Department of Neighborhood Services began inspecting public housing buildings

This comes after public housing tenants accused the Housing Authority of the City of Milwaukee of not responding to complaints

After years of complaints of rodents, roaches and mold city inspectors with the Department of Neighborhood Services (DNS) began inspecting Housing Authority-owned buildings Monday, May 6, 2024.

Public housing tenants, like Carmella Holloway, worked with advocacy organization and nonprofit Common Ground to bring the change.

Holloway has lived at College Court near 35th and

Highland for 17 years.

"When I first got here it was such a lovely place. Now it's gone to hell," Holloway

Holloway said that for at least three years, she has been dealing with a bed bug infestation in her apartment. The bugs are in her bedsheets, in her tub and crawling on the

"They were in my ear. They crawled in my ear during the process of me sleeping at night," Holloway said. "I haven't been to sleep for like three or four weeks. I haven't



been asleep at all, even in the daytime. I'm a walking time

College Court is managed by the Housing Authority of the City of Milwaukee (HACM).

She's one of multiple tenants there, and in Housing Authority buildings across the city, complaining of unsafe and unsanitary living conditions.

"They ain't doing nothing. Nothing at all," Holloway said about her apartment managers.

For privately owned rental properties in the city, inspectors from the DNS respond to tenant complaints.

But for decades, a legal gray area left DNS without the ability to do the same for public, Housing Authority properties. Tenants told Milwaukee Common Council members that any complaints they made to DNS would just be referred back to the Housing Authority.

"If I'm a tenant and I have concerns and they're (HACM) not fixing it, that's it. I have nobody to call, no third party to help me," said Kevin Solomon, an organizer with Common Ground.

For more than one year, Common Ground has organized with tenants and lobbied the Common Council to change city policy so that DNS would have oversight

over the Housing Authority. In September 2023, the Common Council passed an ordinance to give DNS that authority.

"This is a first step," Solomon said.

In a news release last week DNS said they have hired two inspectors to cover Housing Authority properties. The HACM manages more than 4,000 units across the city. Most of their tenants are low-income, elderly and/ or disabled.

A DNS spokesperson said inspections started Monday, May 6, 2024. DNS said public housing tenants should first contact their property management team about any complaints. However,

if management is unresponsive, tenants can call (414) 286-CITY or submit a complaint online.

In a statement to WISN 12 News, a HACM spokesperson said the Housing Authority supports the new or-

"HACM supports the ordinance that gives the City of Milwaukee's Department of Neighborhood Services (DNS) the authority to inspect HACM properties and enforce all building code matters under DNS jurisdiction. HACM is committed to providing safe, well-maintained homes for our residents. We view the ordinance as an additional tool to bolster our established processes and complement existing investor and federal inspection requirements. The most efficient and timely method for residents to have their issues addressed remains to be by contacting their property

Mayor Johnson replaces Milwaukee's election chief 6 months before 2024 election

Announces four additional new heads for leadership positions

Milwaukee Mayor Cavalier Johnson on Monday, May 6, 2024, announced several changes and additions to the leadership staff in his administration.

According to a news release, Paulina Gutiérrez was nominated to serve as the Executive Director of Milwaukee's Election Commission. In that role, Gutiérrez will oversee the staff and operations of the Election Commission. For more than a year, she has held the position of Deputy Director in that department.

"Paulina's integrity and capabilities are ideally suited to this position. She will lead the office at an important juncture when public scrutiny of the work of the department will be extremely high," Mayor Johnson said. "I have confidence in her, and I will make certain the department has the resources it needs to fulfill its duties."

Gutiérrez has held management positions previously in state and local government, according to the release. She is a graduate of Alverno College and earned a Master of Arts degree from Marquette University.

Mayor Johnson named **Jim** Bohl to serve as city Innovation Director. In this new position, Bohl will lead administration efforts to improve efficiency, streamline operations, and identify opportu-



nities to work collaboratively with other agencies and governments. Bohl, a former elected city official, previously held senior positions in the Johnson administration including, most recently, Legislative Liaison Director.

Jordan Primakow is the mayor's nominee to lead Intergovernmental Relations as Legislative Liaison Director. Primakow has been part of the city's lobbying team for four-and-a-half years. He has previously worked in state government and in not-for-profit organizations. He earned a law degree from Michigan State University after completing his undergraduate studies at the University of Wisconsin-Madi-

Khalif Rainey is Mayor Johnson's choice to be Director of the Office of African American Affairs. Most recently, Rainey served as Alderman for the city's Seventh

District starting in 2016. He opted not to run for reelection in 2024. Earlier in his career, Rainey was a Milwaukee County Supervisor, and he served on the staff of Congresswoman Gwen Moore.

Veronica Rudychev will return to Milwaukee city government as the mayor's nominee to be Labor Negotiator. Rudychev previously served at the Milwaukee Police Budget and Administration Manager, and, most recently as Milwaukee County's Park's Finance Manager. She earned a master's degree in public administration from the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee and has held leadership roles in both the public and private sectors. Rudychev worked as a Mequon firefighter and was the union treasurer during her service there.

Mayor Johnson, according to the release, intends to re-nominate other cabinet officials who have served in positions over the past two years, including the heads of larger departments such as public works, health, neighborhood services, city development and the library.

The newly nominated officials at elections, intergovernmental relations, and labor negotiations will require Milwaukee Common Council confirmation, as will most of the re-appointed department heads.

ist, someone who works with the media, policymakers and the community to advocate for change benefiting adult learners and adult education programs.

Ernice, a Milwaukee native who graduated from Milwaukee Trade and Technical High school, said she grew up with a passion for reading and she assumed that pretty much every adult could read. It wasn't until after she became a Milwaukee Public Schools educator about 20 years ago, that she realized that wasn't true.

"A mother came to register her five-year-old daughter for school my first year," she said. "We were going to teach her child to read and it was obvious to me that this poor mother was not able to complete the application form to enroll her daughter without assistance."

Ernice said her views on the importance of providing more opportunities for adult learners crystalized during the past four years that she has served as an alternative educator teaching incarcerated youth age 16-21 at the Milwaukee County Jail. Currently she said she is unable to enroll incarcerated youth who wish to pursue their



sixth-grade level.

"There are large areas of the country where if you cannot read, you cannot get a diploma," she said. "My cause is to push for teaching reading beyond third grade. Too

many students are unable to read for meaning by the end of third grade. Most of those students will just get left further and further behind. It should as no surprise when some of them wind up incarcerated."

Stroke is the fifth-leading cause of death and a leading cause of serious, longterm disability in the United States, despite stroke being largely preventable, treatable and beatable.

According to the American Stroke Association, consider the following:

Each year, approximately 800,000 people in the you at higher risk for a sec-U.S. suffer a stroke.

- Even though some people are at higher risk for stroke, like stroke survivors and people with unmanaged AFib or high blood pressure, anyone can have a stroke at any time.
- Recognizing the stroke warning signs and calling 911 immediately may make the difference between a strong recovery or longterm disability, survival or death.
- High blood pressure is the leading cause and controllable risk factor for stroke and heart disease. It's important to know your numbers and work with a health care professional to control levels and manage risks.
- Having a stroke puts ond one. However, there are things you can do to re-

duce your risk, starting with identifying what caused your stroke and uncovering all of your personal risk factors.

Here are 3 ways you can act now to beat stroke:

- Learn how to spot a stroke F.A.S.T. If you see Face drooping, Arm weakness or Speech difficulty, it's Time to call 911.
- Know your blood pressure numbers and keep them in a healthy range. High blood pressure is a leading cause and controllable risk factor for stroke and heart disease. Lowering your blood pressure reduces your risk of stroke.
- Prevent another stroke – Be a bold advocate for yourself by talking to your doctor about managing risk factors to help prevent a second stroke.



A stroke happens when normal blood flow in the brain is interrupted. When parts of the brain don't get the oxygen-rich blood they need, those cells die. Quick identification and treatment of stroke equals a higher chance of survival and recovery. Having a stroke puts you at a higher risk for a second one. There are things you can do to reduce your risk, starting with identifying what caused your stroke and uncovering your personal risk factors.

A stroke can happen to anyone at any time. However, the burden and risk of stroke is higher among Black and Hispanic adults in the U.S. This is in part due to unmanaged risk factors including high blood pressure, obesity and diabetes.

A large majority of strokes can be prevented through education and lifestyle changes such as moving more, eating smart and managing conditions like atrial fibrillation (AFib) and high blood pres-

Stroke American Month, be a bold advocate for yourself and others by learning the signs of a stroke and talking to your health care team to manage your risk factors. Stroke is an emergency. If someone is having a stroke, they must get medical attention right away.

Spot a stroke F.A.S.T.:


Face drooping Does one side of the face droop or is it numb? Ask the person to smile. Is the person's smile uneven?

- **Arm weakness** Is one arm weak or numb? Ask the person to raise both arms. Does one arm drift downward?
- **Speech difficulty** Is speech slurred? Is the person unable to speak or hard to understand? Ask the person to repeat a simple sentence, like "The sky is blue."
- Time to call 911 If someone shows any of these symptoms, even if the symptoms go away, call 911 and get to a hospital immediately. Check the time so you'll know when the first symptoms appeared.


