Northcott Neighborhood House brings holiday joy with gifts and meals in Milwaukee













On Wednesday, December 24, 2025, volunteers from Northcott Neighborhood House, Bader Philanthropies, and West Care distributed more than 5,500 free new, wrapped Christmas gifts to kids (top row). Families lined up around the block to participate. "This was a nice thing the community is doing. And I appreciate it so much," said Lastarr Armour, who received gifts at Northcott.

Each of the 300 volunteers has a personal reason for participating. Vanessa Johnson, a volunteer at Northcott Neighborhood House, said, "Knowing that those kids have a smile on their face when they leave out of here...We've got a lot of kids that don't smile anymore. And for some of them, there's no reason to smile."

On Christmas Day, Thursday, December 25, 2025, volunteers gathered at Northcott Neighborhood House and prepared food for 600 people for a free Christmas dinner (bottom row). It's a service for the community that they have been doing for the past six years.

Northcott Neighborhood House, in the past, has done takeout Christmas dinners. This year, for the first time, they are offering sit-down service. Johnson said she wants it to feel five-star. Volunteers also had more toys to distribute to the children who attended the free dinner. Johnson said she hopes the event will foster community connections. "Hopefully they'll leave here with a smile on their face, and that's the goal," she said.

Milwaukee celebrates first day of Kwanzaa

with unity ceremony at Wisconsin Black Historical Society

















On Friday, December 26, 2025, The Wisconsin Black Historical Society hosted a traditional opening ceremony welcoming the public to celebrate together for the seven-day cultural holiday, Kwanzaa.

For seven days, this non-religious, cultural celebration honoring African heritage begins with the first day, Umoja, which means unity — uniting families, neighborhoods, and the Black community.

The Wisconsin Black Historical Society has been hosting a traditional opening ceremony for decades, welcoming the public to

reflect, connect, and celebrate together. The other days of Kwanzaa are Kujichaqulia (Self-Determination), Ujima Collective Work & Responsibility), Ujamaa (Cooperative Economics), Nia (Purpose), Kuumba (Creativity), Imani (Faith). The celebration this year included Music, African Drumming, Performances, Candle Lighting, and space for conversation, all centered on connection. Also this year Diggy, a stilt dancer with the Kaisokah group, performed during the opening ceremony.

Remembering the late Rev. William Jackson

On December 1, 2025, the Rev. William Jackson passed away peacefully. Pastor Jackson was one of the longest serving Baptist Pastor in General Baptist State Convention of Wisconsin.

Rev. Jackson was the oldest of seven children and was raised on his grandfather's farm in Alabama for the first 12 years of his life. That upbringing provided him with an early start when it came to both preaching and working.

"I've been preaching since I was 15 years old," he said. "I also know what hard work is all about. We raised everything we needed on that farm. When I was 12-year old my great grandfather taught me how to pick cotton. I was born working."

Pastor Jackson relocated to Milwaukee with his family at the age of 12. When he was 15 years old, he began preparing for ordination at Damascus Missionary Baptist Church in Milwaukee under the tutelage of the late Rev. M.F. Shackleford and he was ordained in 1965. For many years Pastor Jackson worked in sales first at Gimbel's for 26 years and then for 12 more years at Boston Department Store.

On April 28, 1968, Pastor Jackson founded Cornerstone Missionary Baptist Church; first as a mission and the following year, it was organized as a church.

Pastor Jackson believed he was the longest serving Baptist Pastor in Milwaukee.

"When I first started Cornerstone, it was mostly family and then it grew from there," he said. "People come and go, but we are still carrying

For the past 15 years or so, Pastor Jackson has relied on a motorized wheelchair to

get around. Pastor Jackson said he didn't spare a lot of pity for his own circumstances, but the lack of mobility did make it more difficult to achieve his goals and stay connected with friends and

"Usually when I want to go somewhere, I rely on Transit Plus to take me and pick me up," he said. "When you have to depend on others for rides, errands and so on, you often have to wait for someone else. That's just the way the system is set up and I'm grateful that I have friends and that there is a transit service that can assist."

Pastor Jackson said that the COVID-19 pandemic, which forced the closure of public worship at churches in

Wisconsin, was a much harder blow to his ministry than being confined to a wheelchair. He expressed profound gratitude to his congregation and his many friends and supporters who have helped keep Cornerstone current on its bills and other obligations during the past three years.

At the time of his passing, Rev. Jackson was working on his 57th Pastoral Anniversary that was to take place on Sunday, December 7, 2025. Unfortunately, he would pass away just days before the celebration. His family continued with the event honoring his life, legacy and dedication to the word of God.

Remembering community activist Viola "Vi" Hawkins

Viola (Vi) Riser Hawkins was born to the union of the late Deacon John, Sr. and Lenory Riser of Grayson, LA, on October 12, 1939. She was the 10th of the couple's 12 children and was loved by

She confessed her hope in Christ at an early age and joined Cedar Grove Baptist Church. She was a loyal and devoted member, serving diligently until she left home. She continued her legacy of service at Lincoln Park and Good Shepherd Lutheran Church, where she served as a faithful member; she truly "loved good singing."

Vi attended Union Central High School and graduated at the top of her class. She later received her associate degree in business administration from Milwaukee Area Technical Collage (MATC) in 1985 and continued her education at UW-Milwaukee, also attending a number of seminars and workshops throughout her life. After graduating, she worked for the Housing Authority of the City of Milwaukee for 11 years.

She met Herman Hawkins in 1957. Later, as their love grew, they were married, and two children were born to



this union, Gwendolyn and Debra.

She began her long record of volunteering with the Red Cross in the early 1960s, then became involved in numerous neighborhood, tenant and community organizations. Vi spent much of her time as volunteer and her work would span more than fifty years. Besides the Red Cross she would go on to volunteer with: Boy Scouts of American, Cub Scouts, the Milwaukee County Statement Program, in local politics. She marched a board member of Dineen in protest with some of the

Park Neighborhood Organization, Peace Organization, Interfaith Older Adults Program, Madison State Aging Advisory Committee, MCDA Commissioner, Revitalize Milwaukee, and Milwaukee Safety & Civic Commissioner.

Her most recent appointment was with the MATC Foundation Board of Directors who established a scholarship fund at the college.

She also became involved

giants of the Civil Rights Movement, including Milwaukee's Father James Groppi and the Rev. Jesse Jackson. She became a Voter Registrar and Pollster worker, and became involved with the League of Women Voters.

Vi enjoyed her church and was a faithful church worker. She was also very active socially as she worked with the Black Excellence Awards and Louvenia Johnson Scholarship Program, and created the Jazzy Jewels Dance Troupe which would preform at events all over Milwaukee. In 2010, she was inducted into the Milwaukee County Senior Citizen Hall of Fame.

She was a strong advocate on what was right for the people-and if the people were wrong, they got it too! She loved people, traveling, sports, music, a good song, a good laugh, and the company of family and friends.

She leaves to cherish her memory her daughters, Gwendolyn (Peter) and Debra (Rick); three grandchildren, Candice, Durrell, and Madyson; five great-grandchildren, Nyla, Desirae, Aija, Ryan, and Steve; and numerous nieces, nephews, and god-children.

Her grass roots on the ground and her famous saying, "I walk the highways and byways doing His work".







A matter of trust: Panel explores vaccines, misinformation, and the future of public health

At a time when public confidence in science faces unprecedented skepticism, Charles R. Drew University of Medicine and Science, BlackDoctor.Org, and Moderna convened an important conversation on trust, misinformation, and the life-saving power of vaccines.

Moderated by Deborah Prothrow-Stith, MD, Dean of CDU's College of Medicine, the panel featured Los Angeles County Health Officer Muntu Davis, MD, MPH; AltaMed Director of Research and Evaluation, Adrienne Martinez-Hollingsworth, '14 MCNL; and Jerry P. Abraham, MD.

CDU President David M. Carlisle, MD, opened the discussion by grounding the audience in history. "There's no better time to discuss the importance of vaccines than now," he said, reminding the audience that smallpox "no longer exists on Earth because of vaccination." He noted that life expectancy in the U.S. has risen by 30 to 40 years thanks largely to public health measures like vaccination and clean drinking wa-

Deborah Pro-Dr. throw-Stith framed the evening's theme pointedly: "This is a matter of trust and a matter of misinformation. Institutions like CDU are responsible for, and accountable to, our communities on this issue of trust...and we take that very seriously."

The panelists, who together brought decades of experience in medicine, public health, and community engagement, unpacked how trust is earned, how it is lost, and how it can be restored.

'We have to be honest about what we're talking about," said Dr. Muntu Da-

vis. "Vaccines reduce your risk of dying or getting seriously ill. But that's not the message that always gets across." He reflected on the COVID-19 pandemic, acknowledging that communication sometimes faltered: "People don't expect us to be perfect, but they do expect us to explain things clearly and answer their questions. Part of trust is communication."

For Dr. Adrienne Martinez-Hollingsworth, is inseparable from history. "We have to admit that people [mistrust] because we sterilized people not too long ago," she said, alluding to California's sordid history of forced sterilizations. That lived history, she noted, explains lingering fears: "When we talk about vaccines, this isn't ancient history. It's living memory for many."

Dr. Jerry P. Abraham brought the discussion to the ground level. "We have two historically Black institutions like CDU and Kedren Health that can really turn things around," he said. "The community trusts us. But when it comes to trust, we have to support our doctors, nurses, and scientists so they can keep earning it."

He described how Kedren's mobile vaccine units, an approach first introduced in the community by CDU professor Cynthia Davis during the height of the AIDS epidemic, brought lifesaving vaccines directly to underserved neighborhoods during COVID-19, often overcoming fear one person at a time. "We met people where they lived. Sometimes literally outside liquor stores," he recalled. "One man who wanted us gone ended up bringing his whole family to get vaccinated weeks later. If we're patient and meet people where they are physically,

spiritually, mentally, they will

choose to do the right thing."

The conversation turned to the challenges of operating in a post-pandemic landscape where misinformation spreads faster than evidence.

Dr. Davis warned, "We have to recognize the difference between authority and expertise. People in authority are giving advice without expertise. Whatever you do, you have to be able to stand by it, explain it, and defend

Dr. Abraham echoed the need for collaboration: "It took Moderna, Pfizer, and the government working together to get us through the pandemic. That's the secret sauce for the future."

Dr. Prothrow-Stith closed the discussion by returning to one core issue: public literacy. "We are not doing enough to help the public be literate about their own bodies," she said.

As the evening drew to a close, one message was clear: rebuilding trust in science begins with listening, honesty, and sustained engagement. By creating spaces for dialogue and collaboration, CDU continues to honor its role as a community-anchored institution committed to ensuring that every patient has access to the truth and to care.


