Civil rights legend Andrew Young visits Milwaukee to support youth empowerment



On Thursday, August 21, 2025, Quarles & Brady hosted a kick off to their annual Fellowship Open weekend featuring a fireside chat with former mayor of Atlanta, former U.N. ambassador and close confident of the late Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., Andrew Young at their downtown offices.

"You're setting examples for other cities... as far as I know this is the only community that has an activist, charitable base," the 93 year old former ambassador said. "I think I've been through just about everything... and we now know how complicated life is on this planet." A living symbol of courage and commitment, Ambassador Young reminded attendees that the work isn't over.

"We've never stopped working on how to resolve those problems, and you can't solve them if you don't try," Young said.

The Fellowship Open, is an annual charity golf outing to raises money for programs like MKE Fellows, which is dedicated to empowering young Black men.

In 2017 Trump praised the National Museum of African American History and Culture; now he wants to dismantle it

During his private tour of the NMAAHC during his first term, President Donald Trump said it served as "a meaningful reminder" of "why we have to fight bigotry, intolerance and hatred in all of its very ugly forms."

President Donald Trump's latest remark about slavery has put renewed scrutiny on the Smithsonian museums, which are currently under internal review by the White House to "remove divisive or partisan narratives" and "restore confidence in our shared cultural institutions."

In a Tuesday, August 19, 2025 Truth Social post, the president appeared to suggest that the topic of slavery was a breach of what his administration considers too "woke."

"The Museums throughout Washington, but all over the Country are, essentially, the last remaining segment of "WOKE." The Smithsonian is OUT OF CONTROL, where everything discussed is how horrible our Country is, how bad Slavery was," wrote Trump.

At the heart of Trump's targeting of the Smithsonian is the National Museum of African American History and Culture, which has an extensive exhibit on the history of U.S. chattel slavery. The museum, which opened in 2016, details the horrors of slavery, from the kidnapping of Africans and their transport across the Atlantic Ocean to their captivity as free labor, resulting in frequent physical and psychological abuse and murder.

After nearly a decade, the African American museum has become one of Washington, D.C.'s most popular museums, educating Americans and those abroad about the storied history of black Americans, who endured slavery and racial segregation and yet contributed so greatly to America's political and



cultural evolution and econ-

Trump's expressed contempt for the Smithsonian and its portrayal of slavery is a departure from his position when he visited the National Museum of African American History and Culture for the first time as president in 2017. At the time, Trump praised the museum for highlighting African-American "incredible heroes," including abolitionists like Sojourner Truth, Harriet Tubman, and Frederick Douglass, and civil rights activists and scholars like Rosa Parks and Booker T. Washington.

"It's amazing to see," said President Trump, following a tour of the museum led by Smithsonian Institute Secretary Lonnie Bunch, along with his daughter Ivanka Trump, U.S. Senator Tim Scott, Alveda King, and Ben Carson, then the secretary of the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development.

"I could stay here for a lot longer. Believe me, it's really incredible," Trump asserted. "I'm deeply proud that we now have a museum that honors the millions of African American men and women who built our national heritage, especially when it comes to faith, culture and the unbreakable American spirit."

President Trump, at the time, said the African-American museum was "a mean-ingful reminder" of "why we have to fight bigotry, intolerance and hatred in all of its very ugly forms." He said incidents of racism, including antisemitism against Jews, were a "sad reminder of the work that still must be done to root out hate and prejudice and evil."

During his second term, Trump's tone on racism in America has drastically evolved. Since reentering office, Trump has signed executive orders aimed at censoring how black history is taught in classrooms and on college campuses; rolling back civil rights protections intended to redress harms caused to black Americans; and banning all things his administration considers to be diversity, equity, and inclusion (DEI).

The Trump administration also restored the naming of military bases and the erecting of monuments and statues named after Confederate

"Anytime we want to discuss what is taking place as it relates to black people and how they took our labor, how they took our lives, how they ruined families, they never want the truth to come out because it hurts their feelings," said U.S. Congresswoman Jasmine Crockett on CNN following Trump's Truth Social complaining about the Smithsonian's accurate depiction of slavery.

"If we don't recognize the full history, then we are doomed to repeat it. And frankly...this is a guy that wants to take us back," said Crockett.

In an interview with theGrio, adjunct professor at Georgetown University Law Center and founder of The Culture Keepers Circle, A. Prince Albert said that Trump's targeting of the NMAAHC is part of a "crusade" to "erase 406 years (and counting) of "Successes" of peoples of African descent in the United States of America, despite slavery, racial terrorism, lynchings, land dispossession, segregation, education inequity, housing discrimination, non-consensual medical experimentation, voter suppression, police brutality, and mass incarceration."

Albert, whose organization works to preserve cultural institutions and artifacts, explained that most exhibits at the AA museum showcase how "African Americans built successful businesses, communities, and institutions despite pervasive systemic oppression."

Quoting Trump's Truth Social post, he added, "If the African American story is not "Success" "Brightness" and the "HOTTEST" future that ever happened for a people whose ancestors were brought over in chains, I don't know what is."

Albert warned that, based on the Trump administration's actions and rhetoric thus far, he fears the next step is deaccession, which is the formal removal of cultural resources from public collections. "Deaccession is a critical first step in erasing our collective cultural memory," he told the Grio.

The cultural expert explained, "Museums, especially those like the Smithsonian, serve as a public trust, and their purpose is to tell the complete story, not only the comfortable parts."

Albert added, "Instead of attacking our cultural institutions, we should be supporting them. Our history is too valuable to be a victim of censorship or political agen-

We can't gerrymander our way back to democracy

The drama in Texas, where President Donald Trump has demanded that Republicans quickly draw new GOP districts to thwart the will of the voters and ensure his party retains control of Congress in the upcoming midterm elections, has created massive discord.

Progressives and voting rights advocates are divided on whether California and New York should fight the Texas power grab by gerrymandering their own states, creating more safe Democratic seats, even if that means undermining fair maps and the authority of those states' nonpartisan redistricting commissions.

In Wisconsin, which just got out from under one of the worst partisan gerrymanders in the U.S., and the impenetrable, outsized Republican majorities in the state Legislature it protected for a decade and a half, this issue hits particularly close to home

It's head-spinning to hear arguments for Democratic counter-gerrymandering in other states from the same people in Wisconsin who were recently crying out for fair maps

If Democrats are going to mount a serious challenge to the fascist takeover of our country by Trump and his minions, it's hard to see how ceding the moral high ground and running roughshod over the principle that the will of the majority of voters should prevail is going to help.

If we want democracy, fairness, and the rule of law, we need to champion, well, democracy, fairness and the rule of law.

I get that it's more satisfying to imagine a quick fix to the fascist takeover of every branch of government than to listen to a lot of vague talk about long-term plans to rebuild democracy. After all, election deniers and the architects of the Jan. 6 attack are now running the federal government, demanding access to voter lists across the country and deploying the FBI to arrest political opponents, including the Texas Democrats who've fled their state to stall the gerrymandering scheme there.

But here in Wisconsin, where we've just finally beaten back the most gerrymandered map in the country, it's depressing to imagine Democrats abandoning the high ground and scrambling to do exactly what Republicans did when they controlled all three branches of government, attempting to lock in permanent political control against the will of the people.

If we want democracy, fairness, and the rule of law, we need to champion, well, democracy, fairness and the rule of law.

In this most extreme political moment, with every



public institution and the continued existence of U.S. democracy in doubt, I understand why the long view frustrates people. The emergency is now. I understand that many voters want to see Democrats "fight fire with fire," as Newsom put it.

But consider this: Republicans control more state legislatures (28 Republican versus 18 controlled by Democrats) and have trifecta control of all branches of government in more states (23 all-GOP states versus 15 all-Democratic). JD Vance just launched a tour of Republican states to encourage more mid-decade gerrymandering. And Trump wants to hold a new census for the purpose of redefining who can vote. Even if Democratic Govs. Gavin Newsom and Kathy Hochul succeed in gerrymandering California and New York, Democrats are not likely to win the nationwide redistricting war.

Meanwhile, democracy will be the first casualty of that war. California and New York would have to suspend the work of their nonpartisan redistricting commissions — the gold standard

for fair, nonpartisan map-drawing — and take back partisan control of the process in order to carry out their threats. If they succeed, it is beyond unlikely that the politicians who pull off that short-term victory will ever cede back their power over the vot-

ing maps to the nonpartisan commissions again.

On a deeper level, the gerrymander-Democratic ing fantasy takes the whole movement to oppose Trump in exactly the wrong direction. Instead of building grassroots support to counter an unpopular, authoritarian leader, it rigs the system to benefit a party whose whole problem is that it has lost the broad, popular support it needs to win elections and create a better, more enlightened government.

Instead of trying to rig the maps to ensure a Democratic House majority in the next election, Democrats need to focus on winning elections and flipping seats in areas of the rural and industrial Midwest that were once reliably blue but have turned deep red

To do that they need to make the case that health care, education and an adequate social safety net are bedrock rights in the richest nation on earth, and that we should not be giving tax breaks to billionaires by taking food out of the mouths of hungry children.

They need to offer something to the farmers and factory workers and disaffected voters in rural and urban areas alike that is clearly different and better than the hate, corruption, and a determination to run roughshod over democracy that Republicans offer.

In Wisconsin, voting rights groups have been working on a campaign to push through a constitutional amendment modeled on one in our neighboring state of Michigan, to make sure that our voting maps are never again drawn up by partisan legislators.

That's the kind of grass-roots fight that helped Wisconsin finally overcome Republican gerrymandering. One important aspect of the fair maps movement is the way it engaged citizens to feel like participants, not spectators, in democracy, and to find their common interests instead of focusing on the politics of division. This, not more politicians in safe seats who don't have to listen to voters, is what we need right now

The battle to beat back fascism does not turn on a handful of Democrats in protected districts. It turns on an organized uprising by the majority of people in the U.S. who are willing to join together despite their differences because they are sick and tired of having their democracy stolen from them, along with their health, safety, opportunity and hope. There's no short cut to leading that fight.







Venus Williams returns to U.S. Open at 45: I'm just trying to have fun, stay relaxed and be my personal best"

It's a given that much of the coverage and attention devoted to Venus Williams' return to the U.S. Open, where play begins Sunday, has focused — and will focus — on how old she is. The American is, after all, 45, an age at which no one has competed in singles in New York since 1981.

That, in and of itself, is noteworthy.

And yet there is plenty more that is significant about her first appearance at a Grand Slam tournament in two full years, regard-less of how Williams plays in Arthur Ashe Stadium on Monday night when meets Karolina Muchova, the 2023 French Open runner-up and a two-time semifinalist in New York.

"I want to be my best, and that's the expectation I have for myself: to get the best out of me. And that's all any player can ask for," Williams said Saturday. "I haven't played as much as the other players, so it's a different challenge when you're dealing with that. So I'm just trying to have fun, stay relaxed and be my personal best."



Williams made it back to the tour in July, 16 months after last playing an official match anywhere and less than a year after she had surgery for uterine fibroids.

Venus Williams is at a Grand Slam tournament for the first time in 2 years.

"It's just really, I would say, inspiring," said Nao-mi Osaka, 27, a four-time Grand Slam champion. "My only thing is: I don't really like how every headline mentions her age. ... We all know how old she is. But it's kind of more the broader (significance) — how much of a legend she is in this sport."

Williams and her young-

er sister Serena whose last match as a pro came at Flushing Meadows in 2022, represent an indelible chapter in the history of tennis, yes, but also of sports in a greater sense and even American society.

They transcended the mere scores and stats and win-and-loss ledgers, and made it all about far more than that, including Venus' famous stand in favor of equal prize money for women at Wimbledon.

"She's one of the best athletes of all time," two-time U.S. Open semifinalist Frances Tiafoe said. "Her and her sister, they're not only great for the women's game, not only great for women's sports, but they are so icon-

Venus and Serena Williams are sisters who both reached the top of tennis.

Their story bears repeating: Two siblings were first taught tennis by their selftaught father and both not only made it to the professional tour but both reached No. 1 in the rankings and won the most important trophies in their global sport.

"People, I guess," Osaka said, "should value them a little bit more."

Osaka grew up watching the Williams sisters, then competed against them.

So did plenty of other women, such as Coco Gauff, who first announced herself to the world by defeating Venus at Wimbledon in 2019. After that match, Gauff — just 15 at the time — said she thanked Venus "for everything she did," and told reporters: "I wouldn't be here if it wasn't for her."

Venus was the first black woman since Althea Gibson to win Wimbledon.

In 2000, Venus became the first Black woman since Althea Gibson in the 1950s to win the championship at the All England Club.

"She's (had) a huge impact. ... It's so cool to see a legend still playing, still doing what she loves," 2021 U.S. Open runner-up Leylah Fernan-dez said. "It's not, kind of, to prove people wrong, but it's because she truly loves the sport — and you can see the kid in her. I love that."

Indeed, asked why she would bother playing, Williams replied: "Why not?"

Venus Williams owns 23 Grand Slam trophies in singles and doubles.

Williams collected five singles trophies at Wimbledon and also won the U.S. Open in 2000 and 2001. That's aside from 14 Grand Slam titles in women's doubles — all with Serena and two in mixed doubles, an event she returned to at Flushing Meadows this week.

Since the Williams sisters came on the scene — Venus made her professional debut in 1994, when she was 14; Serena, who is 15 months younger, would soon follow and ended up with 23 major singles titles — they set an example for kids who looked like them and wanted to play tennis.

Last month in Washington, Williams took pride in noticing that there were three black women competing on the court when she played — and won, by the way — a doubles match during the first event of her comeback.

"It's amazing that now African-American girls know they can play tennis, that that's an option, an opportunity for them to be out there, too, on the court, in whatever capacity," she said, "whether you get to the pros, whether you play college or whether you just learn from the sport."




