




# Brewers host Milwaukee's 'Largest Sober Tailgate'

# Milwaukee mayor proposes \$2 billion budget with fee hikes, tax increase

Plan includes 4 percent increase in user fees, \$10 vehicle registration fee hike, and 3 percent property tax increase to address pension costs and operational expenses

Milwaukee Mayor Cavalier Johnson presented his proposed \$2 billion 2026 budget to the Common Council on Tuesday in Council Chambers, addressing a \$100 million gap driven by rising pension costs and increased operating expenses.

The budget proposal outlines three strategies to address the funding shortfall. User fees for services, including trash collection, snow removal and street lighting, would increase by 4 percent. Vehicle registration fees would rise by \$10 to \$40, and the property tax levy would increase approximately 3 percent, resulting in a \$67 increase for median-val-



ued homes in Milwaukee.

"Obviously, we continue to face the fiscal challenges that we have faced for the past number of years. But I feel really good about where we are, and I'm looking forward to working with the council over the course of the next month," Johnson said.

The police department's budget is set at \$310- million for 2026, approximately \$4-million less than 2025. However, this figure could change as the police union and city are in arbitration

over new pay contracts.

"Milwaukee is offering a raise to the Milwaukee Police Association, 9 percent. So there is no daylight there. However, if the union were to get what they talked about, that would put a significant gap and increase a significant gap in our budget to the tune of millions of dollars," Johnson said.

Alderman Scott Spiker expressed disappointment with the proposal, suggesting cost-cutting measures, including reviewing the city's streetcar operations, which he said costs over \$4-million annually to run.

"We have a streetcar that's been costing us over \$4-mil-

lion to run each year, and the transportation fund ain't the piggy bank it used to be. So we'd have more opportunity to get money out of those funds for our streets if we weren't saddled with the albatross call the streetcar," Spiker said.

The budget includes investments in housing and a proposed new library on the city's northwest side. The mayor's office anticipates no layoffs of city workers.

Milwaukee residents can provide feedback on the proposed budget during a public hearing scheduled for 6:30 p.m. Öct. 6 at Milwaukee City Hall.

# MKE Common Council passes new fines for street takeovers

Sponsors of the legislation want more enforcement from Milwaukee police to stop street takeovers

Crowds and cars have taken over streets and intersections across Milwaukee in 2025. Milwaukee police responded to more than 200 street take-

Now, Milwaukee Common Council Members have passed new fines for spectators and participants in street takeovers.

The legislation states spectators can receive a \$500-\$1,000 fine, operators or organizers can receive a \$400-\$1,000 fine, and passengers of vehicles can receive anywhere from \$300-\$1,000. Plus, the municipal court can make someone do community service related to traffic safety, the legislation states. Repeat offenders can also be fined \$1,000 for getting caught more than once in the same year.

Alderman Scott Spiker and Council President Jose Perez say fines are not enough; enforcement must be made.

"As powerful as this legislation might be, it doesn't address the core problem, which is that we are not arresting people for spinning donuts and circles," Spiker said. "That is an enforcement issue."

"There are several ordinances on the books that are violated in every street takeover," Perez said. "For me, it's a matter of enforcement. Another tool, we'll see what tickets come out of future street takeovers.'

Milwaukee police did not respond to questions regarding enforcement Tuesday. Instead, saying MPD does have a task force in place to stop street takeovers.

"MPD appreciates the efforts of our elected officials to help provide additional tools to address these events of reckless and disruptive behavior. If you have any information on planned street takeovers, please contact ifc@milwaukee.gov or the P3 Tipps App," Milwaukee police wrote in a statement.

Milwaukee police previously told the council's public safety and health committee the task force to stop takeovers was paused on Labor Day Weekend when roughly 15 street takeovers happened across the city. Officers were instead focusing on Water Street due to a busy weekend, Milwaukee Police Chief



of Staff Heather Hough told aldermen.

After Labor Day Weekend, police said they towed four cars and issued 26 citations for things like illegal window tint, discharging fireworks, spectating an illegal street race, and impeding traffic.

Plus, they arrested and the district attorney's office



charged one man, Aarion Brown, after a street takeover and second-degree recklessly endangering safety, both felonies. Police say he sped away from them at speeds of more than 120 mph after a street takeover near 91st Street and Mill Road. Milwaukee Mayor Cavalier Johnson will sign the new







The path to treat those issues with forgiveness can be complicated and not easy; as you may forgive who caused you those feelings of emotional trauma; but it does not absolve them necessarily of what they did. This may be a sticking point for you (as you may ponder how much more responsibility do you have in the matter). (2) However, after you forgive them; it maybe best to let the responsibility of that/their burden of absolution be upon them (as in help via counselling etc.); and for your sake the positive end result maybe you no longer experience those negative feelings; which may allow you to again relate positively with others; an even repair past fractured relationships that may have fell victim to those negative influences.

# Flu prevention 101: Four ways to reduce your risk

The flu, a contagious respiratory illness, can affect anyone. Every year, millions of people get sick, and while many recover, others face complications that can lead to hospitalization. The good news? With the right flu prevention strategies, you can lower your chances of getting infected and help protect those around you. This guide breaks down everything you need to know about reducing your risk and staying healthy during flu season.

#### Why flu prevention matters

The flu spreads more easily than most people realize. You don't have to feel sick to pass it on. In fact, you can spread the virus up to a day before symptoms appear and continue spreading it for five to seven days after becoming ill.

#### Recognizing flu symptoms

- Nasal congestion or run-



ny nose – Like a cold but usually worse.

- Extreme fatigue Intense tiredness that lingers after other symptoms fade.

Most people recover within a week or two, but some, especially older adults or those with chronic health conditions, may take longer to fully regain their strength.

#### Flu in children

Flu prevention in children is critical. Kids under five, and especially under two, face a higher risk of serious complications such as:

- Pneumonia
- Severe dehydration
- Worsening of asthma or chronic illnesses
- Ear infections and sinus problems
- Rare but serious brain-related complications

Since children often spread germs easily in schools and daycare settings, parents should prioritize flu prevention through vaccination, hygiene, and quick medical attention when symptoms appear.

#### Who faces the highest risk?

Some groups are more vulnerable to severe illness and should take extra flu prevention steps:

- Children under five (especially under two)
- Pregnant individuals
- People with chronic health issues, such as:
- Asthma or COPD
- Heart disease
- Diabetes
- Kidney or liver diseaseObesity
- Weelzer
- Weakened immune systems
- Kids and teens on longterm aspirin therapy

For these groups, flu prevention can make the difference between a short illness and a medical emergency.

# Top flu prevention strategies

You can't completely eliminate your risk, but you can dramatically reduce it with the following flu prevention methods:

#### 1. Get your flu shot

The annual flu vaccine is the most effective flu prevention tool available. Because flu viruses change each year, getting vaccinated every fall is essential. Even if you catch the flu after vaccination, symptoms are usually milder, and complications are less likely.

### 2. Wash your hands frequently

Handwashing may seem simple, but it's a cornerstone of flu prevention. Wash with soap and warm water for at least 20 seconds, especially after coughing, sneezing, or touching shared surfaces. If soap isn't handy, use an alcohol-based sanitizer.

#### 3. Practice healthy habits

Your daily routine can strengthen your body's defenses:

- Sleep well (seven to nine hours per night)
- Eat a nutrient-rich diet with fruits, vegetables, and lean proteins
- Stay active with regular exercise
- Drink plenty of water to stay hydrated

While these steps aren't a guarantee, they support your immune system and boost your flu prevention efforts.

#### 4. Limit germ spread

If you're sick, protect others by:

- Śtaying home from work or school
- Covering your mouth and nose when coughing or sneezing
- Disposing of tissues immediately
- Avoiding close contact with vulnerable individuals

Bonus: Seek medical atten-

#### tion early

If you develop flu symptoms, especially if you're in a high-risk group, contact your doctor. Antiviral medications can reduce the severity and length of illness if taken within 48 hours of symptom onset. Quick action is an important part of flu prevention and complication manage-

According to the American Lung Association, you should seek medical advice about the flu in these situations:


- For your yearly flu shot


