Wisconsin governor orders state heath officials to issue own COVID-19 vaccine guidance amid Trump admin. changes

Current federal guidance does not recommend COVID-19 vaccines for nearly everyone as was the case in past years.

Wisconsin Gov. Tony Evers issued an executive order Monday, September 15, 2025, directing the Wisconsin Department of Health Services to issue its own COVID-19 vaccine guidance amid new federal guidance that limits their use for many Americans.

In a news release Monday, Evers accused Health and Human Services Secretary Robert F. Kennedy Jr. and the Trump administration of "inserting partisan politics into health care and the sci-

ence-based decisions of medical professionals.'

Among the directives, Evers' order tells state health officials to issue guidance on the COVID-19 vaccine and determine whether any additional measures may be necessary "to provide clarity and guidance on other routine vaccines," the news release

In past years, the federal government has recommended COVID-19 vaccines to all Americans above the age of 6

This year, the U.S. Food and Drug Administration



approved them for people age 65 and over but said they should be used only for children and younger adults who have a risk factor such as asthma or obesity.

That change came as U.S.

Health Secretary Robert F. Kennedy fired the entire Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices in June, accusing them of being too closely aligned with the companies that make the vaccines. The replacements include vaccine skeptics.

The governors of Arizona, Illinois, Maine and North Carolina on Friday joined the growing list of Democratic officials who have signed orders intended to ensure most residents can receive COVID-19 vaccines at pharmacies without individual prescriptions.

CVS Health, the biggest pharmacy chain in the U.S., says its stores are offering the shots without an individual prescription in 41 states as of midday Friday.

But the remaining states — Arizona, Florida, Georgia, Louisiana, Maine, North Carolina, Oregon, Utah and West Virginia, plus the District of Columbia — require individual prescriptions under the company's interpretation of state policies.

Arizona, Maine and North Carolina are likely to come off that list as the new orders take effect there.

If you were impacted by the early August floods and storm damage, FEMA may be able to help with financial


The application to apply for disaster aid is now open to anyone in Milwaukee, Waukesha and Washington counties, and the deadline to apply is Nov. 12.

Trump President nounced nearly \$30 million in aid late last week. But Ni-

cole Wilson, a spokesperson with FEMA says that number could change.

"That \$30 million number that we keep hearing about is just a preliminary estimate based on the assessment we did a few weeks ago. It's not a cap. I don't want people to feel that once we hit that number it's no hope for them," said Wilson.

FEMA can help with everything from furniture and clothing to appliances and



rent due to being displaced. "Fire up that furnace," said

Wilson. "If they're not working, you want to come talk to us, because we may be able to help cover some repair or replacement costs."

You can track the status of your application in your account. To apply for assistance, your application must be in before the deadline on Nov. 12.

Milwaukee County supervisor proposes end to bus service on Christmas Day to cut costs

Milwaukee County Supervisor Sheldon Wasserman has proposed a resolution that would stop bus services within the Milwaukee County Transit System (MCTS) on Christmas Day. However, some passengers, who consistently rely on the bus, even on the holiday, are not on board with the idea.

According to Wasserman, the resolution cites the Milwaukee County Department of Transportation's June 2025 report projecting a \$10.9 million shortfall in the MCTS departmental budget. Wasserman credits that to lower-than-expected passenger revenue and higher-than-budgeted wage and benefit costs.

The resolution also references 2024 ridership data showing 13,931 boardings on Christmas Day and 38,362 boardings the following day. Based on 2024 data, MCTS projects that discontinuing service on Christmas Day would save only \$133,000.

"Aligning service levels with actual ridership is a responsible step toward longterm financial stability for MCTS. Christmas Day consistently has the lowest ridership of the year, with schools, government, and most businesses closed," Wasserman

Wasserman suggests religious organizations in the area provide necessary rides for those who need it. Wasserman emphasized that employees within MCTS deserve the day off on the holiday.

"Our hard-working bus drivers deserve the chance to be home with their families. This is also a day when families, faith leaders, and neighbors should step up to help with transit needs. No one should be alone on Christmas—and that includes a transit operator alone on a

A spokesperson for MCTS shared the following state-

ment with CBS 58: "We're reviewing the Su-

pervisor's proposal. While

appreciate creative solutions to MCTS' fiscal challenges, we must ensure that riders who rely on the bus are not impacted on a day when residents and families use public transit to spend the holiday together."

Bruce Freeman, president of the Amalgamated Transit Union Local 998, told CBS 58 on Tuesday, Sept. 9, 2005, he believes the cuts on Christmas Day wouldn't make a difference in the current financial situation. He also said some MCTS employees choose to work on the holiday.

Those who consistently ride the bus are worried about what stopping services

on Christmas could mean for essential workers who need to get around, even on Christmas Day.

"I take the bus every day," said Jerry Jamerson, who consistently rides the bus from Milwaukee's north side. "I think that's a bad idea.

There's a lot of people, including myself, that needs transportation."

Wasserman said the proposal would likely be addressed by the Milwaukee County Board of Supervisors during next year's budget discussions.

Segregation in schools surges as Trump Administration scuttles desegregation orders

Over 70 years have passed since the Supreme Court ruled on Brown v. Board of Education, yet segregation in American schools is surging. In the largest 100 school districts, segregation between white and black students has increased by 64 percent since 1988. The failure to fully integrate schools has had profoundly negative impacts on students across the country, leading to academic performance gaps.

Despite the continued segregation in American schools, the Trump Administration has been fighting school desegregation plans. Recently, the justice department moved to dismiss a desegregation order in Louisiana, ending federal oversight and claiming the order was left open by mistake. This dramatic shift in approach to school desegregation efforts has raised concerns around the hundreds of desegregation orders that still exist. At a time when the country needs increased effort toward school desegregation, the Trump Administration is dis-

missing desegregation orders and going after diversity, equity, and inclusion programs.

Members of Congress have been attempting to tackle the rise of school segregation. Rep. Robert "Bobby" Scott, a Virginia Democrat, introduced the Strength in Diversity Act of 2025, which creates a federal grant program for promoting racial and socioeconomic diversity in schools. This legislation would provide federal dollars to fund local desegregation efforts based on specific community needs. This act rewards desegregation efforts and gives communities the opportunity to design unique desegregation plans.

First Focus on Children organized and hosted a Congressional briefing that addressed the importance of discussing diverse viewpoints in schools, accommodating the needs of all students, and creating a welcoming school environment for everyone. The briefing highlighted the power of school belonging and inclusive cultures in public schools.


Dr. Emily Penner from UC Irvine presented her finding that coursework centering ethnicity improved grade point averages, high school graduation rates, and attendance for all students, not just those from minority backgrounds. She found that 8th grade students in San Francisco schools that were automatically enrolled in ethnic studies coursework

were 16 percentage points more likely to graduate from high school than students who weren't automatically enrolled.

Dr. Sophia Rodriguez from New York University emphasized that Latino youth report lower levels of belonging than their peers, and that educators must better address racial harassment by those who make the school environment harmful. She emphasized the need for schools to make formal connections with local organizations,

such as community centers, which are effective in fostering a sense of belonging for Latino and immigrant youth.

Despite the rise in segregation in American schools and the continued need for supporting students of color, the Trump Administration is going after diversity, equity, and inclusion efforts that aim to support all students. It is critical now more than ever to support the need to create an inclusive and diverse environment in schools.

Attack on childhood vaccines? Florida attempts to eliminate all mandates

Florida is set to become the first U.S. state to strip all school vaccine mandates, a move experts warn could worsen health disparities and leave children — especially those in Black communities more vulnerable to dis-

Florida Surgeon General Joseph Ladapo announced the plan this week, saying the state Department of Health would work with Governor Ron DeSantis' office to repeal mandates encoded in state law.

"Every last one of them is wrong and drips with disdain and slavery," Ladapo said.

Florida officials plan to try to end all childhood vaccine mandates, labeling it as a move for "medical freedom," while some health experts and educators warn it could increase disease risk and disrupt school safety.

Health equity at risk

If fully enacted, Florida's decision could remove criti-



cal public health protections that currently help reduce disease in underserved communities.

Health experts point to disparities in vaccination coverage. In fact, national data show Black children (66.5 percent) are significantly less likely than white children (75.5 percent) to have received routine childhood vaccines by age 35 months.

A Centers for Disease Control and Prevention analysis of children born during 2020–2021 points to persistent gaps: non-Hispanic Black and Hispanic children had lower coverage of key vaccines like DTaP, PCV, rotavirus, and influenza than white children.

In Florida, kindergarten vaccination rates are already below the national average, with just 88.7 percent of kindergartners vaccinated in 2025, compared with more than 92 percent nationally, The Associated Press report-



Exemptions rising amid concern

Florida also saw a rise in religious exemptions—6.4 percent statewide, and up to 15 percent in some counties raising alarm among public health officials. Dr. Richard Besser, president and CEO of the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation and former acting CDC director, called the plan "frightening."

'As a pediatrician, and as a parent, it's absolutely frightening, the idea that children could go to school and be unvaccinated," he told ABC News. "That puts

them at risk and others around them who may underlying have medical conditions."

Why this matters for Black families

Black children are at higher risk of hospitalization from infectious diseases. School vaccine mandates help reduce that Removing them could leave Black children — who often face barriers to health care, including transportation, insurance gaps, and fewer pediatric services — more exposed to outbreaks like measles and whooping cough.

COVID-19 vaccination programs saved more than 18.5 million hospitalizations and 3.2 million deaths between December 2020 and November 2022 — bene fits that disproportionately helped vulnerable communities of color.

Political implications

DeSantis said some mandates might be removed immediately; others will require legislative approval. Ladapo has been a vocal critic of COVID-19 vaccines, earlier advising against vaccinating healthy children and even calling such vaccines "poison," despite FDA assurances of safety and efficacy.

Vaccination has been proven to prevent deaths. A 2024 World Health Organization study estimated vaccines prevented 154 million deaths worldwide over five decades, including 101 million infants — 60 percent of those lives saved were thanks to the measles vaccine, according to multiple news outlets.

Where families can find

Public health leaders urge families, especially in Black communities, to consult trusted sources:


- The CDC offers comprehensive vaccine guidance on schedules, side effects, and exemptions.
- Local health departments and federally qualified health centers provide reliable, accessible services.
- Pediatricians remain critical for vaccine counseling and catch-up immunizations.

Families should be cautious of misinformation spreading online. Clear, community-based outreach is essential to ensure vaccine coverage doesn't fall further.


For now, Florida parents — and particularly those in Black communities — must navigate a shifting vaccination landscape that could lower protections for their children.
