Children were excited to see their teachers and friends, start a fresh school year, and get ready for hands-on learning. Families watched the excitement, waved good-bye to children, and even shed a few tears as their little ones started a new adventure.

Milwaukee students return to school after lead remediation work completed

Thousands of students in the Milwaukee area are set to return to school Tuesday, with many attending classes for the first time since lead remediation work was completed at their schools.

Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. School is among more than 40 schools cleared of lead hazards, according to Milwaukee Public Schools. The school serves students from 4K through eighth grade.

Thousands of students and their schedules were disrupt-

ed last spring after lead concerns forced schools to close. Since then, MPS and the City of Milwaukee Health Department spent the summer cleaning up and repainting schools.

Common sources of lead hazards include lead-based paint, which can be found in any building, especially those built before 1978; lead-contaminated dust; contaminated soil; and lead in plumbing.

Lead remediation is an intensive process of cleaning,

repainting, and replacing materials. The building at Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. School has been cleared for students, families, and faculty.

Once each school is cleaned, the Milwaukee Health Department has the final say in clearing a school to reopen. More information on the MPS lead action plan is available online, including a full list of schools that have been cleared.



Milwaukee Brewers and fans pay tribute to the late Bob Uecker







On Sunday, August 24, 2025, the Milwaukee Brewers paid tribute to franchise icon Bob Uecker with a ceremony worthy of his tongue-in-cheek nickname, "Mr. Baseball."

The .200-hitting former backup catcher, who went on to broadcast Brewers games for 54 years and become a beloved national celebrity was honored by a sellout crowd at American Family Field on Sunday, Aug. 24, as a cast of dignitaries spanning the worlds of baseball and entertainment gathered to celebrate his life.

An hour-long program emceed by Hall of Fame broadcaster Bob Costas was the centerpiece of Sunday's ceremony, highlighted by four video segments recounting Uecker's life with clips of some of his best and most memorable moments.

In addition to the on-field tributes – from Costas, former MLB commissioner Bud Selig, principal team owner Mark Attanasio and Brewers Hall of Famer Ted Simmons – there were many others throughout the ballpark.

There was an illuminated sign above the entrance to the press box, the newly renamed "Bob Uecker Broadcast Center."

Alongside the retired numbers of Brewers greats, there was a microphone icon accompanying Uecker's name, and artifacts from Uecker's career as a player and broadcaster were sprinkled throughout the stadium.

A Child Watch Coda

The original Children's Defense Fund logo came from a drawing I saw in a gallery window during a walk through Cambridge, Massachusetts, where CDF had its beginning. The artwork was by five-year-old Maria Coté, and shows a bright sun shining on a tiny boat adrift on a very wide sea. Above the boat in Maria's handwriting is the ancient fisherman's prayer: "Dear Lord, be good to me. The sea is so wide and my boat is so small."

In 1974, when CDF completed its first report, I asked permission from Maria's mother to use the drawing on the cover. A few years later, after someone suggested CDF ought to have a logo, I looked at Maria's drawing hanging above my desk, and realized it reflected the Children's Defense Fund mission more truthfully than any abstract piece prepared by the graphic arts firm we'd consulted ever could. Maria's mother agreed to our trademarking her daughter's piece.

After 40 years, today's column will be the last in the



weekly Child Watch® series. Today is not yet the conclusion to the reasons this column began, nor to the need to stay vigilant. Seven reasons black men are getting prostate cancer earlier and earlier

It's a problem with not nearly enough attention. Prostate cancer hits men hard all over the world—it's one of the biggest threats out there. But lately, something very concerning has been showing up in the numbers: black men are getting hit with this diagnosis at younger ages than ever, and the stats are brutal and clear as day.

Black men don't just have a higher chance of getting prostate cancer; they're dealing with the nastier, faster-acting forms way earlier than most. Seven major culprits are behind this, and they're backed by real science, painting a picture that's tough to ignore.

1. Genetic and biological factors

Genes and biology are major factors among black men with this disease, and it's happening younger and younger.

Some studies, like one in Nature Genetics, found abnormalities in the DNA—specifically in a spot called 8q24—that show up more in guys with African roots, acting like a green light for prostate cancer to rev up early.

Plus, higher testosterone levels, pretty common in black men, might also be increasing cancer cell growth, stacking the odds against them over time.

Of course, there are always ways to stay on top of these issues, and they include getting regular screening and learning more about your family genetic history.

2. More aggressive tumors Then there are the tumors.

The tumors black men face aren't just more frequent—they're more aggressive. The American Cancer Society's got the grim scoop: black men are 1.7 times more likely to get diagnosed and 2.1 times more likely to lose their lives to it compared to White

Some research has even found higher Gleason scores of seven or above for many young black men, indicating a more aggressive cancer.

In other words, increased cancer development, more resistance to treatments, and a greater chance of metastasizing.

3. Earlier risk factors

Risks like packing on pounds, eating junk, or barely moving are three of the most common that black men should consider. They're also, thankfully, some of the most basic changes we can make to our daily lives, regardless of race or risk factors.



In fact, the CDC has found higher obesity and diabetes rates among many in their 30s and 40s, which is a general cause of increased inflammation. These risk factors may also contribute to hormonal shifts that then further worsens one's prostate health.

According to one study from Cancer Epidemiology, Biomarkers & Prevention, signs of metabolic syndrome—obesity, high blood pressure, and so on—were detected at a higher rate in black men in their 30s and 40s than in other races.

To put it bluntly: it is the perfect storm for cancer to start brewing, long before anyone's even thinking about it.

4. Limited healthcare access

Healthcare is a nightmare for too many black men, and most of the time it has nothing to do with their personal health. It's rather a sign of systemic and structural inequalities. Combined with socioeconomic differences, and the lack of quality healthcare can certainly lead to higher rates of undetected or later-treated cancers.

According to the National

Institute on Minority Health and Health Disparities, a lot of insurance is spotty or nonexistent for many black men, which makes regular doctor visits or early tests unlikely.

If there is a lack of urologists and oncologists in certain communities, this can dramatically affect the availability of cancer screening, prevention, and treatment.

5. Environmental and lifestyle influences

Nasty substances like pesticides or factory fumes—all tied to cancer—lurk around many inner cities and socioeconomically disadvantaged communities. Thanks to old, unfair setups, and food deserts, many black communities are also flooded with unhealthy, processed foods.

Research has repeatedly linked high-fat, low-nutrient diets to prostate cancer in black men.

It's a slow burn that shoves the disease right into their younger years, but fortunately, is one that can largely be preventable. Measures should be taken to combat the safety hazards, whether they're environmental pollutants, toxins in the food, or a general lack of healthy alternatives.

6. Lower screening rates

PSA tests—a simple blood check—can catch prostate cancer before it's a monster, but black men are missing out.

Research shows that black men are roughly 20 percent less likely to get that test, thanks to distrust, confusion, or empty pockets. As a result, cancers that may be developing during the 30s or 40s stay off the radar until they're advanced or require urgent treatment.

Fortunately, simply increasing awareness can make it a lot easier to detect potential prostate problems. Black men in particular should get a PSA test by at least 40, or even younger if they are prone to the disease due to family history.

This is one of the simplest things that can be done but it's not!

7. Family history and inherited risk

Family history's another kick in the gut—prostate cancer loves to stick around in black men's bloodlines. Roughly five to 10 percent of cases come from genes like BRCA1 and BRCA2, which can lead to dangerous mutations in men.

According to some studies, black men with a dad or brother who's been impacted are more likely to face the disease at a younger age.

This whole problem—black men getting prostate cancer younger—comes from a mix of genes, biology, tough breaks, and rough surroundings. The numbers don't lie: higher built-in risk,

more aggressive tumors, and premature problems. And then, of course, the simple fact that too many men are still unaware of prostate cancer risks.

All you have to do is consider the preoccupations of everyday life. Whether it's raising kids, holding down a job, dealing with loved ones, or anything else, most men are not thinking about prostate cancer or getting regularly screened.


In communities where competent healthcare is absent, the problem is compounded.

Fortunately, turning this around isn't some far-off dream—it's doable with the right moves. Earlier tests that actually reach black men, not just sit on a guideline page, could change the game, and fairer healthcare—more doctors, better coverage—would stop cancer from getting a head start.

Messages that hit home, speaking straight to black families about risks and options, could shift the tide as well.

At the end of the day, it's all about action. Science knows why this is happening; now it's on the world to step up and do something about it.

Five powerful secrets from the world's longest-living people

What in the world are they doing?

All over our planet, people are living long, not just long, but in many cases, well into their late 90s and even 100s. Although these pockets of centenarians may just seem like lucky folks with great genetics, it's actually more than that

Known as "Blue Zones," these longevity hotspots can be found across the globe. Whether it's Okinawa, Japan; Sardinia, Italy; Nicoya, Costa Rica; or even certain locations in California, the reality is clear as day: some people, in some places, are living very long.

But what's the reason for

Let's get to the bottom of this once and for all, so you can start applying these amazing secrets to your own vital, long-enjoyed life!

1. Move naturally every day

It may sound simple, but across all known Blue Zones, daily exercise is key. But here's the thing. It's not about grueling workouts, running marathons, or blowing out your muscles at the gym. Instead, the long-living folks of these locations simply do natural movement.

What are 'natural' movements? Simple, they're every-day things like walking, gardening, or even stretching. For instance, in Sardinia, shepherds walk miles daily through hilly terrain to tend their flocks. In Okinawa, older adults love to garden or practice tai chi, blending free-flowing movements with nature.

Why do these activities help? They're useful for one primary reason. They're low-impact, they can be done consistently, and they keep the body strong and flexible without overdoing it.

Just think of our ancestors. They walked long distances, worked the land, and often danced in communal celebrations. None of which requires a gym membership! So start simple. Take a 20-minute walk around your neighborhood with a friend or family member if you get bored. Go to a local park. Grow some herbs like basil or veggies like collard greens. Even if your space is limited, you can start a small pot on your balcony or backyard.

And finally, every morning, do some light stretching. It's all about avoiding overcomplication and embracing what feels natural. Many traditional African dance movements are the perfect recipe for feeling young and spry!

2. Eat local plants and meats and avoid sugars

Again, the trick here isn't to overdo it. The diets of Blue Zone residents are remarkably simple yet nutrient-rich. Many of these in-

dividuals eat what is locally grown and produced. We're talking about foods that are truly farm-to-table. They're seasonal and minimally processed, like beans, greens, and root vegetables.

Take Costa Rica, for example, which embraces a natural diet full of corn, beans, squash, and small amounts of pork and eggs. Meanwhile, in parts of Japan, the superfood seaweed and sweet potatoes are a common staple. The important part of all these meals, of course, is the absence of added sugars. This, over time, means lower risks of chronic diseases, such as diabetes, hypertension, heart disease, and even cancer.

For some practical steps to reduce sugar, swap sugary sodas for water or herbal teas like hibiscus. Go big on local produce where possible, finding farmers' markets, online organic grocers, and various community-based stores. Instead of processed meats like sausages, prioritize lean proteins such as baked chicken or fish, and for a little extra seasoning, toss on spices like turmeric or garlic for flavor and anti-inflammatory perks.

3. Build a close-knit circle

As the saying goes, keep a close circle.

It's easy nowadays to try to be 'friends' with everyone. After all, we get overwhelmed with social media, we zip around on our smart devices, and we're constantly interacting with people who move in and out of our orbit.

But what about those deeper, more meaningful, healthier relationships? If you look at Blue Zone residents, especially in places like Greece, it's all about finding very close and tightly-knit relationships. These individuals will often gather for coffee or wine, sharing stories and letting loose. Oftentimes, faith is a great uniter. People can enjoy potlucks, build emotional resilience, and reduce stress all at once.

For Black communities, this 'secret' may resonate even more deeply, especially given the emphasis on family, church, and community. Whether it's a weekly game night, book club with friends, or a church group that prays together, these social circles can go a long way.

In fact, research indicates that strong social ties can lower blood pressure and boost mental health, key factors in longevity. Not only can these shared experiences lift your spirit, but they can also create a safety net for life's ups and downs – which we all need!

4. Use mindfulness to manage stress

Chronic stress is certainly a silent killer and has been linked to everything from heart disease to diabetes and weakened immunity. But in Blue Zones, residents counter their stressors with mindfulness. In Okinawa, people practice ikigai, a reflective process of finding joy in small moments. In Sardinia, daily naps and leisurely meals allow for mental unwinding.

Remember: mindfulness is not necessarily about long hours of meditation. It's about intentional moments of calm. Whether you're starting your day with a five-minute gratitude journal or merely relaxing with friends and family on a sunny Saturday morning, take a deep breath and just exist.

And speaking of breathing, deep-breathing exercises before bed are proven to lower stress hormones. It's not difficult. Start by inhaling for four counts, hold for four, and exhale for eight. Apps like *Calm or Headspace* even provide guided meditations, so if you're looking to carve out small moments to center yourself, the options are all around you!

5. Find a sense of purpose in your everyday life

Life is all about purpose.

Think about many of the mental health conditions that afflict us. Many times, we feel depressed or anxious or 'stuck' because we don't know what we're supposed to be doing. How we're supposed to feel. Who we are ultimately trying to be...

When it comes to Blue Zone centenarians, a clear sense of purpose is key. For many ancient cultures, that

purpose comes from raising a family successfully. In other areas, it's about promoting the long-standing traditions of the community, usually through festivals and celebrations.

Point simply, purpose gives life meaning, and in many Black communities, purpose is about legacy-building. This can manifest in many ways, especially if it's centered around things like mentoring youth, preserving cultural traditions, or advocating for racial justice and equality.

So how can you serve others?

Volunteer at a local school, get involved with a community garden, or just share your expertise and experiences with those younger than you. Your purpose doesn't have to be something groundbreaking or grandiose. Rather than that, it's about finding joy in contributing to something bigger than yourself. Reflect on what makes you feel alive – and live it!




