Celebrating Black History Month 2025: African Americans and Labor

The 2025 Black History Month theme, *African Americans and Labor*, focuses on the various and profound ways that work of all kinds – free and paid; skilled and unskilled; vocational and voluntary – intersect with the collective experiences of black people. Indeed, work is at the very center of much of black history and culture. Be it the traditional agricultural labor of enslaved Africans that fed Low Country colonies, debates among black educators on the importance of vocational training, self-help strategies and entrepreneurship in black communities; or organized labor's role in fighting both economic and social injustice, black people's work has been transformational throughout the U.S., Africa, and the Diaspora. The 2025 Black History Month theme, *African Americans and Labor*, sets out to highlight and celebrate the potent impact of this work.



Community Impact Awards: \$16,000 donated to empower Milwaukee organizations

The Pauline Redmond Coggs Foundation, Inc., in partnership with Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Inc.® - Epsilon Kappa Omega chapter, kicked off the new year by giving back in a big way. The partnership hosted the Community Impact Awards at Brown Deer High School on Saturday, January 11, 2025. The event celebrated service, fostered community collaboration, and highlighted generosity, with \$16,000 in donations awarded to local organizations, made possible through the Jenelle Elder-Green Endowment.

Honorees included Black Arts MKE, Repairers of the Breach, African American Breastfeeding Network, Milwaukee Public Schools Foundation, and the University of Wisconsin Foundation. Representatives from each organization accepted contributions that will support their critical work in arts programming, combatting homelessness, maternal and child health, academic scholarships, and childhood hunger.

Key contributions included funding for four scholarships to college-bound North Division High School seniors, presented

through the Milwaukee Public Schools Foundation; and a donation to Martin Luther King, Jr., Elementary School to combat childhood hunger through the Childhood Hunger Initiative Power Pack (Alpha Kappa Alpha CHIPP™) program, which provides weekend and holiday meals to children in need.

Dr. Tanzanique Carrington, outgoing president of the Pauline Redmond Coggs Foundation, shared in her remarks: "This event reflects our collective power to uplift and inspire. By supporting these incredible organizations, we are investing in the futures of our children, families, and communities."

The ceremony was filled with inspiration, as some honorees shared how the funds would be used to uplift Milwaukee's underserved communities – including funding academic scholarships to help students achieve their educational aspirations. The Pauline Redmond Coggs Foundation is proud to continue its legacy of impact through charitable giving, education and service.

Writing the next chapter

In the days following President Barack Obama's first inauguration, the preparations for Black History Month felt especially joyful. That was a moment when the entire nation could see black history and American history being written at the same time. The record-breaking sea of nearly two million multicolored faces of all ages and from every nook and cranny of America cheering together on the National Mall during the inauguration ceremony was a visual representation of the way the threads of our diverse stories were woven together, and everywhere one looked were reminders of how black history and American history converged. Historians pointed out that the Capitol and White House were built with enslaved people's labor and the Mall itself sits on land that once held markets where people were sold. At a ceremony at the Lincoln Memorial earlier in the week, then President-elect Obama, surrounded by monuments to our most revered leaders, reminded the nation of how the Civil Rights March on Washington for Jobs and



Freedom took place on the same sacred ground. He told us the pool in front of the Memorial "still reflects the dream of a King."

Aretha Franklin sang "My Country 'Tis of Thee" at that inauguration, the Queen of Soul reminding all Americans of our nation's original promise to "let freedom ring." Civil rights giants Dr. Dorothy Height and Congressman John Lewis, the Tuskegee Airmen, and many other trailblazers for liberty bore quiet witness by their presence. Finally, there was the benediction by Rev. Joseph Lowery, who began by quoting a stanza of the poem

and hymn we know as the Black National Anthem, "Lift Ev'ry Voice and Sing":

*God of our weary years,
God of our silent tears,
Thou, who has brought us
thus far on the way,
Thou, who has by Thy
might
Led us into the light,
Keep us forever in the
path, we pray...
Shadowed beneath Thy
hand,
May we forever stand,
True to our God, true to
our native land.*


For all of us raised on those beloved words, the symbolism of hearing them there

was overwhelming. For more than a hundred years, every time "Lift Ev'ry Voice" has rung out in a church hall, school auditorium, or community meeting, it enabled black Americans to stand up and sing our own song about our faith in and struggle to make America's promise real. Rev. Lowery didn't recite every line that day, like those that speak of the bitter obstacles overcome and the blood shed along the way. He didn't need to. We understood all that had been required for our Black National Anthem to become—at long last—part of the larger American hymn.

It goes without saying that the obvious contrasts between that joyful, hope-filled moment and this one are stark. We begin Black History Month this year with public observations of Black History Month itself—like so much else in our nation—under targeted and chilling attack.

Yet we still know that Black history, and American women's history, and LGBTQ history, differently abled people's history, Native American history, Latino history, Asian American history, immigrant history, and every other line of each of our American stories are all deeply embedded chapters in American history that cannot actually be rewritten or erased by any memos or executive orders. We also know that history continues to reward those hope-filled people who have been willing to struggle and fight to keep moving America forward. When the current dangerous chapter is over, the question remains of what we want the next chapter of our shared history to say.

Lilo Allen fulfills longtime dream with
Bronzeville Collective MKE

By the time she was six years old, Lilo Allen was already a very ambitious little girl. In addition to creating and selling her own jewelry line, she was also determined to see her name in lights.

After celebrating their fifth anniversary in business last October and relocating the Bronzeville Collective MKE to 2236 North Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., Drive in August 2024, all Allen needs is a large-screen LED sign to fulfill her childhood dream.

The Bronzeville Collective MKE is a collaborative gift shop that Allen co-founded and manages. It features handcrafted and uniquely designed jewelry, clothing, wellness products, home décor and metaphysical items such as tarot cards, crystals and sage produced by approximately 30 black-, brown-, queer-, and ally-owned local enterprises.

The cosmetic, hygiene, hair and skin care products are all made with safe ingredients, and contain no harsh chemicals. The Collective also offers bath bombs and salts that are guaranteed to soothe. There is also a bath bomb containing actual CBD from cannabis which can ease chronic pain. Also available is a line bath teas, which is a bath bomb (without the clean-up afterward), ideal for individuals with injuries or limited mobility.

Tuesday evenings feature at Bronzeville Collective MKE tarot readings hosted by Zakia.

“People can walk in here and see themselves reflected and celebrated, not just in the store, but in the poetry, the jewelry, the art, all of it,” Allen said. “black, brown and queer people didn’t always

see themselves reflected accurately in Milwaukee in the past.”

In addition to the retail location, online purchases are available through the store website: <https://www.bronzevillecollective.com/>. The Collective also has social media accounts on Facebook and Instagram.

Soon after the Collective moved to its new location in August 2024, Miller went founded a co-working space and café called Fruition MKE. She remains active with the Collective.

About 40 percent of the items in the store are jewelry and craft items created by Allen and business partner Miller. The two women first met more than 10 years ago as aspiring poets performing at open mic nights around Milwaukee. Before founding Bronzeville Collective MKE, both women had their own brand under which they sold their artistic creations: Allen’s is named Papyrus & Charms and Miller’s is FlyBlooms by Tiffany.

“We kept running into each other [as vendors at various summer festival events] around Milwaukee,” Allen said. “Eventually we decided to split costs.”

By October 2018, the two women were ready to advance to the next step in their

plan to take control of their own destiny. After learning about a business training opportunity through the African American Chamber of Commerce of Wisconsin (AACCW) on Facebook, Allen and Miller undertook an intensive 14-week RISE MKE business class administered through the AACCW. At the completion of the course, Miller and Allen won a contest for the best business plan and they were voted the “fan favorite” by a majority of the class. The two awards

came with prizes amounting to \$3,500, which they later used as the security deposit for the lease of a retail storefront location.

Before obtaining their own lease, the two women had another piece of good fortune. After applying to Brew City Match program, the two women were announced as participants. This came with a stipend of \$2,000 each as well as 60 days of free rent at a retail location. Bronzeville Collective MKE reported gross revenue of \$27,000 during its first two months, Allen said.

Allen credits her Jamaican-born father, Daniel Mosiah, for her artistic sense; and her mother, Celesta Allen, for her business ability. By the age of six, she had already combined the two skills making up to \$50 a day selling the jewelry she designed and made at struggling store locations that her mother had been sent to turn around.

AACCW helping black
entrepreneurs with a proper start

Tiffany Miller and Lilo Allen were able to take their Bronzeville Collective MKE business plan to the next level with funding, free rent and training from a variety of Milwaukee-based economic development organizations.

Miller and Allen perfected their concept for Bronzeville Collective MKE in 2018 after completing an intensive business development program administered through the African American Chamber of Commerce of Wisconsin (AACCW) and then receiving a storefront location rent-free for 60 days through Brew City Match.

“Our RISE MKE program helps ensure that start up businesses don’t start out blindly,” said AACCW Vice President Jona Moore. “We watch entrepreneurs start with an idea at the beginning of the class and by the completion they already have a fully developed business.”

Allen and Miller learned about RISE MKE and the AACCW on Facebook, according to Allen. RISE MKE is a 14-week intensive program administered through AACCW. It is designed to help emerging businesses develop a strategic plan with a focus on marketing, branding, business network development, and other essential resources.

Brew City Match is not currently accepting new applications while the program plans its 2025 offerings. Previous Brew City Match versions sought to revitalize Milwaukee business districts surrounding downtown by providing training and funding opportunities to entrepreneurs commit-

ted to operating in those areas, according to information. Miller and Allen fine-tuned their consignment store model for the Bronzeville Collective MKE after obtaining a storefront location rent-free for 60 days. Although the program is currently not accepting applications, the website remains full of valuable links and resources to other organizations which are actively accepting new applications.

Other economic development organizations such as – the Wisconsin Women’s Business Initiative Corporation (WWBIC); the UWM SCE Small Business Development Center (SBDC) and BizStarts provide opportunities for individuals who are interested in starting, strengthening or expanding their business, according to Renee Lindner, currently associate director of the Historic King Drive Business Improvement District (BID) #8 and a former outreach specialist for WWBIC. She said that Brew City Match distributed more than \$500,000 to approximately two dozen King Drive-area businesses “which is a once in a lifetime event.”

WWBIC, SBDC, and the Historic King Drive BID #8 were partners with Brew City Match and all continue to offer resources.

“People should keep seeking resources and not be afraid to ask questions from other business owners who are successful; the more info the better,” Lindner said. “One main thing we try to do [at the BID] is to help keep our businesses open and strong.”



Celebrating Black History All Month Long!

Here's the story behind Black History Month — and why it's celebrated in February

Every February, the U.S. honors the contributions and sacrifices of African Americans who have helped shape the nation. Black History Month celebrates the rich cultural heritage, triumphs and adversities that are an indelible part of our country's history.

This year's theme, focuses on "African Americans and Labor," focuses on the various and profound ways that work of all kinds – free and paid; skilled and unskilled; vocational and voluntary – intersect with the collective experiences of black people. Indeed, work is at the very center of much of black history and culture. Be it the traditional agricultural labor of enslaved Africans that fed Low Country colonies, debates among black educators on the importance of vocational training, self-help strategies and entrepreneurship in black communities; or organized labor's role in fighting both economic and social injustice, black people's work has been transformational throughout the U.S., Africa, and the Diaspora. The 2025 Black History Month theme, African

Americans and Labor," sets out to highlight and celebrate the potent impact of this work.

"There is no American history without African American history," said Sara Clarke Kaplan, executive director of the Antiracist Research & Policy Center at American University in Washington, D.C. The black experience, she said, is embedded in "everything we think of as 'American history'."

First, there was Negro History Week

Critics have long argued that black history should be taught and celebrated year-round, not just during one month each year.

It was Carter G. Woodson, the "father of black history," who first set out in 1926 to designate a time to promote and educate people about black history and culture, according to W. Marvin Dulaney. He is a historian and the president of the Association for the Study of African American Life and History (ASALH).

Woodson envisioned a weeklong celebration to encourage the coordinated

teaching of black history in public schools. He designated the second week of February as Negro History Week and galvanized fellow historians through the Association for the Study of Negro Life and History, which he founded in 1915. (ASNLH later became ASALH.)

The idea wasn't to place limitations but really to focus and broaden the nation's consciousness.

"Woodson's goal from the very beginning was to make the celebration of black history in the field of history a 'serious area of study'," said

Albert Broussard, a professor of Afro-American history at Texas A&M University.

The idea eventually grew in acceptance, and by the late 1960s, Negro History Week had evolved into what is now known as Black History Month. Protests around racial injustice, inequality and anti-imperialism that were occurring in many parts of the U.S. were pivotal to the change.

Colleges and universities also began to hold commemorations, with Kent State University being one of the first, according to Kaplan.

Fifty years after the first celebrations, President Gerald R. Ford officially recognized Black History Month during the country's 1976 bicentennial. Ford called upon Americans to "seize the opportunity to honor the too-often neglected accomplishments of black Americans in every area of endeavor throughout our history," *History.com* reports.

Why February was chosen as Black History Month

February was chosen primarily because the second week of the month coincides with the birthdays of both Abraham Lincoln and Frederick Douglass. Lincoln was influential in the emancipation of slaves, and Douglass, a former slave, was a prominent leader in the abolitionist movement, which fought to end slavery.

Lincoln and Douglass were each born in the second week of February, so it was traditionally a time when African Americans would hold celebrations in honor of emancipation, Kaplan said. (Douglass' exact date of birth wasn't recorded, but he came to celebrate it on Feb. 14.)

Thus, Woodson created Negro History Week around the two birthdays as a way of "commemorating the black past," according to ASALH.

Forty years after Ford formally recognized Black History Month, it was Barack Obama, the nation's first black president, who delivered a message of his own from the White House, a place built by slaves.

"Black History Month shouldn't be treated as though it is somehow separate from our collective American history or somehow just boiled down to a compilation of greatest hits from the March on Washington or from some of our sports heroes," Obama said.

"It's about the lived, shared experience of all African Americans, high and low, famous and obscure, and how those experiences have shaped and challenged and ultimately strengthened America," he continued.

(Canada also commemorates Black History Month in February, while the U.K. and Ireland celebrate it in October.)

There's a new theme every year ASALH designates a new theme for Black History Month each year, in keeping with the practice Woodson established for Negro History Week.

"There's never been a time where Black people and others should not celebrate Black history," Broussard said. "Given the current racial climate, the racial reckoning that began in the wake of George Floyd's murder ... this is an opportunity to learn."
