WI State Senator Tammy Baldwin hosts wellness roundtable











Wisconsin State Senator Tammy Baldwin visited Outreach Community Health Centers (OCHC) on Wednesday, September 24, 2025, to highlight her continued commitment to affordable, accessible health care for all. The roundtable was an opportunity for Sen. Baldwin to hear the vital impact of the Affordable Care Act (ACA) directly from community leaders, and shared her vision for building on its foundation.

In January 2025, Baldwin introduced the Health Care Affordability Act, landmark legislation designed to lower costs for families, expand subsidies, and strengthen protections for those who rely on the ACA marketplace. The bill seeks to cap premiums, reduce prescription drug costs, and make coverage more stable for working families.

"This is about ensuring that no one has to choose between paying the bills and accessing the care they need," Baldwin said. "Health

care is a right, not a privilege."

The visit underscored the continued importance of partnerships between policymakers and community-based health providers. With Baldwin's advocacy, Milwaukee families stand to benefit from stronger protections and more affordable care options in the years ahead.

State test results underscore the need for MPS's new literacy plan

Milwaukee Public Schools' (MPS) results on 2024-25 state assessments demonstrate the clear need for the district's new literacy plan and its emphasis on high-quality support and professional learning for educators, Superintendent Brenda Cassellius announced

The plan is currently being implemented and includes 40 hours of dedicated training during the 2025-26 school year to help all teachers become experts in the science of reading. Aligned to recent state legislation, the new literacy plan shifts from a focus on intervening with struggling students to providing high-quality literacy instruction to all students from the very start. Teaching



techniques also shift from older tools such as "3 cueing," which allows students to guess at words based on pictures and contexts, to an intentional focus on "decoding" words by sounding them out.

"These test scores are far below what our students, families, and the community deserve," Dr. Cassellius said. "We believe that all students can read, and literacy opens the door to learning in all other subjects. Our educators will use the district's new literacy plan to help us drive stronger achievement."

Test results show no universal change across all subject areas.

Math scores increased slightly, but English, science, and social studies performance did not change significantly. English proficiency ranged from 19 percent at grades 9-10 to 29 percent at grades 7-8. Math proficiency ranged from 14 percent at grade 10 to 24 percent at grade 3. Wide gaps remain between Black and White students, as well as between students with disabilities and their peers without disabilities. Longer-term comparisons are not possible because

revisions to the Forward Exam occurred and proficiency levels were updated in 2023–24. Note:

The state uses scoring that differs from the National Assessment of Educational Progress, or NAEP, so these scores are also not directly compara-

Dr. Cassellius noted that some initial results from the literacy plan's work could come in the next set of test results from this school year; however, more meaningful impacts are likely to come in the next two to three years.

Vote to end government shutdown fails in Senate; Democrats hold firm on health care demands

A vote to end the government shutdown hours after it began failed Wednesday, October 1, 2025 as Democrats in the Senate held firm to the party's demands to fund health care subsidies that President Donald Trump and Republicans refuse to

The tally showed cracks in the Democrats' resolve but offered no breakthrough. Blame was being cast on all sides on the first day of the shutdown. The White House and Congress failed to strike an agreement to keep programs and services open, throwing the country into a new cycle of uncertainty.

Where things stand: Federal workers face furloughs as government

shutdown begins Trump and Congress fail to reach a funding agreement, sparking political and economic fallout

Health care funding and budget priorities remain central to the standoff

The Senate is back in session for do-over votes, but no breakthrough is expected. The first vote Wednesday ended in fail-

The House is not in session this week.

Senate Democrats are demanding that health care subsidies and Medicaid cuts be addressed before passing a funding bill.

This is the first government shutdown in nearly seven

Roughly 750,000 federal workers were expected to be furloughed, with some potentially fired by Trump's potentially fired by Trump's Republican administration. Many offices will be shuttered, perhaps permanently, as the president vows to "do things that are irreversible" to punish Democrats. Trump's deportation agenda is expected to run full speed ahead, while education, environmental and other services ronmental and other services sputter. The economic fallout is expected to ripple nation-

"I certainly pray they will come to their senses," House Speaker Mike Johnson said,

flanked by GOP leaders at the Capitol.

This is the third time Trump has presided over a federal funding lapse and the first since his return to the White House this year. His record underscores the polarizing divide over budget priorities in a political climate that rewards hard-line positions rather than more traditional compromises.

Plenty of blame being

thrown around

The Democrats picked this fight, which was unusual for the party that prefers to keep government running, but their voters are eager to challenge the president's second-term agenda. Democrats are demanding funding for health care subsidies that are expiring for millions of people under the Affordable Care Act, causing the insurance premiums to spike na-

Republicans have refused to negotiate and have encouraged Trump to steer clear of any talks. After convening a White House meeting this week with the Democratic leaders, the president posted a cartoonish fake video mocking the Democratic leadership that was widely viewed as unserious and rac-

"President Trump's behavior has become more erratic and unhinged," Democratic leaders Sen. Chuck Schumer and Rep. Hakeem Jeffries said in a joint statement, calling for an "intervention" to get the country out of the shutdown. "Instead of negotiating a bipartisan agreement in good faith, he is obsessively posting crazed deepfake videos."

What neither side has devised is an easy off-ramp to



prevent what could become a protracted closure. The ramifications are certain to spread beyond the political arena, upending the lives of Americans who rely on the government for benefit payments, work contracts and the many services being thrown into turmoil.

Economic fallout expected to ripple nationwide

An economic jolt could be felt in a matter of days. The government is expected Friday to produce its monthly jobs report, which may or may not be delivered.

Wall Street veered toward losses before the opening bell Wednesday as the government shutdown went into effect just after midnight.

Across the government, preparations have begun. Trump's Office of Management and Budget, headed by Russ Vought, directed agencies to execute plans not just for furloughs, which are typical during a federal funding lapse, but mass firings of federal workers. It's part of the Trump administration's mission, including its Department of Government Efficiency, to shrink the government.

What's staying open and shutting down

The Medicare and Medicaid health care programs are expected to continue, though staffing shortages could mean delays for some services. The Pentagon would still function and most employees will stay on the job at the Department of Homeland Security.

But Trump has warned that the administration could focus on programs that are important to Democrats, "cutting vast numbers of people out, cutting things that they like, cutting programs that they like."

As agencies sort out which workers are essential, or not, Smithsonian museums are expected to stay open at least until Monday. A group of former national park superintendents urged the administration to close the parks to visitors, arguing that poorly staffed parks in a shutdown are a danger to the public and put park resources at risk.

No easy exit as health care

Ahead of Wednesday's start of the fiscal year, House Republicans had approved a temporary funding bill, over opposition from Democrats, to keep government running into mid-November while broader negotiations contin-

But that bill has failed repeatedly in the Senate, including late Tuesday. It requires 60 votes for approval, which requires cooperation between the two parties. A Democratic bill also failed.

Cracks within the Democrats are apparent. Three senators crossed over to join with the 53-47 GOP majority in

favor of the temporary bill, signaling that Democratic leverage may be eroding.

Senate Majority Leader John Thune, who has said Republicans are happy to discuss the health care issue but not as part of talks to keep the government open — is working to peel off more Democrats to his side.

The standoff is a political test for Schumer, who has drawn scorn from a restive base of left-flank voters pushing the party to hold firm in its demands for health care funding.

Johnson sent lawmakers home nearly two weeks ago after having passed the GOP bill, but said they would be back next week.

Trump, during his meeting with the congressional leaders, expressed surprise at the scope of the rising costs of health care, but Democrats left with no path toward

Thirteen worst pieces of health advice you should never follow

there to offer some sort of advice. But when it comes to health advice, not all of it is good advice. The flowing are 13 pieces of commonly doled out health advice that are not as great as they seem to be.

1. "Skip breakfast to lose

weight.

Why it's bad: Skipping breakfast can slow your metabolism, increase cravings, and cause overeating later in the day.

Better advice: Start your morning with a balanced breakfast including protein (eggs, Greek yogurt), healthy fats (nuts, avocado), and complex carbs (oats, wholegrain toast) to stabilize blood

"Carbs are bad for you." Why it's bad advice: Carbs are your body's main energy

source. Cutting them entirely can lead to fatigue, poor focus, and nutrient loss.

Better advice: Focus on complex carbs like brown rice, quinoa, beans, and sweet potatoes. Limit refined carbs (soda, white bread, pastries). 3. "If it's natural, it must be safe.

Why it's bad advice: Natural doesn't always mean harmless—poison ivy and arsenic are natural too. Some herbs and supplements interact with medications.

Better advice: Do your research, check for FDA or third-party testing labels, and consult your doctor before starting new supplements or remedies.

4. "You don't need sunscreen if it's cloudy or you have darker skin.'

Why it's bad advice: Yes, it's true, "the darker the berry, the sweeter the juice" but that has nothing to do with skin cancer. Up to 80 percent of UV rays penetrate clouds, and skin cancer can affect all skin tones. Darker skin may have more melanin but is not immune.

Better advice: Use broad-spectrum SPF 30+ daily, even on cloudy days. Reapply every two hours

when outdoors.

5. "Detox teas and cleanses will reset your body."

Why it's bad advice: If I had a dollar for every time I saw an ad on social media for a detox, I'd be rich. Your liver and kidneys already handle detoxing. Teas and cleanses often cause dehydration and nutrient imbalances.

Better advice: Support your body's natural detox by staying hydrated, eating fi-ber-rich foods, sleeping well, and limiting alcohol,

6. "Starve yourself to lose weight quickly."

Why it's bad advice: Severe calorie restriction slows metabolism, weakens muscles, and leads to nutrient deficiencies.

Better advice: Aim for a sustainable calorie deficit with whole foods, regular meals, and exercise. Slow, steady weight loss (1-2 lbs per week) is healthier and long-lasting.

7. "All fats are unhealthy."
Why it's bad advice: Your body needs healthy fats for brain function, hormones, and vitamin absorption.

It seems someone is always Avoiding all fats can harm health.

> Better advice: Include unsaturated fats from avocados, olive oil, fatty fish, nuts, and seeds. Limit trans fats and heavily processed oils.

8. "Don't lift weights—you'll get bulky."
Why it's bad: Most people

can't bulk up without specific training and diet. Avoiding weights means missing out on strong bones, lean muscle, and faster metabolism.

advice: Better Add strength training 2–3 times a week to improve muscle tone, bone density, and overall fitness.

9. "You only need to drink water when you're thirsty."

Why it's bad advice: Thirst isn't always reliable especially in older adults or during physical activity. Mild dehydration can still impact mood, focus, and energy.

Better advice: Drink water consistently throughout the day. A general guideline is 8 cups (2 liters) daily, more if you're active or in hot weath-



10. "You're only gonna get sick if you get a vaccine. You should avoid them if you're healthy."

Why it's bad advice: Even healthy people can catch and spread dangerous diseases. Vaccines prevent outbreaks and protect vulnerable populations.

Better advice: Stay up to date on recommended vaccines and talk to your healthcare provider about your specific needs.

11. "Going gluten-free is

healthier for everyone."

Why it's bad advice: Unless you have celiac disease or gluten sensitivity, avoiding gluten can reduce fiber and nutrient intake. Many gluten-free products are highly processed.

Better advice: Stick with whole grains like oats, quinoa, and whole wheat unless you're medically advised to

go gluten-free.
12. "If you're not sick, you don't need checkups."

Why it's bad advice: Now, I know there's a saying going around that says, "If you want to be healthy, stay out of the hospital" — and to some extent that is true. But any conditions (like high blood pressure or diabetes) develop silently. Skipping checkups

can delay treatment.

Better advice: See your doctor regularly for preventive care, screenings, and lab work—even if you feel fine. And monitor things on your own. There are so many trackers that can check your blood pressure, BMI, choles-

terol, etc to make sure you're on point in between check

13. "No pain, no gain."

Why it's bad advice: I'm not going to lie, I used to believe this one too. I used to think that the more it hurts, the better I'll be in the long run-wrong. Pain signals injury or strain. Pushing through pain can cause longterm damage.

Better advice: Differentiate between discomfort (muscle burn, effort) and actual pain (sharp, stabbing, lingering). Modify or stop exercises when pain arises.

misinformation Health spreads fast—and following the wrong advice can do real damage. Always consider the source, question quick fixes, and consult medical professionals when in doubt. True health comes from balance, consistency, and evidence-based practices—not shortcuts or fads.








