# MCTS to raise fares, adjust service in 2026: Here's what to expect

Along with the fare increases, MCTS is set to roll out a service plan on Jan. 11 to maximize transit and paratransit services

Starting Thursday, Milwaukee County Transit System (MCTS) riders will pay \$2.75 for a single ride, up from \$2, the first fare increase in nearly two decades.

The increase comes as MCTS faces a projected budget deficit of about \$14 million in 2026, even after spending remaining federal American Rescue Plan Act funds.

Along with the fare increases, MCTS is set to roll out a service plan on Jan. 11 to maximize transit and paratransit services.

Here's what you need to know:

The fare increases extend beyond single rides. MCTS's fare capping system, which stops charging riders after they spend a certain amount on rides within set time periods, will also see increases.

#### Daily (3 a.m. - 2:59 a.m.)

- Regular Fare: \$8.25
- Reduced Fare: \$4.00

#### Weekly (calendar week, Monday to Sunday)

- Regular Fare: \$33.00
- Reduced Fare: \$16.50

#### Monthly (calendar month 1st - 31st)

- Regular Fare: \$99.00
- Reduced Fare: \$49.50

#### How to know if you qualify for reduced fare

Regular fare applies to riders between the ages of 12-64. Riders who qualify for reduced fare are people between the ages of 65 and older, ages 6-11 or with a qualifying disability. Children 5 and under ride free.

#### How to be eligible for fare capping

MCTS is implementing a new fare capping system which it hopes will boost rid-



ership back to pre-pandemic levels.

To be eligible for fare capping, riders must pay using their WisGO card or the Umo mobile app account. The system only works if riders use the same payment type for all rides.

Riders can still pay with cash, but will not receive the benefits of fare capping or transfers.

#### Two-phase service plan

In addition to the fare increases, starting Jan. 11, MCTS will roll out a two-phase service plan to maximize transit and paratransit services. The service changes outlined in the 2026 Service Plan will roll out in two phases: the Winter Service Plan and the Spring Service Plan.

Phase I starts January 11, 2026, and will maintain all existing routes. Phase II is scheduled for March 8, 2026, as MCTS said it will continue to streamline service and ensure long-term sustainability.

By postponing route segment elimination to March, MCTS said that winter passengers, who would be most impacted by changes, have more time to adjust to the reduction.

#### Milwaukee County Transit System

#### PHASE I: Winter Service Plan

The Winter Service Plan continues current service levels on five routes previously targeted for segment elimination. It also provides peak service on six routes originally scheduled for full elimination, and reduces frequency on 16 routes as previously proposed.



The second round of updates is scheduled for March 8, 2026, as MCTS continues to streamline service and ensure long-term sustainability. With the seasonal service changes in the spring, MCTS will implement both segment and frequency reductions on these five routes as previously proposed:


can males offer. Accept this fact and move on.



# Why Christians must speak out against 'Christian Nationalism'

I am deeply concerned about the rise of Christian nationalism in this country. I say this not just as a Christian but as the president of Pacific School of Religion (PSR), a progressive Christian seminary founded in 1866.

Christian nationalism, and the ideologies that have fueled it from the very founding of our nation, have left a centuries-long trail of devastation that continues to this day. Through an alliance with white supremacy, it has served as a justification for many of our country's sins: the genocide and dispossession of Native peoples; the establishment of chattel slavery and the structural racism that replaced it; the subjugation of women and LGBTQ+ people; and the physical and political exclusion of migrants in this country. So yes, I am deeply concerned.

Christianity began as a tiny movement trying to make sense of the life and teachings of a man killed by state violence. The core of Jesus's story is that God is not found in the power of the state, but in the powerlessness of the One whose call for liberation led to His execution. The belief that God is with those on the margins, along with His commandment not just to love our neighbors, but to welcome the stranger, should

be a guide to leaders who attempt to lay claim to the Christian tradition.

Instead, Christian nationalists twist the experience of a group who believed God was on the side of the oppressed and use it to describe the most powerful nation in the world. It denies privilege and whitewashes actions that are antithetical to the tradition they're derived from by relying on violence, exclusion, and a hatred of the diversity God has created.

We can already see this dangerous ideology at work in our country now, from the January 6th assault on the Capitol to the countless legislative and legal efforts to restrict voting rights, turn back the clock on LGBTQ+ equality and reproductive rights, and pass xenophobic and inhumane immigration policies.

Because extremist Chris-

tian rhetoric is behind much of the leadership, financing, and rhetoric attacking equality and civil rights today, many progressive social movements have despaired over the role of religion in public life. But ceding the power of religious narratives to extremists can have serious consequences. I urge secular progressives not to discount the voices of those of us who engage in religious narratives, including progressive Christians who have historically contributed immensely to movements for social justice.

I urge my fellow Christians to engage their communities and churches to foster understanding and inclusivity across the political divide. Let's actively challenge the narratives of exclusion and intolerance by advocating for policies that uphold justice and equality for all, embracing the true teachings of love and compassion that lie at the heart of Christianity.

At PSR, we're working to reframe the public narrative so that a new, diverse generation can see how the transformative power of faith can be part of the solution, not the problem. Together, we can create a world where all can thrive.

**Grammy-winning organist Paul Jacobs** makes his Milwaukee debut (Feb. 6-7)

in concerts devoted to his instrument's sonic majesty. Following the high-octane overture to Beethoven's only opera, *Fidelio*, American composer Samuel Barber's *Toccata Festiva* revels in the modern organ's widely varied powers of expression — though hearing Saint-Saëns's triumphant "Organ" symphony thunder throughout the concert hall will be an event all on its own.

Rounding out the stellar succession of concerts is the globe-trotting cello superstar **Johannes Moser**, who brings his inimitable artist-

ry to Anna Thorvaldsottir's "volcanic new concerto" (*The Times*), *Before we fall*, under the baton of guest conductor **Alpesh Chauhan**, who leads the orchestra in sumptuous selections from Tchaikovsky's heartfelt, instantly recognizable score for the iconic ballet *The Sleeping Beauty* (Feb. 20-21).

# Mary L. Nohl Fund 2026 Fellowships Awarded

Five Visual Artists Share \$70,000 in 2026 Cycle

Five recipients of the Mary L. Nohl Fund Fellowships for Individual Artists have been selected from a field of 168 applicants in the twenty-third annual competition. Evelyn Patricia Terry and Della Wells were chosen in the Established Artist category and will each receive a \$20,000 fellowship. Nomka Enkhee, Laura Farahzad Mayer, and Yinan Wang will receive Emerging Artist fellowships of \$10,000. Each artist will also receive a \$5,000 professional development/production budget. All of the 2026 fellows are based in Milwaukee, Wisconsin. In addition to receiving an award, the Nohl Fellows will participate in professional development activities and studio visits, and in an exhibition at the Haggerty Museum of Art in the summer of 2027. An exhibition catalogue will be published and disseminated nationally.

The finalists in the Established Artist category are Mike Gibisser, David Najib Kasir, Brit Krohmer, and Heidi Parkes.

The finalists in the Emerging artist category are Kayle Karbowski, Brandom Terres-Sanchez, and Sean Williamson.

The panel of jurors included Anthony Graham, Senior Curator at Berkeley Art Museum and Pacific Film Archive, Berkeley, California; Mia Lopez, Curator of Latinx Art at the McNay Art Museum in San Antonio, Texas; and Eileen Jeng Lynch, Director of Curatorial Programs, The Bronx Museum, New York. We were delighted to bring the jurors to Milwaukee for a public talk at the Haggerty Museum of Art and for studio visits with all twelve finalists.

The Mary L. Nohl Fund Fellowships for Individual Artists provide unrestricted funds for artists to create new work or complete work in progress. The program is open to practicing artists residing in the four-county area (Milwaukee, Waukesha, Ozaukee, and Washington counties). Funded by the Greater Milwaukee Foundation's Mary L. Nohl Fund, the Nohl Fellowship program is a central pillar of Lynden's support for artists. The Mary L. Nohl Fund also supports a Suitcase Fund for exporting work by local artists beyond the four-county area.

Artist Mary L. Nohl of Fox Point, Wisconsin, died in December 2001 at the age of 87. She left a \$9.6 million bequest to the Greater Milwaukee Foundation. Her fund supports local visual arts and education programs, keeping

her passion for the visual arts alive in the community.

## About the Fellows: Established Artists

### Evelyn Patricia Terry

Fueled by an instructor's advice—"You graduate as printmakers, but feel free to explore other art disciplines"—Evelyn Patricia Terry built a career after earning a BFA and MS from the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee and an MFA from the School of the Art Institute of Chicago. As a full-time professional artist, she enjoys writing, curating, mentoring, collecting art, archiving, and producing non-objective and figurative pastel drawings. She has created commissioned oil portraits, found-object assemblages, marked-up sewn recycled drawings, and book art using her recycled monotypes. Her recent site-specific commissioned installation at Thrive On King, America's Favor, America: Guests Who Came to Dinner and Stayed (2024), features a 16-foot table with recycled wood-turned legs, globally sourced ethnic dolls, a George Ray McCormick Sr. sculpture, and plates adorned with raw-food replicas. Together, these elements encourage healthy choices, thoughtful reflection, and a deeper understanding of America's beginnings—how and why we are here.

"The good that I am seeking is also seeking me," Terry, a Black American artist, affirms. "My work contributes to 'Making America Great—Eventually.'" She is interested in artists who exemplify creative freedom: in her pantheon, you'll find Faith Ringgold alongside news-makers Andy Warhol and Pablo Picasso. Philosophically, metaphysics guides her manifestation of "the unseen," while phenomenology informs "the seen"—nontraditional material choices that include "girly things" such as beads, buttons, jewelry parts, and glitter. Art consultants, museums, and galleries have assisted her in directing her artwork to more than 500 corporate, private, museum, and special library collections worldwide. She has exhibited locally, regionally, and internationally in Spain, Germany, Japan, and Russia, and has created public art projects for her neighborhood and for Mitchell International Airport. Terry was named

a City of Milwaukee Artist of the Year in 2014.

### Della Wells

Della Wells (b. 1951, Milwaukee, Wisconsin), is a nationally recognized collage artist. As a child, she invented stories and characters based on her mother's recollections of growing up in North Carolina during the 1920s through the 1940s. This practice led to her later narrative style. Much of Wells's work takes place in Mambo Land, a conceptual environment "where Black women rule."

Her collages, drawings, and recent collaborative textiles employ a symbolic vocabulary of imagery such as a chicken (symbol of fear and truth), ancestors peering through windows, butterflies (emancipation), and the reframing and reclaiming of racist tropes such as watermelon, alligators, and Miss Ann.

A play about her life by York, Don't Tell Me I Can't Fly, was workshopped at The Kennedy Center in Washington, D.C. and premiered at the Marcus Center for the Performing Arts in Milwaukee. Wells has illustrated two children's books. Her work is included in the collections of the Milwaukee Art Museum; the Chazen Museum of Art, Madison, Wisconsin; the Museum of Wisconsin Art, West Bend, Wisconsin; the Intuit Art Museum, Chicago; the University of Wisconsin-Whitewater; the Bunker Artspace, Palm Beach, Florida; the Lumber Room Collection, Portland, Oregon; and many private collections. Wells received the City of Milwaukee Artist of the Year Award in 2016. She is represented by the Portrait Society Gallery in Milwaukee and serves on the board of the Bronzeville Center for the Arts.

## Emerging Artists

Nomka Enkhee is obsessed with repetitions, rituals, and tics, dealing with themes of the domestic, migration, translation, and systems of caretaking and migration. By merging drawing and poetry, she creates a lexicon of bodies through sculpture and performance. Enkhee is in constant conversation with the

objects she creates through methods of preservation. Over the past year, she has invested in researching Tuuli, a form of oral Mongolian epic poetry. A traditional Tuuli combines eulogies, spells, idiomatic phrases, fairy tales, myths, and folk songs. She weaves in traditional elements of oral storytelling in her work, reinterpreting narration through experimental writing and performance. "I'm invested in exploring translation and its inherent gaps," observes Enkhee, "creating an invisible void, friction, and immense freedom."

Enkhee studied sculpture at the Kunsthochschule Mainz in Germany, received her BFA from the Milwaukee Institute of Art & Design (MIAD), and is an alumna of the Yale Norfolk School of Art. She has received the generator Art x Sherman Phoenix emerging artist grant, a fellowship from the Plum Blossom Initiative's Bridge Work program, and has attended residencies at ACRE, Image Text Workshop



# Starting the new year healthy? Here's the checklist you actually need

Chances are, your New Year's resolutions include things like "get back in the gym" or "eat healthier." But what about "schedule a diabetes screening" or "get up to date on my routine vaccinations"? If those didn't make the list, don't worry. You're not alone, and we've got you covered.

## Why preventive care matters for black communities

Preventive care is especially important for Black individuals. Long-standing health disparities, systemic barriers, and racial inequities in healthcare increase our risk for chronic and life-threatening conditions like heart disease, diabetes, cancer, and high blood pressure.

By taking an active role in preventive healthcare through routine screenings, vaccinations, and exams, we can:

- Catch health concerns earlier
- Better manage existing



conditions

- Improve quality of life and long-term outcomes

Preventive care isn't just about avoiding illness. It's about protecting our future.

Below is a breakdown of key screenings, vaccinations, and exams every Black individual should consider as we head into the new year.

## Screenings for high-risk conditions

### Heart disease and cardiovascular disease

Heart disease affects the heart and blood vessels and remains a leading cause of death in Black communities. Screenings may include checking blood pressure, cholesterol, blood sugar, vital signs, electrocardiograms

(ECGs), stress tests, or imaging of the heart. Black individuals face higher risk due to stress, food access issues, unequal healthcare access, and systemic inequities.

### Diabetes

Diabetes occurs when blood sugar levels are consistently too high. Screening typically involves a blood test to measure glucose levels. Black individuals are at higher risk due to social determinants of health such as food deserts, economic stress, systemic discrimination, genetics, and limited access to consistent care.

### Hypertension (high blood pressure)

Hypertension happens when blood pressure stays elevated over time, forcing

the heart to work harder. Screening involves a blood pressure cuff placed on the arm to measure systolic and diastolic pressure. Black individuals are more likely to develop hypertension due to genetics, stress, high sodium diets, and structural barriers to healthcare.

immune system fight seasonal flu viruses. It is administered as a shot or nasal spray. Black individuals experience higher flu-related complications due to underlying conditions, limited access to care, and insurance barriers.

## Essential health exams

### Dental exam

A dental exam includes a visual inspection of teeth, gums, tongue, and jaw to check for cavities, gum disease, and oral cancer. Oral health is closely tied to heart health and overall wellness.

### Eye exam

Eye exams assess vision, eye pressure, and overall eye health. They can detect conditions like glaucoma, cataracts, macular degeneration, and signs of diabetes or hypertension. Exams may include reading an eye chart, pupil dilation, and prescription testing.

### Mental health exam

A mental health exam evaluates emotional, cognitive, and behavioral well-being through discussion and observation. Despite high levels of stress and trauma exposure, Black individuals are less likely to receive mental health treatment due to stigma, cost, mistrust, and a shortage of culturally competent providers.

As we move into the New Year, let's make health and wellness a true priority. Not just something we talk about or start briefly, but something we commit to consistently.

### Laura Farahzad Mayer

Laura Farahzad Mayer is a Milwaukee-based artist and educator. Her experience growing up as the daughter of an Iranian immigrant in a small town informs her work, which navigates through the grief of losing her father while seeking to connect two generations—her father and her children—who were nev-

er living at the same time. Her work explores themes of memory, grief, culture, and generational storytelling. Farahzad Mayer works across many mediums in her practice—process and form are often conceptual considerations in making the work—but frequently returns to printmaking, artist books, and small sculptures. Collaboration is an important aspect of her work, and her children are often active participants.

Laura Farahzad Mayer earned her BFA at the University of Wisconsin-Stevens Point before beginning a career as a graphic artist in Chicago. She completed her MA and MFA at the University of Iowa where she also earned a certificate from the Center for the Book. Farahzad Mayer is a professor at the Milwaukee Institute of Art & Design (MIAD).

### Yinan Wang 王一男



Yinan Wang is a filmmaker born and raised in Beijing and now based in Milwaukee. Working across personal, documentary, and nonfiction forms, his practice explores how memory, language, humor, ritual, and food shape our sense of home—following the shifting contours of cultural identity shaped as much by migration as by longing.

His recent work, *甜膩膩 Thick & Sweet*, reconstructs both personal and collective memories of a local Chinese restaurant through cutouts, reenactments, found footage, and fragments of earlier films, quietly probing how images form—and deform—cultural identity.

Wang received his BFA from the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee and his MFA from Temple University. His work has been shared across festivals, community programs, classrooms, and international venues. A 2022 Flaherty Fellow and 2020 University Film and Video Fellow, he has received the Cream City Cinema Jury Award and the Sikay Tang Critical Lens Award, and his practice has been supported by the Brico Forward Fund, the Harry L. Friedberg Award, and the Robert A. Nelson Scholarship.




