ing mental health challenges. More than just a program, it serves as a platform to empower individuals, strengthen personal well-being, and inspire hope for a brighter, healthier future.



## Brewers beat Chicago Cubs to win NLDS, move on to face the LA Dodgers for NLCS title


















On Saturday, October 11, 2025, the Milwaukee Brewers beat the Chicago Cubs 3-1 in the final game of the National League Division Series (NLDS) at American Family Field. After the club's first two wins at home, the series shifted to the Cub's home turf at Wrigley Field where the Brewers would suffer back to back losses tying the series 2-2. So the October 11 game would not only be the tie-breaker game but the win for the series as well as who would go on to the National League Championship Series (NLCS).

William Contreras and Andrew Vaughn each hit go-ahead solo home runs and Brice Turang shrugged off a miserable series to mash a huge insurance shot while five Brewers pitchers -- including All-Star closer Trevor Megill as the starter and a huge dose of rookies Jacob Misiorowski and Chad Patrick -- allowed only six baserunners while cobbling their way to 27 outs. Abner Uribe gets Carson Kelly to ground out securing Milwaukee's Game 5 win over the Cubs at 3-1 sending the Brewers to the NLCS Series where they will face the LA Dodgers.

## Soul legend D'Angelo, 51, dies after private battle with pancreatic cancer

Neo-soul legend and "Brown Sugar" hitmaker D'Angelo has died after being diagnosed with pancreatic cancer, a source confirms to *PEOPLE* magazine. He

D'Angelo (born Michael Eugene Archer) died in New York City on Tuesday, October 14, 2025.

"He was in hospice for two weeks but had been in the hospital for months," the source told *PEOPLE* of the

"The shining star of our family has dimmed his light for us in this life," the singer's family told *PEOPLE* in a statement. "After a prolonged and courageous battle with cancer, we are heartbroken to announce that Michael D'Angelo Archer, known to his fans around the world as D'Angelo, has been called home, departing this life today, October 14, 2025."

The statement continued: "We are saddened that he can only leave dear memories with his family, but we are eternally grateful for the legacy of extraordinarily mov-


ing music he leaves behind. We ask that you respect our privacy during this difficult time but invite you all join us in mourning his passing while also celebrating the gift of song that he has left for the world."

DJ Premier, who collaborated with D'Angelo on the 1998 track "Devil's Pie," shared a post via *X* (formally Twitter) on Oct. 14 lamenting the news.

"Such a sad loss to the passing of D'angelo. We have so many great times. Gonna miss you so much. Sleep Peacefully D' Love You KING," DJ Premier wrote.

The Richmond-born son of a Pentecostal minister began playing the piano at the age of 3, and by 5 years old D'Angelo was playing the instrument with his father at church. A few years later, he began playing the piano at his grandfather's Pentecostal church.

Growing up, he and his two cousins formed the group Three of a Kind and began performing at local talent shows. By 16, he formed another band called Michael Archer and Precise with his



brother, Luther.

That year, D'Angelo landed a slot during Amateur Night at the Apollo, where he sang "Feel the Fire" by Peabo Bryson. While he didn't win at the time, he returned to the stage the following year to perform "Rub You the Right Way" by Johnny Gill in 1991 and took the first place.

With his monetary prize, he returned to Richmond, bought a four-track recorder and started writing what would become most of the songs that made up his 1995 debut album Brown Sugar. Brown Sugar peaked at No. 4 on the U.S. Billboard Top R&B Albums chart went platinum within a year of its release. It also earned D'Angelo four Grammy Award nominations.

In 2000, D'Angelo released his sophomore album Voodoo, which peaked at No. 1 on the U.S. Billboard Top R&B Albums chart and the U.S. Billboard 200 chart. The album also won a Grammy Award for Best R&B Album and his song "Untitled (How Does It Feel)" received Best Male R&B Vocal Performance, along with a nomination for Best R&B Song.

As he became more regarded as a sex symbol, D'Angelo struggled with drug and alcohol addiction. He was arrested in 2005 and charged with possession of cocaine and marijuana and driving while intoxicated. A week after being sentenced in September of that year, he was involved in a car accident, and was rumored to be critically in-

While D'Angelo continued collaborating and performing throughout the years, he didn't release his third studio album, the acclaimed Black Messiah, until 2014. The album peaked at No. 1 on Billboard's U.S. Indie Store Album Sales and U.S. Top R&B/Hip-Hop Albums charts. It also won a Grammy Award for Best R&B Album and is considered a modern neo-soul masterpiece.

Throughout his career, D'Angelo collaborated with artists including Questlove, Common, Q-Tip, J Dilla, Lauryn Hill, Raphael Saadiq and Angie Stone.

In 2024, D'Angelo collaborated alongside Jay-Z on the track "I Want You Forever," which was featured on The Book of Clarence soundtrack. In a 2024 interview with Rolling Stone's Music Now podcast, Saadiq had also confirmed that D'Angelo was working on new music.

## Supreme Court takes up challenge to Voting Rights Act that could affect control of Congress

The Supreme Court is taking up a major Republican-led challenge to the Voting Rights Act, the centerpiece legislation of the civil rights movement, that could gut a key provision of the law that prohibits racial discrimination in redistricting.

The justices on Wednesday are hearing arguments for the second time in a case over Louisiana's congressional map, which has two majority black districts. A ruling for the state could open the door for legislatures to redraw congressional maps across the South, potentially boosting Republican electoral prospects by eliminating majority black and latino seats that tend to favor Democrats.

A mid-decade battle over congressional redistricting already is playing out across the nation, after President Donald Trump began urging Texas and other Republican-controlled states to redraw their lines to make it easier for the GOP to hold its narrow majority in the U.S. House of Representatives.

The court's conservative majority has been skeptical of considerations of race, most recently ending affirmative action in college admissions. Twelve years ago, the court took a sledgehammer to another pillar of the landmark



voting law that required states with a history of racial discrimination to get approval in advance from the Justice Department or federal judges before making election-related changes.

The court has separately given state legislatures wide berth to gerrymander for political purposes, subject only to review by state supreme courts. If the court now weakens or strikes down the law's section 2, states would not be bound by any limits in how they draw electoral districts, a result that is expected to lead to extreme gerrymandering by whichever party is in power at the state level.

Just two years ago, the court, by a 5-4 vote, affirmed a ruling that found a likely violation of the Voting Rights Act in a similar case over Al-

abama's congressional map. Chief Justice John Roberts and Justice Brett Kavanaugh joined their three more liberal colleagues in the outcome.

That decision led to new districts in both states that sent two more black Democrats to Congress.

Now, though, the court has asked the parties to answer a fundamental question: "Whether the state's intentional creation of a majority-minority second congressional district violates the Fourteenth or Fifteenth Amendments to the U.S. Constitution."

In the first arguments in the Louisiana case in March, Roberts sounded skeptical of the second majority-Black district, which last year elected Democratic Rep. Cleo Fields. Roberts described the district as a "snake" that stretches more than 200 miles to link parts of the Shreveport, Alexandria, Lafayette and Baton Rouge ar-

The court fight over Louisiana's congressional districts has lasted three years.

state's Republican-dominated legislature drew a new congressional map in 2022 to account for population shifts reflected in the 2020 census. But the changes effectively maintained the status quo of five Republican-leaning majority white districts and

## Money for college is available—fill out the FAFSA for Fall 2027

Cruz, and UWM Chancellor Thomas Gibson, encouraged students to submit their FAFSA as soon as possible.

All MPS families should be aware that completion of

the FAFSA is a graduation requirement for the Class of 2026. Filling out the FAF-SA often shows students that college can be affordable through grants and loans and opens a pathway to college or technical school. More information and the application link are available at m**psmke.** com/FAFSA. When filling out the application, be sure to click on the link for the 2026-27 school year.

Families and students who have questions about the FAFSA or the graduation requirement should meet with a high school counselor or College and Career Center advisor to learn more. After a meeting, families who are still unable to submit the FAFSA may request a waiver for this graduation requirement.

## Substance use and misuse prevention month

October is Substance Use and Misuse Prevention Month, the perfect time to check in with yourself and reevaluate your relationship with alcohol and other drugs. In difficult times, the desire to drown your sorrows in excessive amounts of alcohol can seem appealing, but continuously turning to tequila or vodka as a coping mechanism can have longterm consequences.

## A note on language: use vs.

Substance use is as simple as it sounds: using alcohol or other drugs. People may use substances for a number of reasons, including pain management, stress relief, or socialization. Substance misuse, however, reflects the difference between healthy and unhealthy use.

Misuse can refer to binge drinking, using prescription drugs in any way other than prescribed, or repeated use of a substance even when it's causing you harm.

## What you can do

Prevention education builds critical life and social skills, including decisionmaking, peer pressure resistance, and coping with stress. And it all begins with a conversation. Whether you're a parent, teacher, or mentor, talking to the young person in your life about alcohol and other drugs doesn't have to be scary. According to Get Smart About Drugs, the following opportunities can

serve as teaching moments:

- If you see your young person smoking, have an open conversation with them about why they're using commercial tobacco.
- While watching a movie or TV show, ask your youth if they think it makes using drugs look
- If you see an interesting news story that involves substances, discuss it openly.

In addition, you can go beyond talking to acting to prevent substance misuse. For example, you can lock up or safely store your medication so that it can't be used by anyone else. You can also get rid of unwanted medication by taking it to a pharmacy,

which should have a takeback program.

And if you are concerned that your own substance use is turning into misuse, help is available. Contact 211 for substance use treatment and recovery services that are right for you. Asking for help is a sign of strength, not

## Why we need to talk about fibroids—and stop normalizing the pain

Uterine fibroids are one of the most common reproductive health conditions—yet they remain shrouded in silence, stigma, and misinformation. Even though up to 80 percent of women will develop fibroids at some point in their lives, the condition is still widely misunderstood and often goes undiagnosed until symptoms become se-

So, why does a condition this common remain hidden in plain sight? BlackDoctor spoke with Eve LePage, Reproductive Health Specialist at Clue, a science-based, data-driven menstrual and reproductive health app, to discuss what we can do to change the conversation.

#### Why fibroids remain a "silent" condition

Fibroids often don't cause symptoms, which means many people never know they have them unless discovered during imaging for another reason. If they aren't causing issues, they usually don't require treatment—adding to the sense of fibroids being

"silent." Another factor is the gender health gap.

"For decades, medical research mostly excluded women, which delayed our understanding of conditions like fibroids," LePage tells BlackDoctor.

To make things more confusing, many people panic when they hear the word "fibroid" and immediately think of cancer, even though the vast majority of fibroids



are benign (non-cancerous).

"When you add in the broader taboo around menstruation and reproductive health, it's easy to see why fibroids often go undiscussed. Many people are reluctant to seek help or share their experiences, which reinforces the silence and stigma," LePage adds.

## Why some fibroids cause symptoms—and others

Fibroid symptoms vary depending on size and location. Even small fibroids can

cause heavy or irregular bleeding if they grow inside

the uterine lining.Larger fibroids can press against nearby organs, causing pain, bloating, or urinary and digestive problems.

Some fibroids can affect fertility or cause pregnancy complications.

Others remain small and grow slowly. "They may grow slowly, remain small, or sit in areas of the uterus that don't interfere with bleeding, pain, or organ function. In these cases, people can live their whole lives without knowing they have fibroids, and they're often only discovered by chance during a routine exam, pregnancy scan, or imaging for something unrelated," LePage explains.

## Warning signs to watch for

If you notice any of these common symptoms and they are affecting your quality of life, it's important to check in with your healthcare pro-

- Heavy or prolonged periods (sometimes leading to anemia)
- Pelvic pain or pressure (a dull ache or fullness)
- Frequent urination or constipation (due to organ pressure)
- Difficulty conceiving or pregnancy complications 'Fibroid belly"—a visibly

enlarged abdomen It's also important to trust your instincts.

"If you feel your concerns are being minimized, seek a second, or even third, opinion. Keep a detailed record of your symptoms (tracking with Clue can help here!) and bring it with you to appointments. Don't be afraid to ask direct questions about diagnosis and treatment options," LePage advises.

## Why fibroids go undiag-

Too often, fibroid symptoms are brushed off as "normal period problems." This cultural minimization delays care until symptoms become

"...Many of these symptoms touch on areas people often feel uncomfortable talking about, like periods, fertility, or body changes. That silence can add to the stigma and leave people living with pain, heavy bleeding, or visible changes in their bodies without seeking

help," LePage notes.

Systemic disparities also play a role: Black and Latina women are more likely to have fibroids but less likely to receive timely diagnosis or treatment due to healthcare bias and unequal access.

"When diagnosis is de layed, fibroids can grow larger, limiting treatment options...Many people may face more severe complications like anemia from heavy bleeding or ongoing pain that disrupts daily life," LeP-

The good news? Awareness and self-tracking can make a difference. "Paying attention to your cycle, especially changes in flow, pain, or duration, can help you notice early signs of fibroids," she

## Busting common fibroid

Misinformation can have a real impact on reproductive health, leading people to delay care or accept misdiagnosis. LePage highlights the myths you should ignore:

Myth: All fibroids require

Truth: Many can be left alone if they're not causing

**Myth:** Hysterectomy is the only solution.

**Truth:** Minimally invasive options like myomectomy, uterine artery embolization, and radiofrequency ablation

Myth: Fibroid treatment always causes infertility.

**Truth:** Most treatments preserve fertility, and in some cases, removing fibroids can even improve it.

#### Treatment options beyond hysterectomy

Fibroid treatment is highly personalized, and most options do not involve removing the uterus or causing infertility. Options include:

- Medication: Birth control, anti-inflammatories, hormone-blocking drugs to manage bleeding or pain.
- Minimally invasive procedures: Uterine artery embolization, radiofrequency ablation, or hysteroscopic myomectomy.
- **Surgery:** Myomectomy (removing fibroids while keeping the uterus) or hysterectomy (removing the uterus, usually a last

#### Why black women are disproportionately affected

Black women are about three times more likely to develop fibroids than white women, and they often

one Democratic-leaning majority black district.

Civil rights advocates won a lower-court ruling that the districts likely discriminated against black voters.

The state eventually drew a new map to comply with the court ruling and protect its influential Republican lawmakers, including Speaker Mike Johnson. But white Louisiana voters claimed in their separate lawsuit that race was the predominant factor driving it. A threejudge court agreed, leading to the current high court

experience them earlier and more severely. Genetics, vitamin D deficiency, environmental stressors, and systemic healthcare inequities all play a role.

Unfortunately, the disparities don't stop there. "When Black women do seek treatment for fibroids, they face higher rates of complications from standard treatment options," LePage noted. They are disproportionately steered toward hysterectomy, which carries higher risks.

Public figures like Venus Williams and Lupita Nyong'o sharing their experiences help break stigma and validate others navigating this condition. Representation matters because it drives broader awareness of a condition that disproportionately affects black women.

## The power of cycle tracking

Cycle tracking apps like Clue can help spot early signs of fibroids. Logging changes in flow, pain, or cycle length creates a record that empowers patients in medical set-

tings.
"Tracking can also help reduce stigma around reproductive health by turning personal experiences into concrete data, making conversations about periods, pain, and symptoms less about embarrassment and more about health," LePage explained.

## What gives hope for the fu-

The landscape of fibroid care is changing, LePage concluded.

"For decades, conditions like fibroids were sidelined because of the gender health gap...What gives me hope is that this is finally starting to change. We're seeing more funding and more attention directed toward women's health research, and with that comes earlier detection, better treatment options, and more tailored care."

On the clinical side, the rise of minimally invasive procedures means that patients have safer options with quicker recoveries, instead of facing hysterectomy as the default solution.






