

## 'Lil' Jeannetta Robinson Gifts of Love' program fulfills Christmas wishes

On Saturday, December 27, 2025, Charles (Butch) Walton the son of the late community leader Jeannetta Simpson Robinson, along with his sons, Mike Brown, and Terence Smith shared in a family legacy of presenting the annual "Lil' Jeannetta Robinson Gifts of Love Program" in partnership with United Way Of Greater Milwaukee & Waukesha at the H.W. Longfellow Elementary School. The event honors Lil' Jeannetta (Little Netta) Robinson the granddaughter of Jeannetta. The idea for the program started at Little Netta's six birthday party on December 27, 1980 when she gave away her gifts to children attending her party after learning they did not receive gifts for Christmas. Tragically Little Netta was murdered in 1984 at age 9, along with her mother Cheryl Robinson, who was only 25.

Little Netta's kindness and spirit of giving lives on is through the "Lil' Jeannetta Robinson Gifts of Love Program," which provides Christmas gifts and copies of *Little Netta's Gift*, a children's book about the gift of kindness and joy of giving, to economically disadvantaged children. Rev. Walton's son Michael Brown is the author/publisher of the children's book "*Little Netta's Gift*" that is read and distributed to every child at each school the program visits, Carver Academy, formerly known as Palmer Elementary, the elementary school Lil' Jeannetta attended. Thanks to the program and partners Bader Philanthropies, SOULSTIR, Milwaukee Brewers Community Foundation and many others, along with administrative support from United Way of Greater Milwaukee and Waukesha County, more than 2,500 children at 8 Milwaukee elementary schools have received Christmas gifts and a free copy of "*Little Netta's Gift*."

## Milwaukee's food desert crisis worsens with Aldi closure

The sudden closure of an Aldi store on Milwaukee's north side has intensified the city's food desert crisis, leaving residents with limited access to affordable groceries.

The abrupt closure of an Aldi store at Sherman Boulevard and Custer Avenue in Milwaukee has intensified the city's food desert crisis, leaving large parts of the north side without nearby grocery stores.

This closure follows the shutdown of a Pick 'n Save in Metcalfe Park last year, raising concerns among community leaders and grocers about the lack of access to fresh foods.

"People need access to good, healthy, fresh foods in order to survive. So yes, there is a moral responsibility there," Milwaukee Mayor Cavalier Johnson said.

Maurice Wince, co-owner of Sherman Park Grocery, highlighted the challenges faced by local stores, including staffing issues, thin profit margins, and security concerns such as theft.

"There's more going out

than there is coming in monetarily. We can't sustain ourselves without enough cash flow right here at the register," Wince said.

Residents are now forced to pay higher prices at convenience stores or face increased transportation costs

as they travel further to find supermarkets.

"Dealing with rising costs, dealing with food prices, utility costs, those things shouldn't be going on based off of where you live," said Milwaukee County Executive David Crowley, who spoke while touring a new tea business opening near 25th and Clybourn streets.

A map of current chain grocery stores in Milwaukee shows a concentration in downtown and south side areas, with five major chain stores having closed since 2021. Crowley believes local entrepreneurs might be the key to solving food deserts,

where national chains might be more focused strictly on the bottom line.

"And if we want to eliminate food deserts, make sure that families and our children have access to healthy foods, we have to make sure that we're working with those entrepreneurs, working with those businesses to help expand their capacity so people can have access to fresh foods," Crowley said.

Aldi, which still operates two stores in Milwaukee, both on Capitol Drive, declined an interview but stated, "This decision is a part of a strategic effort to better allocate resources."

## Grammy-nominated musician John Forté found dead at 50 in Massachusetts home

John Forté, the Grammy-nominated musician known for his work with the Fugees and the Refugee Camp All-Stars, among others, has died at age 50. He was found dead Monday, January 12, 2026 in his home in Chilmark, Massachusetts, according to police.

Police Chief Sean Slavin said in a statement that there were no signs of foul play or "readily apparent cause of death." The case is being investigated by the state medi-

cal examiner's office, according to Slavin.

A native of New York City, Forté was a musical prodigy who broke through in his early 20s as a contributor to the Fugees' Grammy-winning "The Score" and to Wyclef Jean's Grammy-nominated "The Carnival." A multi-instrumentalist and rapper, he also released such solo albums as "Poly Sci" and "I John," with contributors including Carly Simon, whose son, Ben Taylor, was a close

friend of Forté's.

In 2000, he was arrested at Newark International Airport and charged with possession of liquid cocaine and drug trafficking. Forté was sentenced to 14 years in prison, but the sentence was commuted after seven years by President George W. Bush. Simon was among many public figures who advocated for his release.

Survivors include his wife, the photographer Lara Fuller,

## Veteran actor T.K. Carter, known for 'The Thing' and 'Punky Brewster,' dies at 69

Veteran actor T.K. Carter, who appeared in the horror film "The Thing" and "Punky Brewster" on television, has died at the age of 69.

Carter was declared dead on Friday, January 9, 2026, after deputies responded to a call regarding an unresponsive male in Duarte, California, according to the Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department.

Police did not disclose a cause of death or other details, but said no foul play was suspected.

Carter had been acting for years before a breakthrough role as Nauls the cook in John Carpenter's 1982 horror classic, "The Thing." He also had a recurring role in the 1980s sitcom "Punky Brewster." Along with appearances on several other well-known sit-

coms throughout the 1970s, 1980s and 1990s. His work often blended humor with strong character presence.

Other big-screen roles include "Runaway Train" in 1985, "Ski Patrol" in 1990 and "Space Jam" in 1996.

# We must finish the work Dr. King died doing

This year, let's honor Dr. Martin Luther King Jr.'s birthday by remembering his final mission—and by picking up the mantle he left behind.

Every year, America remembers a dream. But the work that placed Dr. King in the greatest danger was not dreaming. It was organizing to make the dream real.

Dr. King was assassinated in Memphis in April 1968 while supporting striking sanitation workers and preparing to launch the Poor People's Campaign. He was there because he had come to understand something fundamental about American life: that racism and economic exploitation are intertwined, and that neither can be defeated without confronting both.

He was not killed while leading a desegregation battle in a northern suburb. He was killed while trying to unite economically struggling Americans across racial lines around shared demands for dignity, wages, and opportunity.

When that unity fails—

when workers and the poor are kept divided—the consequences are not abstract. Wages stagnate. Healthcare becomes conditional. Food insecurity spreads quietly. People turn on one another while decisions that shape their lives are made far out of reach. Division does not just weaken movements; it deepens suffering.

The Poor People's Campaign was designed to confront that reality directly. King envisioned a coalition of poor people drawn from many communities—black and white, Native American, Latino, Asian American, and other communities pushed to the margins—coming together to demand economic rights that democracy had long promised but rarely delivered.

History reveals a pattern we are often reluctant to name.

In the United States, one of the most dangerous roles a leader can take on is the work of uniting poor and working people across racial lines—especially when that unity threatens systems that depend on division to function.

Fred Hampton understood that early.

Most people remember Hampton only as a black Panther, frozen in time at age 21, killed during a predawn police raid in Chicago in December 1969. But before joining the Panthers, Hampton first gained recognition as a teenage organizer in the NAACP. As a youth leader,



he showed a rare ability to mobilize people, build coalitions, and translate moral clarity into action.

That instinct carried forward.

As a Panther leader, Hampton helped build the original Rainbow Coalition—bringing together the black Panthers, the Puerto Rican Young Lords, and the Young Patriots Organization, made up largely of poor white Appalachian migrants. In one of his most consequential public moments, Hampton stood at a press conference alongside William "Preacher" Fesperman, a leader of the Young Patriots, to declare that poor and working people had more in common with each other than with the forces exploiting them.

That image—black, brown, and white organizers standing together, unapologetically—was the point.

Less than a year later, Hampton was killed by Chicago police in a predawn

raids.

The same pattern appears, with devastating clarity, in the lives of Harry and Harriette Moore.

Harry Moore was the founding president of the Florida NAACP and one of the most effective organizers the association ever produced. Under his leadership, black voter registration in Florida surged despite poll taxes, intimidation, and violence. He fought for equal pay for black teachers and worked closely with labor and progressive allies, believing racial justice and economic justice could not be separated.

Harriette Moore was not simply his wife. She was an organizer, educator, and strategist who sustained the work under constant threat.

Despite Harry Moore's effectiveness, he was never elevated into the national leadership of the NAACP. The historical record offers no single explanation. What it does show is that his work—rooted in voter power, labor solidarity, and interracial organizing—placed him at extraordinary risk in the Jim Crow South.

On Christmas night in 1951, a bomb exploded beneath their home in Mims, Florida. Both Harry and Harriette Moore would die from their injuries. Their crime was not extremism. It was effectiveness.

Malcolm X's life followed a similar arc. After returning from Mecca in 1964, he spoke and wrote about encountering a brotherhood that crossed racial lines. His politics remained complex and uncompromising, but the direction was unmistakable: away from race as des-

tiny and toward coalition as possibility. Within a year, he was assassinated.

Dr. King came to the same conclusion.

His final campaigns were not a departure from civil rights work. They were its fulfillment. He understood that rights without economic security are fragile—and that democracy without solidarity is easily divided against itself.

That truth matters now.

Today, millions of Americans are hurting in concrete ways. Just look at the news. Families lose healthcare when a job disappears. Parents skip meals so their children can eat. Seniors choose between prescriptions and groceries. Workers live one illness or one missed paycheck away from crisis.

These outcomes are not inevitable. They are what happens when division succeeds.

Dr. King understood that uniting people across racial lines was not just morally right—it was practically necessary. It was the only way to build enough power to secure healthcare, fair wages, food security, and basic stability for everyone.

That is why the work was dangerous.

And that is why it remains unfinished.

So when we honor Dr. King, we should be careful to remember him accurately—not as a safely sanitized icon, but as a leader who followed justice to its most challenging conclusion.

This holiday should not simply reassure us. It should challenge us.

To remember Dr. King honestly is to remember that he died doing unfinished work—work that remains dangerous precisely because it remains necessary.

The question before us is the same one history keeps asking:

Are we willing to continue the work Dr. King died doing?

Because the pattern tells us what happens when we do.

And today's headlines keep telling us what happens when we don't.



# 'I Have A Dream' - address at the March on Washington, DC on August 28, 1963

"I am happy to join with you today in what will go down in history as the greatest demonstration for freedom in the history of our nation.

"Five score years ago, a great American, in whose symbolic shadow we stand signed the Emancipation Proclamation. This momentous decree came as a great beacon light of hope to millions of Negro slaves who had been seared in the flames of withering injustice. It came as a joyous daybreak to end the long night of captivity.

"But one hundred years later, we must face the tragic fact that the Negro is still not free. One hundred years later, the life of the Negro is still sadly crippled by the manacles of segregation and the chains of discrimination. One hundred years later, the Negro lives on a lonely island of poverty in the midst of a vast ocean of material prosperity. One hundred years later, the Negro is still languishing in the corners of American society and finds himself an exile in his own land. So we have come here today to dramatize an appalling condition.

"In a sense we have come to our nation's capital to cash a check. When the architects of our republic wrote the magnificent words of the Constitution and the Declaration of Independence, they were signing a promissory note to which every American was to fall heir. This note was a promise that all men would be guaranteed the inalienable rights of life, liberty, and the pursuit of happiness.

"It is obvious today that America has defaulted on this promissory note insofar as her citizens of color are concerned. Instead of honoring this sacred obligation, America has given the Negro people a bad check which has come back marked 'insufficient funds.' But we refuse to believe that the bank of justice is bankrupt. We refuse to believe that there are insufficient funds in the great vaults of opportunity of this nation. So we have come to cash this check -- a check that will give us upon demand the riches of freedom and the security of justice. We have also come to this hallowed spot to remind America of the fierce urgency of now. This is no time to engage in the luxury of cooling off or to take the tranquilizing drug of gradualism. Now is the time to rise from the dark and desolate valley of segregation to the sunlit path of racial justice. Now is the time to open the doors of opportunity to all of God's children. Now is the

time to lift our nation from the quicksands of racial injustice to the solid rock of brotherhood.

"It would be fatal for the nation to overlook the urgency of the moment and to underestimate the determination of the Negro. This sweltering summer of the Negro's legitimate discontent will not pass until there is an invigorating autumn of freedom and equality. Nineteen sixty-three is not an end, but a beginning. Those who hope that the Negro needed to blow off steam and will now be content will have a rude awakening if the nation returns to business as usual. There will be neither rest nor tranquility in America until the Negro is granted his citizenship rights. The whirlwinds of revolt will continue to shake the foundations of our nation until the bright day of justice emerges.

But there is something that I must say to my people who stand on the warm threshold which leads into the palace of justice. In the process of gaining our rightful place we must not be guilty of wrongful deeds. Let us not seek to satisfy our thirst for freedom by drinking from the cup of bitterness and hatred.

"We must forever conduct our struggle on the high plane of dignity and discipline.

"We must not allow our creative protest to degenerate into physical violence. Again and again we must rise to the majestic heights of meeting physical force with soul force. The marvelous new militancy which has engulfed the Negro community must not lead us to distrust of all white people, for many of our white brothers, as evidenced by their presence here today, have come to realize that their destiny is tied up with our destiny and their freedom is inextricably bound to our freedom. We

of police brutality. You have been the veterans of creative suffering. Continue to work with the faith that unearned suffering is redemptive.

"Go back to Mississippi, go back to Alabama, go back to Georgia, go back to Louisiana, go back to the slums and ghettos of our northern cities, knowing that somehow this situation can and will be changed. Let us not wallow in the valley of despair.

"I say to you today, my friends, that in spite of the difficulties and frustrations of the moment, I still have a dream. It is a dream deeply rooted in the American dream.

"I have a dream that one day this nation will rise up and live out the true meaning of its creed: 'We hold these truths to be self-evident: that all men are created equal.'

"I have a dream that one day on the red hills of Georgia the sons of former slaves and the sons of former slave owners will be able to sit down together at a table of brotherhood.

"I have a dream that one day even the state of Mississippi, a desert state, sweltering with the heat of injustice and oppression, will be transformed into an oasis of freedom and justice.

"I have a dream that my four children will one day live in a nation where they will not be judged by the color of their skin but by the content of their character.

"I have a dream today.

"I have a dream that one day the state of Alabama, whose governor's lips are presently dripping with the

words of interposition and nullification, will be transformed into a situation where little black boys and black girls will be able to join hands with little white boys and white girls and walk together as sisters and brothers.

"I have a dream today.

"I have a dream that one day every valley shall be exalted, every hill and mountain shall be made low, the rough places will be made plain, and the crooked places will be made straight, and the glory of the Lord shall be revealed, and all flesh shall see it together.

"This is our hope. This is the faith with which I return to the South. With this faith we will be able to hew out of the mountain of despair a stone of hope. With this faith we will be able to transform the jangling discords of our nation into a beautiful symphony of brotherhood. With this faith we will be able to work together, to pray together, to struggle together, to go to jail together, to stand up for freedom together, knowing that we will be free one day.

"This will be the day when all of God's children will be able to sing with a new meaning, 'My country, 'tis of thee, sweet land of liberty, of thee I sing. Land where my fathers died, land of the pilgrim's pride, from every mountain-side, let freedom ring'.

"And if America is to be a great nation this must become true. So let freedom ring from the prodigious hilltops of New Hampshire. Let freedom ring from the mighty mountains of New York. Let freedom ring from the heightening Alleghenies of Pennsylvania!
