Milwaukee Public Library celebrates grand opening of state-of-the-art MLK branch in Harambee Neighborhood

















On Saturday, September 6, 2025, the Milwaukee Public Library celebrated the grand opening of its new Martin Luther King Branch. Located in the city's Harambee neighborhood, the 17,400-square-foot facility greeted city leaders, neighbors, and families with enthusiasm as they cut the ribbon and explored the state-of-the-art space that promises to be a beacon of knowledge and technology. The new space offers plenty for users young and old to flex their creativity. including a fully equipped maker-space with 3D printing, podcasting equipment, and the latest technology, a large community room designed for public meetings and events, dedicated children's and teen areas, and computer stations, private study

spaces, and meeting rooms.

The library, now based at 2901 N. MLK Jr. Dr, is not only a testament to the enduring value of public spaces dedicated to learning but also stands as a symbol of the city's innovative spirit and commitment to environmental sustainability. At the opening, Mayor Cavalier Johnson described the library as a "symbol of innovation", while City Librarian Joan Johnson proudly shared its achievement as the region's greenest library, complete with solar panels, geothermal heating and cooling, and a green roof. North Division HS celebrates graduation of Adult Welding Job Training program participants

On Thursday, August 7, 2025, the Adult Welding Job Training program at North Division High School, 1011 W. Center St., celebrated the completion of the most recent class. The program was initiated through a collaborative effort involving the Milwaukee Public Schools (MPS) Recreation Department (MKE Rec), Milwaukee Area Technical College (MATC) Workforce Development Solution, and the George Gerharz North Division High School Alumni and Friends, Inc. This program is open to adults aged 18 and older.

Plans are in place to renovate the welding, dental, and Cognitive and Affective Neuroscience Labs (CAN labs) at the school. These renovations aim to provide local job training opportunities for both adults and

students. The North Division High School students will have access to these labs for training during regular school hours, similar to the certification program offered by other high schools in the area.

Community leaders are encouraged to support these initiatives to foster economic growth and job security. Pre-1950 MPS elementary school buildings are cleared of lead risks

After months of intensive work, all 50 Milwaukee Public School (MPS) schools built before 1950 that serve elementary students were cleared of lead risks, Milwaukee Public Schools Superintendent Brenda Cassellius announced Friday, September 5, 2025.

"We are committed to providing safe and welcoming schools to the community. Successfully addressing lead paint issues is a critical step in this work," Dr. Cassellius said. "I am grateful for the tireless efforts of our Facilities and Maintenance Services team led by Interim Chief Operating Officer Mike Turza, our contractors, and the Milwaukee Health Department."

The news comes during the first week of school for the 65,000-plus students who attend MPS. As the school year started Tuesday, 43 of the 50 elementary buildings built before 1950 were fully cleared. In the remaining seven schools, lead paint stabilization work was already completed and a limited number of spaces—typically one or two rooms in each

school, including a bathroom in one case—were closed to students and staff during final cleaning and testing. Now the work is completed, and all 50 schools are cleared. The final two schools received clearances Thursday night.

"We have recognized this need with urgency and are grateful for the work of Dr. Cassellius and her team," said Missy Zombor, president of the Milwaukee Board of School Directors. "The board will continue to provide oversight so we maintain high-quality, safe, and healthy facilities for students and staff."

This fall, MPS will shift its focus to 52 schools built between 1950 and 1978 that serve elementary students. Due to the decreased use of lead-based paint during this period, the schools in this group have lower lead risks. Surveys of the buildings also have indicated lower lead hazards. (Lead paint was banned after 1978.) Work will be done outside of school hours to minimize disruptions to students and staff. The district's goal is to complete the work by December 2025.



In Spring 2026, the district will complete final cosmetic painting in some of the first 50 schools where, to prioritize opening the schools safely by September, painting was focused on specific areas that needed to be stabilized.

Cassellius extended particular thanks to Michäél Mannan of the City of Milwaukee Health Department for his support. Since spring, Mannan served as a temporary inhouse consultant with MPS to help address the lead crisis.

"From the beginning, MHD's Home Environmen-

tal Health team has worked extensively with MPS to strengthen their facilities program around lead hazards," said Mannan, who is director of the Health Department's Home Environmental Health program.

"It's unusual for MHD to embed its own program director inside a school district, but this collaborative step was necessary to tackle the crisis from the inside out," Mannan said. "Through this partnership, MHD helped MPS develop a strong stabilization plan, provided technical oversight, and ensured

clearances met state standards. Thanks to everyone's collaborative efforts, MPS is in a much stronger position to maintain safe buildings for years to come."

Said City of Milwaukee Commissioner of Health Mike Totoraitis, "When our investigation first brought lead hazards in MPS schools to light in early 2025, the City of Milwaukee Health Department immediately stepped in to work side by side with the district to identify hazards across the district and build a comprehensive plan for renovations and ongoing maintenance.

"I'm proud of the extensive work our team has done since then to support MPS and ensure schools meet safety standards. MHD is pleased with the progress MPS made this summer to get buildings ready for the new school year, and we're confident they can continue this work to keep schools safe in the future."

Supreme Court greenlights racial profiling by ICE

The Supreme Court of the United States has ruled that Immigration and Customs Enforcement agents detain individuals without reasonable suspicion in certain cases, allowing race, language, location, and job type to be considered in immigration stops.

In a 6-3 ruling on Monday, September 8, 2025, the Supreme Court lifted a lower court order that blocked ICE (U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement) agents in Los Angeles from targeting individuals based on four factors, including ethnicity, language or accent, location, and employment type, per HuffPost. The lower court ruling was issued by U.S. District Judge Maame Ewusi-Mensah Frimpong, who said stops based on these factors violated the Fourth Amendment, which protects against unreasonable searches and seizures.

However, Justice Brett Kavanaugh cited the Immigration and Nationality Act, which allows agents to interrogate or briefly detain a person "believed to be an alien."



Kavanaugh argued Monday that in areas with a high number of undocumented immigrants, like Los Angeles, factors such as working in day labor, landscaping, or agriculture, speaking limited English, or being of Central American or Mexican descent could be used to justify brief stops.

"To be clear, apparent ethnicity alone cannot furnish reasonable suspicion," Kavanaugh wrote. "However, it can be a 'relevant factor' when considered along with other salient factors."

Kavanaugh also downplayed the Fourth Amendment concerns, saying ICE questioning of individuals would be "typically brief" and they would be "promptly" released upon proving their legal status.

The Supreme Court justice acknowledged that many undocumented immigrants come to the U.S. "to escape poverty and the lack of freedom," but concluded, "the fact remains... they are acting illegally by remaining in the United States."

Justice Sonia Sotomayor, along with Justices Elena Kagan and Ketanji Brown Jackson, issued a forceful dissent against the ruling that effectively legitimizes racial profiling by ICE.

"We should not have to live in a country where the Government can seize any-

one who looks Latino, speaks Spanish, and appears to work a low wage job," Sotomayor wrote. "Rather than stand idly by while our constitutional freedoms are lost, I dissent."

Sotomayor also accused the federal government of effectively declaring "that all Latinos, U.S. citizens or not, who work low wage jobs are fair game to be seized at any time."

The case stemmed from a Trump administration policy directing DHS to ramp up ICE operations, which has reportedly led to the detainment of both immigrants and U.S. citizens in Los Angeles. With the stay on Frimpong's order lifted, ICE agents in Los Angeles can resume using race, language, location, and job type as factors in stopping individuals.


Mrs. Ira C. Jones was strong willed, stern, always did



Money talks: how opening up can ease financial stress

Western cultures, talking about money is considered taboo. But new research from the Cornell SC Johnson College of Business challenges that notion and finds that people who regularly discuss their finances whether with family, friends or even strangers online – experience less financial anxiety over time.

Emily N. Garbinsky, associate professor at the Samuel Curtis Johnson Graduate School of Management, and her co-authors find that the more people talk about their personal finances, the better

"Many of us were taught that discussing salaries, debt or financial worries is impolite or even shameful," Garbinsky said. "But according to our research, bottling up these money worries might be making things worse."

The paper "Opening Up About Money: The Unexpected Benefits of Personal Financial Disclosure," published July 8, 2025, in Organizational Behavior and Human Decision Processes. Co-authors include Matt Meister, assistant professor at the University of San Francisco, and Joe Gladstone, assistant professor at the University of California,

San Diego.

Financial anxiety, defined as the stress and worry people feel about their finances, affects over 60 percent of adults in the U.S. and has real consequences – poor mental health, reduced job performance and even higher accident rates in some profes-

The researchers found that initiating a conversation is often the best place to start. They conducted eight studies - including surveys, experiments and analysis of nearly 1 million online posts - to understand how talking about money affects our financial stress levels. They found that sharing information about one's financial situation lowers anxiety by giving an individual a greater sense of control. Putting financial concerns into words helps organize one's thoughts and shifts the mindset from confusion to clarity, they

One of the studies asked people to talk about their finances with another person of their choosing once a week for a month. Compared to those who talked about non-financial issues, the money-talkers ended the study with less anxiety, both financial and general. What's more, people who talked about controllable topics, such as spending and saving, saw a bigger drop in anxiety than those who talked about things out of their hands, like job loss or medical bills, suggesting that what you share

The researchers found that talking about something within your financial control reduces your financial anxiety to a greater extent than talking about something outside of your financial control.

"While face-to-face conversations can help, sharing online is also effective and might be even better because digital platforms give people more time to think, write, edit and reflect on what they're saying," Garbinsky

Building on this idea, the researchers discovered that people who frequently posted about their finances in online forums used fewer anxiety-related words over time. The more they posted, the better they felt.

Despite these consistent findings across both in-person and digital communication forums, people don't seem to comprehend that talking about money helps. Many expect that talking about money will make them feel worse.

In a pilot study, the research team found that people anticipate that talking about money – as opposed to other sensitive topics, such as health, parenting or job performance – will increase their anxiety. They found the opposite to be true.

"And in a world where financial anxiety is widespread and often ignored," Garbinsky said, "it might be time to replace silence with sharing."
