Word of Hope Ministries host 6th graduation for Diverse Business Program

On Saturday, April 6, 2024, Word of Hope Ministries held its "Diverse Business Summit and Co-Hort 6 Graduation" at the Four Points by Sheraton Milwaukee North Shore, 8900 N. Kildeer Ct. There were various speakers who provided resources and information to the small businesses/graduates. It was also an opportunity for the small businesses to practice networking and to become comfortable talking about their business. Department of Neighborhood Services began inspecting public housing buildings

This comes after public housing tenants accused the Housing Authority of the City of Milwaukee of not responding to complaints

After years of complaints of rodents, roaches and mold city inspectors with the Department of Neighborhood Services (DNS) began inspecting Housing Authority-owned buildings Monday, May 6, 2024.

Public housing tenants, like Carmella Holloway, worked with advocacy organization and nonprofit Common Ground to bring the change.

Holloway has lived at College Court near 35th and Highland for 17 years.

"When I first got here it was such a lovely place. Now it's gone to hell," Holloway said.

Holloway said that for at least three years, she has been dealing with a bed bug infestation in her apartment. The bugs are in her bedsheets, in her tub and crawling on the floor.

"They were in my ear. They crawled in my ear during the process of me sleeping at night," Holloway said. "I haven't been to sleep for like three or four weeks. I haven't



been asleep at all, even in the daytime. I'm a walking time bomb."

College Court is managed by the Housing Authority of the City of Milwaukee (HACM).

She's one of multiple tenants there, and in Housing Authority buildings across the city, complaining of unsafe and unsanitary living conditions.

"They ain't doing nothing. Nothing at all," Holloway said about her apartment managers.

For privately owned rental properties in the city, inspectors from the DNS respond to tenant complaints.

But for decades, a legal gray area left DNS without the ability to do the same for public, Housing Authority properties. Tenants told Milwaukee Common Council members that any complaints they made to DNS would just be referred back to the Housing Authority.

"If I'm a tenant and I have concerns and they're (HACM) not fixing it, that's

it. I have nobody to call, no third party to help me," said Kevin Solomon, an organizer with Common Ground.

For more than one year, Common Ground has organized with tenants and lobbied the Common Council to change city policy so that DNS would have oversight over the Housing Authority.

In September 2023, the Common Council passed an ordinance to give DNS that authority.

"This is a first step," Solomon said.

In a news release last week DNS said they have hired two inspectors to cover Housing Authority properties. The HACM manages more than 4,000 units across the city. Most of their tenants are low-income, elderly and/or disabled.

A DNS spokesperson said inspections started Monday, May 6, 2024. DNS said public housing tenants should first contact their property management team about any complaints. However,

if management is unresponsive, tenants can call (414) 286-CITY or submit a complaint online.

In a statement to WISN 12 News, a HACM spokesperson said the Housing Authority supports the new ordinance.

"HACM supports the ordinance that gives the City of Milwaukee's Department of Neighborhood Services (DNS) the authority to inspect HACM properties and enforce all building code matters under DNS jurisdiction. HACM is committed to providing safe, well-maintained homes for our residents. We view the ordinance as an additional tool to bolster our established processes and complement existing investor and federal inspection requirements. The most efficient and timely method for residents to have their issues addressed remains to be by contacting their property manager."

Mayor Johnson replaces Milwaukee's election chief 6 months before 2024 election

Announces four additional new heads for leadership positions

Milwaukee Mayor Cavalier Johnson on Monday, May 6, 2024, announced several changes and additions to the leadership staff in his administration.



According to a news release, Paulina Gutiérrez was nominated to serve as the Executive Director of Milwaukee's Election Commission. In that role, Gutiérrez will oversee the staff and operations of the Election Commission. For more than a year, she has held the position of Deputy Director in that department.

"Paulina's integrity and capabilities are ideally suited to this position. She will lead the office at an important juncture when public scrutiny of the work of the department will be extremely high," Mayor Johnson said. "I have confidence in her, and I will make certain the department has the resources it needs to fulfill its duties."

Gutiérrez has held management positions previously in state and local government, according to the release. She is a graduate of Alverno College and earned a Master of Arts degree from Marquette University.

Mayor Johnson named **Jim Bohl** to serve as city Innovation Director. In this new position, Bohl will lead administration efforts to improve efficiency, streamline operations, and identify opportu-

nities to work collaboratively with other agencies and governments. Bohl, a former elected city official, previously held senior positions in the Johnson administration including, most recently, Legislative Liaison Director.

Veronica Rudychev will return to Milwaukee city government as the mayor's nominee to be Labor Negotiator. Rudychev previously served at the Milwaukee Police Budget and Administration Manager, and, most recently as Milwaukee County's Park's Finance Manager. She earned a master's degree in public administration from the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee and has held leadership roles in both the public and private sectors. Rudychev worked as a Mequon firefighter and was the union treasurer during her service there.

Mayor Johnson, according to the release, intends to re-nominate other cabinet officials who have served in positions over the past two years, including the heads of larger departments such as public works, health, neighborhood services, city development and the library.

The newly nominated officials at elections, intergovernmental relations, and labor negotiations will require Milwaukee Common Council confirmation, as will most of the re-appointed department heads.

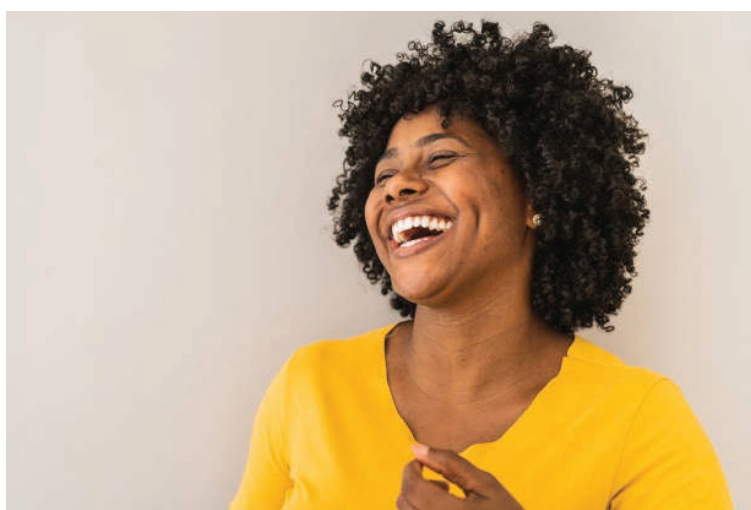





MPS teacher selected as 2024 State Advocate for Adult Education Fellowship

Ernice Brown, a Milwaukee Public Schools (MPS) educator with 20 years' experience, has been selected as the 2024 State Advocate for Adult Education Fellowship. For the next year, the Coalition on Adult Education will train her to become a lobby-

ist, someone who works with the media, policymakers and the community to advocate for change benefiting adult learners and adult education programs.

Ernice, a Milwaukee native who graduated from Milwaukee Trade and Technical High school, said she grew up with a passion for reading and she assumed that pretty much every adult could read. It wasn't until after she became a Milwaukee Public Schools educator about 20 years ago, that she realized that wasn't true.

"A mother came to register her five-year-old daughter for school my first year," she said. "We were going to teach her child to read and it was obvious to me that this poor mother was not able to complete the application form to enroll her daughter without assistance."

Ernice said her views on the importance of providing more opportunities for adult learners crystalized during the past four years that she has served as an alternative educator teaching incarcerated youth age 16-21 at the Milwaukee County Jail. Currently she said she is unable to enroll incarcerated youth who wish to pursue their high school equivalency diploma unless that person is capable of reading at the



sixth-grade level.

"There are large areas of the country where if you cannot read, you cannot get a diploma," she said. "My cause is to push for teaching reading beyond third grade. Too

many students are unable to read for meaning by the end of third grade. Most of those students will just get left further and further behind. It should as no surprise when some of them wind up incarcerated."

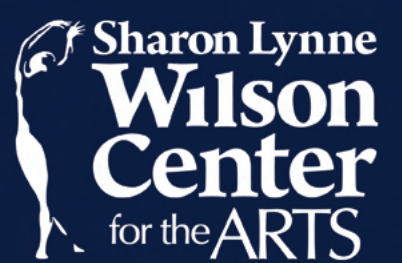

- Each year, approximately 800,000 people in the U.S. suffer a stroke.

- Recognizing the stroke warning signs and calling 911 immediately may make the difference between a strong recovery or long-term disability, survival or death.

- High blood pressure is the leading cause and controllable risk factor for stroke and heart disease. It's important to know your numbers and work with a health care professional to control levels and manage risks.

- Having a stroke puts you at higher risk for a second one. However, there are things you can do to re-

duce your risk, starting with identifying what caused your stroke and uncovering all of your personal risk factors.

Here are 3 ways you can act now to beat stroke:

1. Learn how to spot a stroke F.A.S.T. If you see Face drooping, Arm weakness or Speech difficulty, it's Time to call 911.

2. Know your blood pressure numbers and keep them in a healthy range. High blood pressure is a leading cause and controllable risk factor for stroke and heart disease. Lowering your blood pressure reduces your risk of stroke.

3. Prevent another stroke – Be a bold advocate for yourself by talking to your doctor about managing risk factors to help prevent a second stroke.

05 Key Facts About Stroke

FACT #1: stroke kills brain cells
Stroke happens when a clot or rupture interrupts blood flow to the brain. Without oxygen-rich blood, brain cells die.

FACT #2: types of stroke
Ischemic caused by a clot, Hemorrhagic caused by a rupture and Transient Ischemic Attack (TIA) or "warning stroke" caused by a temporary blockage.

FACT #3: about one in four stroke survivors is at risk for another
Fortunately, up to 80 percent of second clot-related strokes may be preventable.

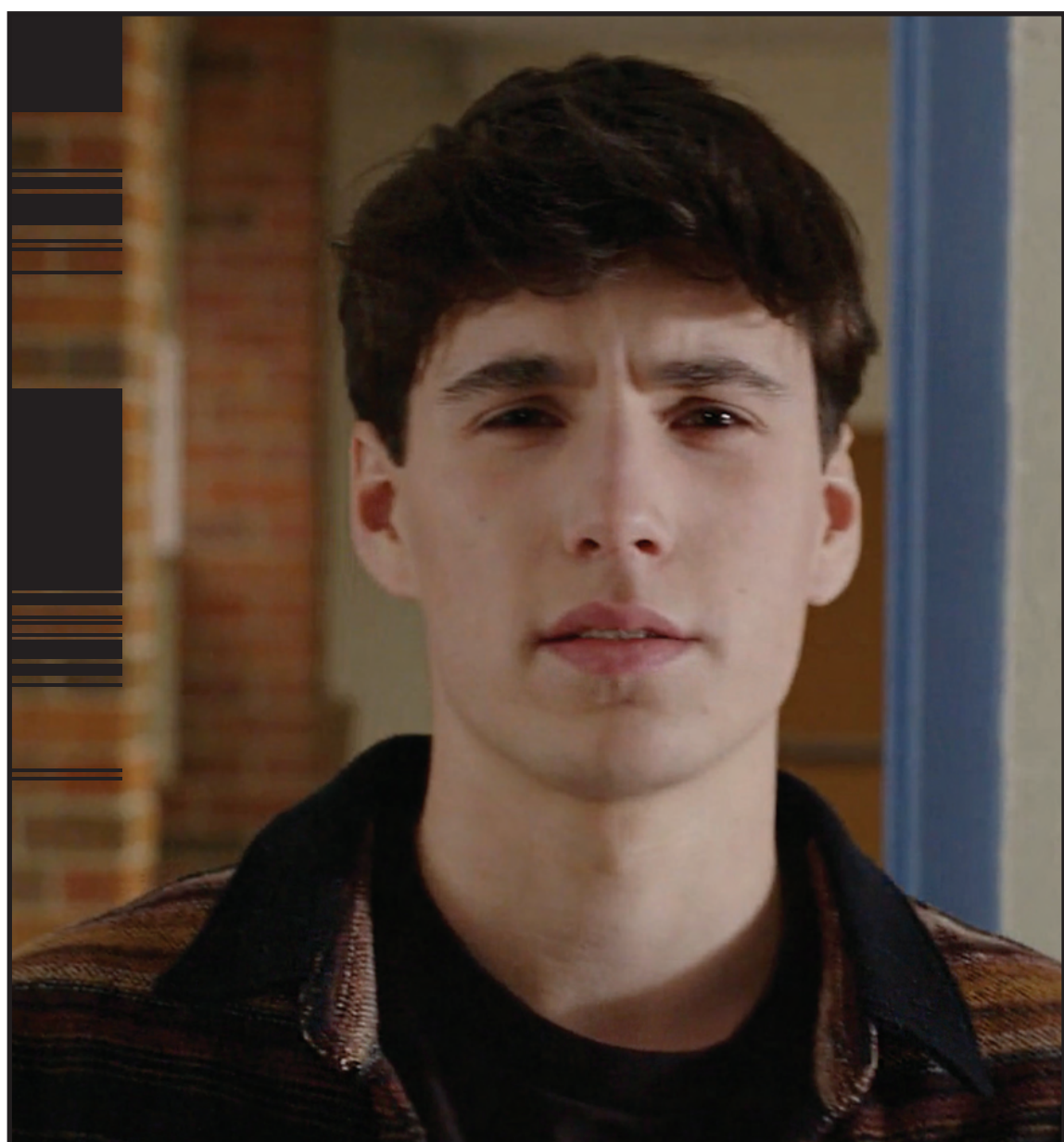

Had a stroke? Work with your doctor to identify the cause and create a plan to prevent another. A stroke happens when normal blood flow in the brain is interrupted. When parts of the brain don't get the oxygen-rich blood they need, those cells die. Quick identification and treatment of stroke equals a higher chance of survival and recovery. Having a stroke puts you at a higher risk for a second one. There are things you can do to reduce your risk, starting with identifying what caused your stroke and uncovering your personal risk factors.

A stroke can happen to anyone at any time. However, the burden and risk of stroke is higher among Black and Hispanic adults in the U.S. This is in part due to unmanaged risk factors including high blood pressure, obesity and diabetes.

A large majority of strokes can be prevented through education and lifestyle changes such as moving more, eating smart and managing conditions like atrial fibrillation (AFib) and high blood pressure.

This American Stroke Month, be a bold advocate for yourself and others by learning the signs of a stroke and talking to your health care team to manage your risk factors. Stroke is an emergency. If someone is having a stroke, they must get medical attention right away.

Spot a stroke F.A.S.T.:
✓ **Face drooping** - Does one side of the face droop or is it numb? Ask the person to smile. Is the person's smile uneven?
✓ **Arm weakness** - Is one arm weak or numb? Ask the person to raise both arms. Does one arm drift downward?
✓ **Speech difficulty** - Is speech slurred? Is the person unable to speak or hard to understand? Ask the person to repeat a simple sentence, like "The sky is blue."

✓ **Time to call 911** - If someone shows any of these symptoms, even if the symptoms go away, call 911 and get to a hospital immediately. Check the time so you'll know when the first symptoms appeared.

Test your knowledge and skills with the F.A.S.T. Experience, a digital series of games and activities designed to educate users on what the warning signs of a stroke look, feel and/or sound like.

Muffin Batter:

- 2 cups all-purpose flour
- 1/2 cup unsweetened cocoa powder
- 1 teaspoon baking soda
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 1 package (10 ounces) mini semi-sweet chocolate chips
- 2 large eggs
- 1/2 cup C&H Light Brown Sugar, packed
- 1/2 cup C&H Granulated Sugar
- 3/4 cup sour cream
- 1/2 cup vegetable oil
- 1/2 cup whole milk

- 1/2 teaspoon instant espresso (optional)

Preheat oven to 350 F. Line mini muffin pan with mini cupcake liners.

In large mixing bowl, use whisk to combine flour, cocoa powder, baking soda and salt. Add chocolate chips and stir to ensure chocolate chips are coated in flour mixture.

In separate large mixing bowl, use wire whisk to whisk eggs and sugars until ingredients are combined and sugars are dissolved. Add sour cream, oil and milk. Whisk again to combine. If using espresso powder, add to vanilla then add to wet ingredients. Whisk vanilla espresso mixture into other liquid ingredients.

Pour liquid ingredients on top of dry ingredients. Using rubber spatula, mix until just combined, being careful to not overmix. Batter should be thick and shiny. Using tablespoon or two spoons, spoon muffin batter into liners. Batter should be filled almost to top of each liner. Top each muffin with flaked sea salt before baking, if desired.

Bake muffins on center rack 6 minutes. Rotate pan and bake 6 minutes, or until toothpick inserted in muffin comes out clean. Once muffins finish baking, place muffin pan on cooling rack to cool completely.

- 2 tablespoons brown sugar
- 2 teaspoons vanilla extract
- 1 teaspoon cinnamon
- 1/4 teaspoon nutmeg
- 1/4 teaspoon sea salt
- maple syrup, for serving

Topping:

- 2 tablespoons unsalted butter or coconut oil, melted
- 2 tablespoons brown sugar
- 1/2 cup chopped pecans
- 1 cup frozen strawberries
- 1 cup frozen blueberries
- confectioners' sugar, for dusting

Grease 9-by-13-inch baking dish. Place bread cubes in baking dish. In large bowl, whisk eggs, milk, brown sugar, vanilla, cinnamon, nutmeg and salt. Pour mixture evenly over bread cubes.

If making casserole ahead, cover baking dish and refrigerate overnight. If baking immediately, let stand 30 minutes at room temperature to allow bread to soak up egg mixture.

Preheat oven to 350 F.

To make topping: Drizzle casserole with melted butter and sprinkle with brown sugar and pecans. Top with strawberries and blueberries.

Cover and bake 35 minutes then uncover and bake 10-20 minutes, or until topping is browned and egg mixture has mostly set.

Remove from oven, cover loosely with foil and let stand 10 minutes. Dust with confectioners' sugar. Serve with maple syrup.

In large skillet, heat canola oil over medium heat. Add red onion and red bell pepper; cook 8 minutes. Add black beans and red pepper flakes; cook 3 minutes. Season with salt and pepper, to taste. Transfer to dish.


In medium bowl, whisk eggs and egg whites. Stir in cheese until combined. Heat large skillet over low heat, add egg mixture and scramble 3 minutes, or until cooked through.

Spread sour cream over tortilla. Spread salsa over sour cream. Spoon 1/4 scrambled eggs over salsa. Spoon 1/4 scrambled eggs over bean mixture. Top with diced tomatoes and avocado. Drizzle with hot sauce, if desired. Roll-up burrito. Repeat three times with remaining ingredients and serve.
