Wisconsin Gov. Tony Evers won't seek re-election, setting stage for open 2026 race

Wisconsin's Democratic governor, Tony Evers, announced Thursday, July 24, 2025 that he will not seek a third term in 2026, creating the first open race for governor in the battleground state in 16 years.

It will be Wisconsin's highest profile race next year, as Democrats also angle to take control of the Legislature, thanks to redrawn election maps that are friendlier to the party. They are also targeting two congressional districts as Democrats nationwide try to retake the US House of Representatives.

The Legislature has been under Republican control since 2011, and some Democrats had hoped that Evers, 73, would run for a third term to give him a chance to potentially work with a Democratic-controlled one.

In a video announcing his decision, Evers said he was "damn proud" of working 50 years in public service. But he said it was time to focus on his family.

"For five decades, my family has sacrificed to give me

the gift of service," Evers said. "They're my world and I owe it to them to focus on doing all the things we enjoy and love doing together."

First two Democrats and Republicans enter governor

Wisconsin Lt. Gov. Sara Rodriguez and Milwaukee County Executive David Crowley both entered the 2026 race to be the Democratic candidate for the state's next governor after Gov. Tony Evers announced Thursday that he would not be running for re-election.

The Democratic Lieu-

tenant Governors Association issued support for Rodriguez immediately, saying "as a nurse, a mom and lieutenant governor, Sara has spent her life putting people first—fighting for affordable health care, protecting reproductive freedom, and delivering real results for working families across Wisconsin."

Crowley, meanwhile, told reporters he was taking steps toward entering the race and that "time is of the essence" in entering the race.

Rodriguez pointed to her time as a nurse, saying she is a public health policy expert, small business owner and problem-solver for the state's top office in her announcement.

"We are in a precarious moment in our history and we need leaders who will stand up for Wisconsin, who understand the challenges facing families here and who believe deeply in our ability to build a stronger future for our children," Rodriguez said in a statement. "That's why as a Wisconsinite, a daughter of a veteran and union member, a mom and your Lieutenant Governor, I'm proud to be announcing my campaign for Governor,"

Bill Berrien and Washington County Executive Josh Schoemann, both Republicans, were the first two candidates to announce they are running for the seat.

"Sara Rodriguez is the very embodiment of Tony Evers and the Madison Democrats' failed record over the last six years," Berrien said in a Friday statement. "Wisconsin cannot afford to have a continuation of the Evers' policies that kept us stuck in reverse. It doesn't matter whether it's Sara Rodriguez or another one of the radical left Democrats that decide to enter this race, one thing is

Honoring the legacy of 'Mz. Rose': A Milwaukee treasure



On Saturday, July 19, 2025, family, friends, dignitaries, and community members gathered at St. Martin de Porres Catholic Church to honor the remarkable life and legacy of Ms. Rose Marie Lue-Hing affectionately known as "Mz. Rose". The atmosphere was filled with reverence, remembrance, and radiant joy — exactly the way she wanted it.

A traditional Catholic Mass was held in her honor, followed by a jubilant Celebration of Life Repast, where laughter echoed, tears were shared, and stories of her powerful presence came alive. Elected officials, community leaders, loved ones and friends from the Jamaican and Hispanic communities came together to celebrate a woman who was nothing short of a living legend.

Mz. Rose was more than a community icon — she was community. Born in Mil-

waukee on August 30, 1938, her life was steeped in purpose, faith, and passion. She broke barriers at WE Energies as the first black female contract analyst in her department. She stood tall as a union steward for IBEW Local 2150, fighting for equity long before it was fashionable. And after retirement, she showed the world that learning never stops — earning degrees from MATC and the University of Wisconsin-Madison.

She was a storyteller, actress, singer, dancer, and activist. A proud alum of St. Benedict the Moor Boarding School, she stayed connected with fellow alumni, keeping the legacy alive with annual reunions and monthly church gatherings. She was a founding force behind Harambee Community School and a tireless advocate for social justice in Milwaukee's black and underserved communities.

'Rosemary Ollison: Know My Heart' presents the rich fiber creations of local artist

The Wisconsin Museum of Quilts & Fiber Arts (WMQ-FA) is thrilled to announce "Rosemary Ollison: Know My Heart," the first solo museum exhibition of acclaimed self-taught artist Rosemary Ollison. This groundbreaking exhibition will showcase thirty of her works.

Celebrated for her intricate textile work, Ollison has dedicated over forty years to her artistic practice, primarily created in her home environment. This exhibition marks a significant milestone in her career and will be accompanied by a fully illustrated catalog featuring her unpublished writings, along with scholarly essays by historians Dr. Sharbreon Plummer and Debra Brehmer.

As a remarkable self-taught artist and storyteller, Ollison grew up in the segregated Jim Crow South, spending her early years on a plantation in Arkansas. She describes her childhood conditions as being "one or two steps away from slavery" and was able to leave the plantation at the age 16. In 1996, as she began to heal from an abusive marriage, Ollison started creating art spontaneously. Over the course of four years, she produced over one thousand drawings.

She attributes this out-



pouring of images and symbols to her deeply held Christian and the Biblical passage: "Search me, God, and know my heart."

Ollison's artistic practice is defined by her creative use of repurposed materials, including fabric scraps, glass, leather, beads, bones, and jewelry, which she weaves into monumental wall tapestries, hanging sculptures, and improvisational quilts.

With "Rosemary Ollison: Know My Heart," WMQ-FA aims to shed light on her rich fiber practice, which includes quilts, rugs, wall hangings, garments, and beaded objects. While Ollison has gained recognition for her previous exhibitions and was honored as a 2018 Nohl Fellow, this project seeks to elevate her status on

a national level, ensuring that she receives the acknowledgment her artwork rightfully deserves.



He also created the first black business district, Central City Plaza, a historic landmark located at 6th and Walnut Streets. 

Hall of Famer, Bucks legend Oscar Robertson receives 'Arthur Ashe Award for Courage' at ESPYs

"The Big O" was honored with the award for his fight to establish free agency in the NBA.

Hall of Famer and Milwaukee Bucks legend Oscar Robertson added another award to his long list of accolades on July 16, 2025, at the ESPYs. This time, though, it was for his work off the court.

The 1963-64 MVP and 12time All-Star helped bring the Milwaukee Bucks their first NBA championship in 1971.

Robertson was also the first player in NBA history to achieve a triple-double in a season.

'The Big O" was recognized for his work as a pioneer to establish free agency in the NBA on July 16, 2025 at the ESPYs. There, Robertson received the Arthur Ashe Award for Courage. The



award is given to a deserving member of the sports world who has made a difference beyond the field of play by fighting for what they believe in, ultimately impacting people worldwide.

While Robertson was a player, NBA teams retained the rights of players, even if their contracts expired. Basically, the only way players could move to different teams was either by trade or being released, as free agency was rare.

Robertson became the president of the NBA Players Association and served 1965 through 1974.

In 1970, he filed an antitrust lawsuit against the league, aimed at blocking the NBA-ABA merger and liberating players from exploitative contract restrictions. Owners threatened and dismissed him, warning that the league would crumble under the weight of this new labor power. Many players shied away from the fight, worried that they would lose their jobs. Robertson persisted, aware that the current situation was unjust.

In 1976, after successfully delaying the merger, the Players Association reached a groundbreaking settlement with the league. It was deemed the "Oscar Robertson Rule." The "rule" eliminated the "option" or "reserve" clause in the NBA uniform player contract. The previous rules bound a player to one

team for life at the team's option. Players now had leverage in dealing with owners. The "Oscar Robertson Rule" created what we know now as "restricted free agency. This paved the way for greater labor gains down the road. Major League Baseball and National Football League players soon won similar concessions.

Previous recipients of the Arthur Ashe Award for Courage include the USA Gymnastics sexual abuse survivors (2018), Bill Russell (2019), Kevin Love (2020), Maya Moore (2021), Vitali Klitschko (2022), the U.S. Women's National Soccer Team (2023) and Steve Gleason (2024).

Simone Biles wins big at the 2025 ESPYs

The decorated gymnast accepted Best Championship Performance and Best Female Athlete, delivering powerful words about resilience and gratitude during her speech.

Simone Biles reminded the world exactly why she's the most decorated gymnast of all time.

She walked away with two trophies at the 2025 ESPY Awards on Wednesday, July 16, 2025, including the show's first televised honor, Best Championship Performance, for her efforts at the 2024 Paris Olympics, where she racked up three golds as well as a silver medal. Notably, she helped lead the U.S. women's gymnastics team to its first team gold since 2016.

Held at the Dolby Theatre in Los Angeles, the show drew a mix of athletes and entertainers. Angela Bassett, Russell Wilson, Trinity Rodman, Gabby Thomas, Druski and Flau'jae Johnson were among the night's presenters. Rap icons Busta Rhymes and Clipse took the stage for special performances. Wilson and his wife, Ciara, were also spotted on the red carpet, turning heads as always.

When accepting the Best Championship Performance award, Biles expressed gratitude and a little humor. "That was very unexpected, especially in a category of all men, so thank you guys," she said. Stephen Curry was one of the men nominated alongside the gymnast.

The Texas-bred champ then took a moment to address a tragedy close to home. "Before I get into it, I first want to offer my sincere condolences to all those impacted by the devastating flash flooding on July 4th in Central Texas," she said. "Words can't replace the pain, but our hearts are with you in this tragic time." According to The Associated Press, the floods left at least 132 dead and another 160 people missing in Kerr County.

"I'm honored to receive this award. The recognition means more than you guys know. I would like to thank the people who have stood with me on this journey my teammates, my compet-



itors, my coaches, family and fans who have lifted me up every step of the way. I wouldn't be standing here without all of you," Biles continued. "I also proudly share this award with my team of supporters. Having a strong support system that understands your dreams, who are willing to show up for you, not just when you're winning, but when you're struggling, too, is really important. My sincere gratitude, appreciation and love courage you to follow your

to all of you who have stood with me on this magical journey, all the highs, lows, twists and turns along the way."

She concluded the speech with, "Six-year-old me, who first started tumbling on my parents' sofa in the living room, is floored to be standing before you right now. For all the young aspiring athletes, coaches, trainers, doctors, mental health professionals, or whatever path you may choose in life, I en-

heart, pursue your dreams, and believe in yourself every step of the way as anything is possible. I believe in the power of sport, the power of us, and of course, the power of she."

Later in the evening, Biles accepted the Best Female Athlete award, keeping her second speech short: "Thank you, again." It marked her second time receiving that honor, as the first was in 2017.

Her husband, NFL safety Jonathan Owens, was by her side throughout the night and celebrated her wins on Instagram, posting: "ESPYs 2025. Huge shoutout to my amazing wife for winning [two] ESPY awards!! Now that's 6!!!! I'm so happy I was able to be there to witness such an amazing night... So proud of you, baby.'

At 28, Biles shows no signs of slowing down, continuing to raise the bar for what greatness looks like in sports.




