Greater Milwaukee Urban League hosts scholarship and laptop awards presentation

RNC 2024 Milwaukee: Security zone impacts city, residents

2024 Republican National Convention will bring significant changes to the city, from road closures to restricted access; here's how RNC will impact Milwaukee

The U.S. Secret Service unveiled the security perimeter for the Republican National Convention, which will take place in Milwaukee from July 15-18, 2024.

The perimeter encompasses the area surrounding Fiserv Forum, Baird Center, and Panther Arena, the venues where the RNC events and activities will take place.


What streets will be closed in Milwaukee during the RNC?

Several streets within the security perimeter will be closed, affecting both vehicular and pedestrian traffic. Intermittent closures start on July 11 — official closures from July 14 until 1 a.m. on July 19.

- Wisconsin Avenue
- Kilbourn Avenue
- Juneau Avenue
- State Street

The security perimeter for the RNC consists of two zones:

- Inner perimeter: Restricted area; access is limited to credentialed individuals. This zone, shaded red on the map (pictured), is a more secure area, with access limited to credentialed individuals, such as convention attendees, volunteers, and media. Entry into this zone requires passing through a pedestrian checkpoint with security screenings.
- Outer perimeter: Area open to pedestrians, but vehicles must checkpoints. This zone, shaded yellow on the security map, encompasses a wider area and allows pedestrian access with no screening required. Vehicles can enter this zone

but must pass through five designated checkpoints marked as black circles on the map (also known as the soft zone).

How will the RNC affect Milwaukee residents?

According to the Secret Service, the plan was created with the intention of "minimizing disruptions to the community as much as possible"

The security zone includes ten blocks from West Clybourn Street on the south to Cherry Street on the north and about eight blocks from North Water Street on the east to North 9th Street on the west.

These are some of the impacts that residents and businesses in Milwaukee can expect due to the outer security perimeter for the 2024 RNC:

- Nearby hotels and event spaces: Access to hotels and event spaces near the perimeter might be limited or controlled.
- Business closures: Some businesses have chosen to remain closed during the RNC, while others plan to implement workfrom-home options for employees.
- Restricted parking: Parking restrictions will be in effect, with certain areas designated as no-parking zones.
- **Public transportation:** Milwaukee County Transit System buses will operate during their normal hours, with some routes impacted by security restrictions.
- Deliveries and services: Trash services, mail, and package deliveries will


- continue, with some schedules shifted to overnight and early morning hours.
- Visible increase in law enforcement personnel: There will be a noticeable increase in the presence of law enforcement personnel throughout the city to ensure safety.
- Maritime security:
 There will be no traffic on the Milwaukee River between Cherry Street and Michigan Street from July 14 until the early morning of July 19. Private vessels must contact the Coast Guard for an escort and screening before reentry.

Building a "Great Society"



When he spoke at Ohio University, he noted that America was demographically a young country, so its future would belong to young people — "so to you of this student body, I say merely as a statement of fact, America is yours: yours to make a better land, yours to build the Great Society." He continued: "It is a Society where no child will go unfed, and no youngster will go unschooled. Where no man who wants work will fail to find it. Where no citizen will be barred from any door because of his birthplace or his color or his church. Where peace and security is com-



mon among neighbors and possible among nations. This is the world that waits for you. Reach out for it now. Join the fight to finish the unfinished work in your own land and in the rest of the world."

Two weeks later President Johnson spoke at the University of Michigan's commencement ceremony. Once again he told the students that America had the opportunity to move "upward to the Great Society" in their time, and said their imagination, their initiative, and their indignation could be the tools needed to create it. He also defined the "Great Society" more fully in that

speech, and he began by say-

"The Great Society rests on abundance and liberty for all. It demands an end to poverty and racial injustice, to which we are totally committed in our time. But that is just the beginning. The Great Society is a place where every child can find knowledge to enrich his mind and to enlarge his talents. It is a place where leisure is a welcome chance to build and reflect, not a feared cause of boredom and restlessness. It is a place where the city of man serves not only the needs of the body and the demands of commerce but the desire for beauty and the hunger

It is a place which honors creation for its own sake and for what it adds to the understanding of the race. It is a place where men are more concerned with the quality of their goals than the quantity of their goods. But most of all, the Great Society is not a safe harbor, a resting place, a final objective, a finished work. It is a challenge constantly renewed . . . "

The Great Society is one where all children and young people — and adults will be able to find joy and thrive. It's fitting that President Johnson shared his vision with young people first. Some of the ideals President Johnson envisioned in the Great Society and the policies needed to support them came under attack almost immediately, and many have remained under attack in one form or another ever since. Just days ago, we saw the House Agriculture Committee voting to advance a farm bill proposing changes to the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP), which children, young peo-



ies and rural communities across the country rely on to help with nutritious meals, that would cut SNAP benefits by an estimated \$30 billion over ten years. This is a far cry from the vision of a society "where no child will go unfed." We see ongoing resistance to the call to end poverty, and new pushbacks against the call to end racial injustice. But at the same time, we also see how far we have come, and how in each new generation young people set a new standard for where we will go next.

If creating a great society is still a challenge that is constantly being renewed, young people are still ready for the challenge — and their imagination, initiative, and indignation are still the right tools for the task. I hope they will never be discouraged by the unfinished work but will always keep building.

Willie Mays, one of the greatest baseball players of all time, dies at age 93

Willie Mays, the iconic baseball legend whose remarkable career spanned 22 seasons, has died, the San Francisco Giants announced Tuesday, June 18, 2024. He was 93.

Mays "passed away peacefully this afternoon," the Giants said in a statement.

"All of Major League Baseball is in mourning today as we are gathered at the very ballpark where a career and a legacy like no other began," MLB Commissioner Rob Manfred said in a statement Tuesday evening. "Willie Mays took his all-around brilliance from the Birmingham Black Barons of the Negro American League to the historic Giants franchise. From coast to coast in New York and San Francisco, Willie inspired generations of players and fans as the game grew and truly earned its place as our National Pastime.'

Mays had issued a statement Monday, June 17, saying he would be unable to attend Thursday's Giants special tribute game against the St. Louis Cardinals, being played at Rickwood Stadium in Birmingham, Alabama, in commemoration of Mays and the Birmingham Black Barons of the Negro Leagues, with whom Mays began his professional career in 1948.

Thursday game included a "pregame ceremony honoring the life of Willie Mays."



Nicknamed the "Say Hey Kid," Mays spent the majority of his career playing center field for the Giants, first in New York and then after the team moved to San Francisco. During Game 1 of the 1954 World Series, the only championship he would win, Mays made "The Catch" an over-the-shoulder snag of a fly ball that is still considered the greatest catch in the

From then on, Mays was a cultural icon.

history of the game.

As a child, Mays learned to play baseball from his father, Cat Mays, in Westfield, AL. A single dad and a steelworker, Cat played on the local steel mill's baseball team and made time to teach his son how to play the game he himself had aspired to play professionally.

At 16, Mays joined the Birmingham Black Barons. After graduating from high school in 1951, he was signed by the son, in which he also won his

New York Giants.

"I arrived in New York City on a Friday at 4 o'clock," Mays recalled during his Hall of Fame induction ceremony in 1979. "Scared to death with three bats in my little briefcase, my glove, I didn't have a uniform, I didn't have

It didn't take long to find his footing. Mays was named National League Rookie of the Year after his first season.

His career was interrupted in 1952 when he was drafted by the Army during the Korean War. He was assigned to Fort Eustice in Virginia, and spent most of his time playing on military baseball teams, according to the Society for American Baseball Research.

He was discharged in March 1954, and rejoined the Giants for what would become a championship seafirst of two MVP awards.

He moved with the team to San Francisco in 1958, led them to a World Series appearance in 1962 — losing to the New York Yankees in seven games — and became the team's captain in 1964. He won his second MVP award in 1965.

Mays was traded to the New York Mets for the 1972-73 season, which would prove to be his last.

He finished his playing career with 660 home runs, the sixth most of all time. He was a 24-time All-Star, tied for second most of all time, and won 12 Golden Glove awards.

Mays was a first-ballot Hall of Famer, receiving 97 percent of the vote when he became eligible in 1979.

Despite the trade from the Giants, for the rest of his life there was always a special place for him in the San Francisco clubhouse, where a visit from Mays often inspired younger players.

President Biden paid tribute to Mays in a statement on June 19, 2024 saying: "Like so many others in my neighborhood and around the country, when I played Little League, I wanted to play centerfield because of Willie Mays. It was a rite of passage to practice his basket catches, daring steals, and command

at the plate — only to be told by coaches to cut it out because no one can do what Willie Mays could do.'

Mays, he added, "not only entertained, above all, he inspired millions of people of all races to help break through the color line of sports, and to break through the conscience of the Nation.'

A landmark statue was erected in 2000 in his honor, outside of what is now called Oracle Park Stadium in. The statue is surrounded by 24 palm trees, in homage to his number 24, which was also retired by the organization. The statue is a small reminder of a man who was long regarded as baseball's greatest living legend, even if that wasn't necessarily a label he cared for.

"I never like that," he said in 2011. "If you are the greatest ballplayer, you say, you're the greatest ball player.' Rather not the 'living ball player'. What good is that? When I first heard it, I said, 'Wait a minute. You mean I got to be passed away before you guys give me credit for doing something?"

But throughout the years, Mays' combination of speed, power and defense led many to consider him the greatest of all time, living or dead.





Who's bearing the burden of commercial tobacco?



June is Pride Month, which celebrates equality for the Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, Transgender, Questioning or Queer (LGBTQ+) community, and the City of Milwaukee Tobacco Free Alliance is providing extra focus on the heavy burden that smoking and vaping has had on LGT-BQ+ individuals.

The City of Milwaukee Tobacco-Free Alliance is one of a few local community alliances that focuses on preventing and reducing smoking and vaping. Each one of the alliances supports specific people and communities that have been targeted through advertising and marketing of commercial tobacco. That includes the LGBTQ+ community, African Americans, Hispanic and Latino people, and people who earn low incomes.

LGBTQ+ Healthlink reports that smoking is the LGBTQ+ community's greatest health burden. In fact, the African American and the LGBTQ+ communities are the highest consumers of menthol cigarettes. That's mostly due to ads and marketing to these communities. For example, the commercial tobacco industry was among the first to depict same sex couples in advertisements.

"On the one hand, the Big



Tobacco companies tell LGBTQ+ people and African Americans that smoking is a normal part of life, especially smoking menthol cigarettes," said Charlie Leonard, coordinator of the City of Milwaukee Tobacco-Free Alliance. "On the other hand, you have all of the stresses that these folks experience thanks to discrimination and stigma, which put them at risk for smoking."

A 2021 survey showed an alarming correla-



tion between Wisconsin's LGBTQ+ youth and an increase in risky behaviors like substance use. These youth also reported a lower percentage of feeling that they belong at their school or that they feel comfortable talking with their parents or other adult family members about their feelings.

"It's really important that we help our young people understand that we adults can help them to live happy and healthy lives without reaching for a cigarette or vape," Leonard said.

Anyone who uses commercial tobacco products can get free help to quit by calling the Wisconsin Tobacco Quit Line at 1-800-QUIT NOW (784-8669). Medicaid beneficiaries can talk to their health care provider about the free quit support provided through the Medicaid Cessation Benefit.
