County Executive David Crowley hosts public safety roundtable on community violence intervention efforts



On Monday, January 26, 2026, County Executive David Crowley led a discussion to highlight the Credible Messenger Program that aims to improve public safety and support local youth involved in the justice system through expanding mentorship, resources, and job opportunities. During the roundtable at the Marcia P. Coggs Health & Human Services Center, County Executive Crowley was joined by community partners, local leaders, and representatives from the Milwaukee County Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS) to discuss how to continue addressing public safety challenges through community violence intervention initiatives, youth engagement efforts, and greater partnership with state and federal leaders.

The Credible Messenger Program promotes public safety by intervening in gun violence and supports positive outcomes for youth, with an emphasis on those in the youth justice system. Since its inception, the program has worked with youth at all points of system involvement by coordinating with partners—community-based organizations, public health entities, academic institutions and government agencies—and is staffed by individuals with lived experience and previous justice involvement who support youth

through transformative mentoring.

In its first year, youth involved in the program reported a 77 percent success rate for recidivism and pro-social behavior. The program has served more than 280 youth since its inception, partnering with six community agencies including an all-girls intervention team.

The program's focus on transformative mentorship has been notably effective, with 66 percent of the youth receiving at least 26 weeks of mentoring—essential for positive outcomes according to research, delivering more than 2,000 combined hours of mentoring in 2023. The collaborative effort includes Milwaukee Community Crossroads, Youth Advocate Program, GLOW414, Running Rebels, Westcare Wisconsin, and 414Life.

The success of the Credible Messenger Program underscores the value of community-based approaches in creating safer, more supportive environments for Milwaukee County's youth. Protest forms in Milwaukee after man with Wisconsin ties shot, killed by Border Patrol agent in Minneapolis

Saturday, January 24, 2026 shooting in Minneapolis of 37-year-old Alex Petti sparked protests nationwide, including in Milwaukee.

Family identified the 37-year-old man shot and killed by a Border Patrol agent as Alex Petti, a Minneapolis nurse who was protesting against the Trump administration's immigration crackdown.

WBAY confirmed through the Green Bay Area Public School District that Petti graduated from Preble High School in Green Bay.

After graduating high school, he went to the University of Minnesota, graduating in 2011 with a bachelor's degree in biology, society and the environment, according to family.

The Department of Homeland Security alleged that Petti approached border patrol agents with a handgun, and "violently resisted" when agents tried to disarm him. The Department of Homeland Security said a federal Border Patrol agent killed Petti in self-defense. Local



officials dispute that allegation. Multiple videos of the confrontation show federal agents spraying Petti with a substance and pinning him to the ground before the shooting.

Petti was a legal gun owner and did not have a criminal record, according to Minneapolis police Chief Brian O'Hara. Minnesota's gun laws allow open carrying of a handgun if the gun owner has a valid permit.

This is the second deadly

shooting this month of an American citizen in Minneapolis at the hands of a federal agent. Investigators are still reviewing what led up to Saturday's shooting. Petti was killed just over a mile away from where Renee Good was shot.

Milwaukee Protests

Protesters gathered in downtown Milwaukee on Jan. 24 in response to the shooting of Petti.

Around 100 protesters organized at Red Arrow Park

around 2 p.m., then marched to the downtown ICE facility on Broadway and Knapp Street.

A separate gathering was also held Saturday night near Bremen and Burleigh streets in Milwaukee's Riverwest neighborhood. There, residents brought candles and flashlights as a sign of solidarity with Minnesota.

Trump's Response

President Donald Trump posted on Truth Social a few hours after Saturday's shoot-

ing, saying, in part, federal agents are in Minnesota because of "massive monetary fraud" and "illegal criminals that were allowed to infiltrate the state through the democrats' open border policy."

Trump also lashed out at Minnesota Gov. Tim Walz and Minneapolis Mayor Jacob Frey. "This is the gunman's gun, loaded (with two additional full magazines!), and ready to go — What is that all about? Where are the local Police? Why weren't they allowed to protect ICE Officers?" he wrote. "The Mayor and the Governor called them off? It is stated that many of these Police were not allowed to do their job, that ICE had to protect themselves — Not an easy thing to do!"

He continued by saying, "LET OUR ICE PATRIOTS DO THEIR JOB! 12,000 Illegal Alien Criminals, many of them violent, have been arrested and taken out of Minnesota. If they were still there, you would see something far worse than you are witnessing today!"

Milwaukee aldermen seek tougher penalties for negligent landlords

Following the emergency evacuation of a Milwaukee apartment building without heat or water, aldermen are advocating for harsher penalties on unresponsive landlords.

Milwaukee aldermen are advocating for tougher penalties on negligent landlords after a 36-unit apartment building at North 28th Street and Wisconsin Avenue was evacuated due to a lack of heat and water, owned by Berrada Properties Management.

City inspectors evacuated the building on Thursday after discovering the absence of essential services for days.

"No one deserves to live like that," Milwaukee Alderwoman Sharlen Moore said Monday.

She's one of three Milwaukee aldermen at a news conference Monday, citing the emergency evacuation as an example of unresponsive landlords dragging their feet, with tenants suffering the consequences.

The building is one of 11 residential properties deemed uninhabitable this winter due to a lack of heat, marking a nearly 60% increase from



the building.

Tenant advocates express concern that tenants are often reluctant to report issues, such as a lack of heat, due to fear of landlord retaliation.

"Some seniors are like, if I tell I'm not going to have anywhere to go," said Crystal West, a tenant advocate for the community group Amanni United.

Although state law prohibits retaliation, she said many tenants fear that reporting issues could lead to homelessness.

"We all know someone right now in this city that is living in a catastrophe apartment and don't want to leave it, because again, what is the alternative?" West said.

In a statement to WISN 12 News, Berrada added they are "treated differently than other property owners in terms of the time permitted to make repairs." The statement continued, "The focus on Berrada is unfair and unwarranted ... Berrada is working diligently to get tenants back in their homes."

last winter. Aldermen argue that current fines, typically a few hundred dollars, are ineffective for landlords with repeated code violations.

"Fines of a couple of hundred dollars here, a couple of thousand dollars there, is just absorbed by landlords taking in \$10 million, \$20 million a year in rent," Alderman Robert Bauman said. "So we need stiffer fines."

Bauman is proposing radically increasing the maximum fines, creating a category for what he calls "chronic" offenders.

"If a landlord qualifies as a chronic offender, of health safety and wellness provisions, in terms of rental properties, we would have the authority to issue significant fines, meaningful fines, \$10,000, \$20,000, \$50,000,"

Bauman said Monday.

Berrada Properties Management responded in a statement to WISN 12 News, stating that the building's design, which includes an open garage space underneath part of the first floor, which they are now enclosing, contributed to the problem. They claimed they were close to completing repairs and had space heaters on the way when the city evacuated

MPS faces tough decisions in 2026–27 budget

Milwaukee Public Schools (MPS) has begun planning for the 2026–27 budget, a process that comes amid significant financial challenges for the district with tough decisions ahead. While no proposals or recommendations have been made, district leaders are closely reviewing spending, advocating for increased state funding, and preparing to engage staff, families and the community in the months ahead. Superintendent Dr. Brenda Cassellius shared the following message with colleagues to outline the current budget landscape and the steps ahead, including opportunities for input as this work continues.

"Dear Colleagues,

As we begin building the 2026–27 budget, my pledge is to keep our incredible students and amazing staff at the center. At this early stage, no decisions, proposals, or recommendations have been made. At the same time, it is clear that decisions about next year's budget will not be easy.

Our MPS community must be our priority. Times are hard right now and I know you all feel it.

Unfortunately, after recently finishing audits of the past three fiscal years, we now know how signifi-



cant our current financial challenges are. We face economic challenges on multiple fronts, from declining birthrates, underinvestment from the state, to the loss of funds that we had from federal pandemic relief, and inflationary increases for costs like health-care and utilities. Without voters' referendum support, the picture would be worse, but it's still incredibly challenging.

As I shared with the Board this week, we are undertaking a careful review of our spending at Central Services, including reviewing all contracts, but this alone will not be enough to address the gap we face. We may need to look at additional steps to control the budget even within the current year, including a potential freeze on hiring positions with exceptions for classrooms and student-facing positions.

I will continue to fight for

more revenue — especially with the news that the state has an even bigger budget surplus than expected — but there is no guarantee we will receive additional resources. I ask for your help in that fight. We need to turn our attention to Madison and demand better for our children and workers who give so much to invest in Wisconsin's future.

Preparing for next year's budget will span the next several months. In the coming weeks, we will be inviting you and the community to listening sessions on the budget to share your voice. We also look forward to collaborating with our union partners on identifying savings. I want to hear from you in a way that helps us productively navigate the challenge ahead of us.

I am committed to respecting all of the hard work you do every day, showing

up for you and our students every day. If we work together I am certain we can put MPS on a track of long-term stability and

success for the young people and families we serve.

exploitation. The previous scenarios can be avoided by simply believing in yourself. Keeping the power of your life in your hands.





Docomomo Wisconsin and Milwaukee Public Library present 'From the Archives Lecture: Wisconsin's first black architect, Alonzo Robinson, Jr.'

Docomomo Wisconsin, in partnership with the Milwaukee Public Library (MPL) and UW-Milwaukee Cultural Resource Management (CRM), is pleased to invite the public to a special *From the Archives* lecture celebrating Black History Month: "Wisconsin's First Black Architect: Alonzo Robinson, Jr." The program will take place Saturday, February 14, 2026, from 2:00–3:30 PM at Milwaukee Central Library, Centennial Hall – Loos Room (733 N. Eighth Street). Admission is free and open to the public.

MPL is pleased to welcome back UWM architectural historian Justin Miller, who will explore the remarkable 40-year career of Alonzo Robinson, Jr., Wisconsin's first licensed black architect. Robinson made profound and lasting contributions to Milwaukee's black community and to the city as a whole, designing buildings that combined modern architectural principles with deep civic purpose.

Robinson's best-known works include Central City Plaza, recently saved from demolition through a nationally recognized preservation effort, and the Milwaukee Fire Department Administration Building, which was recently named and dedicated in recognition of his achievements. His legacy also lives on in numerous neighbor-

hood churches, homes, businesses, and municipal buildings throughout Milwaukee, reflecting his commitment to accessible, community-centered design.

This program builds on an award-winning preservation initiative led by Docomomo Wisconsin and the Milwaukee Preservation Alliance which received a national Advocacy Citation of Merit from Docomomo US at the Modernism in America Awards 2025 for its role in preserving Central City Plaza.

The project was also featured nationally this year by the National Trust for Historic Preservation, spotlighting Robinson's work and its cultural significance to Wisconsin's architectural history.

Following the lecture, Kim Robinson, son of Alonzo Robinson, Jr., will join the program for a Q&A session, offering personal insight into his father's life, work, and enduring legacy.



As part of the event, Docomomo Wisconsin will pres-
