuring your thinking and providing you with a coping skills toolkit. This session will be co-led by University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee Associate Professor and Froedtert Hospital Nurse Scientist Natalie McAndrew, PhD, RN, ACNS-BC, CCRN-K and family caregiver Ellie Engelbrecht.

The day will conclude with a group activity to build a network of new supportive relationships and explore shared resources, based on the work of Dr. Paula C. Lowe, author of "Care Pooling – How to Get the Help You Need to Care for the Ones You Love."



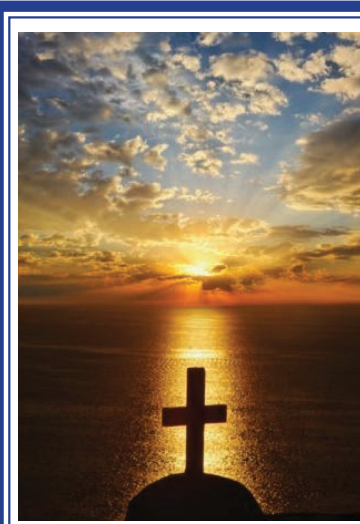
