THE HISTORY OF THE MILWAUKEE TIMES

The Milwaukee Times Weekly Newspaper was established in October of 1981. Originally called “*The Christian Times*,” the paper focused on the vibrant faith community here in Milwaukee. The paper was founded by journalist the late Nathan Conyers, former nurse and community leader the late Louvenia Johnson, and local business man the late Luther Golden. Within its first year of publication, the paper grew in appeal to cover more general community news and was renamed *The Milwaukee Times Weekly Newspaper*. *The Christian Times* remains as a standing feature section to this day.

On June 1, 1992, *The Milwaukee Times Weekly Newspaper* and *EconoPrint Copying, Typesetting and Printing Centers* entered into a partnership agreement. On that day, *The Milwaukee Times Weekly Newspaper* also moved into its new offices at 2214-2216 N. Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Drive. In June 1999, the *Milwaukee Times* was able to purchase its own location and moved to 1936-38 N. Dr. Martin Luther King Drive. Eventually the Times would drop the *EconoPrint* name and become the *Milwaukee Times Printing and Publishing, Co.*

In March of 2020 the COVID-19 pandemic struck the world and Milwaukee went into lock down. As an essential service, due to the fact it was a media and printing outlet, *the Milwaukee Times* was allowed to continue business in the community. Refocusing our efforts on providing both entertainment and information for our readership to help guide them through this difficult world crisis.

In August 2021, the Conyers family sold the *Milwaukee Times* to local business man and faith leader the Rev. Harold D. Turner, Sr., starting a new era for publication. *The Times* would move once more to 2238 N. Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. in order to be more centrally located in the Bronzeville business district.

Over the years the Milwaukee Times has weathered many changes. But one thing always remained, our commitment to our readership and our community to bring them quality and honest news and information both locally and from around the world.
