The Milwaukee Brewers unveiled a redesigned City Connect uniform on Thursday, April 9, 2026. Shifting from a Milwaukee-focused design to one representing the entire state. The uniform

is described as having a blue base inspired by Wisconsin's lakes and rivers, a cream accent recalling Door County beaches and sandstone bluffs and a sunset gradient flowing through the "Wisconsin Wordmark".

Other new design features include a wheat and barley braid on the shoulders, a revitalized Barrel Man patch with a state outline and the state motto, "Forward", inside the collar.

Rick Schlesinger, President of Business Operations and Mark Attanasio, Owner, were instrumental in the development and launch of the team's City Connect uniforms. Bernie Brewer, Barrel Man, Cheerleaders, and the Sausages were on hand to help celebrate the City Connect Launch Party.

Northwestern Mutual commits \$3M to build affordable homes in Milwaukee's Amani neighborhood

Northwestern Mutual is pledging more than \$3-million to build over 90 affordable homes in Milwaukee's Amani neighborhood, continuing its efforts to revitalize local communities.

Northwestern Mutual has called Milwaukee home for 168 years, with its headquarters located inside a massive downtown tower. Now, the financial insurance company is making sure others can call Milwaukee home, too.

"Northwestern Mutual is proud to be announcing that we are committing more than \$3-million to support the construction of more than 90 affordable new homes here in the Amani neighborhood," said Audra Brennan, vice president of philanthropy at Northwestern Mutual. "This is an extension of the work that Northwestern Mutual has been doing over years to really revitalize neighborhoods."

The project, which will span the next three years, involves partnerships with Milwaukee Habitat for Humanity and local developer Emem Group. The homes will range from two to four bedrooms and measure approximately 1,300 square feet.

For Michael Emem, president and CEO of Emem Group, the initiative is deeply personal.

"My mother, when she first moved to Milwaukee in the '80s, this is where she first moved. Amani, my first neighborhood in the city. This is a neighborhood

that has its challenges but also has a lot of opportunities. It needs developers, it needs local homegrown talent and people who believe in the community to invest in the community. That's what we're doing through the vehicle of real estate," Emem said.

These new homes are part of Northwestern Mutual's broader goal of completing 500 affordable homes across Milwaukee by 2030.

The Amani neighborhood, which is located west of Interstate 43 between North Avenue to the south and Burleigh to the north, is expected to benefit significantly from the new construction. Northwestern Mutual says 64 percent of homes there were built before 1940 and only 32 percent of residents are homeowners.

"This is really going to be able to transform the neighborhood. Just being able to have safe, affordable housing is something that's so critical to everything else that's

important in a community," Brennan said.

Emem highlighted the importance of housing stability, reflecting on his own family's experience.

"The fact that my mother was a homeowner and we had stable housing contributed to my success," Emem said. "Children shouldn't have to be worried about where they're going to lay their head, you know, every night. So, housing stability is extremely important."

The new homes will include a mix of resident-owned properties and affordable rentals for eligible individuals. For some homes, the plan is to have tenants rent for 15 years at a rate of \$1,100 a month and then have the opportunity to buy the home for about \$100,000 after 15 years.

Northwestern Mutual's investment is made possible through an affordable housing tax increment district in partnership with the Dominican Center, Amani United, Community Development

Alliance, the city of Milwaukee, Milwaukee Habitat for Humanity, Emem Group, Milwaukee Community Crossroads and Ezekiel Hope.

While most of the construction will take place this year and next, Northwestern Mutual noted some homes are already nearing move-in readiness.

Getting to know the organizations and individuals helping make our community better

Rust College A'Cappella Choir shows why relationships are the real currency

In this week's Small Business Spotlight, we're broadening the conversation beyond storefronts and balance sheets to talk about relationships, pipelines, branding, and long-term investment—the same fundamentals that sustain successful businesses.

I sat down in Milwaukee with Rust College A'Cappella Choir Director Dr. Karl E. Twyner, along with the Rust College Milwaukee Chapter of the International Alumni Club (RCMCIAC) President Tiffany Staples, and Vice President Melaney Paige. What became immediately clear is that the work they're doing mirrors what strong business leaders already know: When you invest in people intentionally, the returns multiply.

Our Conversation

LD: Dr. Twyner, watching the choir perform today felt less like a college concert and more like watching a well-run organization operate at a high level. How do you approach building students the same way a business builds talent?

Dr. Twyner: That's a great comparison, because I don't see students as they are when they walk in; I see their potential. In business, you don't hire just for today; you hire for what someone can become.

That's exactly how I work with students. Some come in with rough edges, but they need structure, accountability, and someone who will check on them when they're not performing at their best. That's development. That's leadership.

That's workforce preparation.

LD: That sounds like talent development and retention.

Dr. Twyner: Exactly. We started this program from scratch three years ago. Today, many of our choir members are campus leaders—Miss Rust, Mr. Rust, SGA leaders. If you want leadership on campus, you'll find them in the choir or music department.

That's culture building.

LD: You also mentioned accreditation and program expansion. That felt very similar to positioning a business for funding and growth.

Dr. Twyner: Absolutely.

Accreditation is like credibility. Grantors ask questions or legitimacy, how you maintain stability and how will you continue to build and grow?

We're pursuing NASM (National Association School of Music) accreditation so that when our students graduate, their degrees carry weight nationally and internationally. We're also expanding into instrumental programs—strings, jazz band, symphonic band—because diversification matters.

In business, if you only offer one service, you're vulnerable. This is about building an ecosystem.

LD: One thing that really stood out was how you recruit across disciplines, not just music majors.

Dr. Twyner: That's networking. I recruit students to Rust College first. Some are biology majors, computer science majors—many from Nigeria. What happens naturally is collaboration.

You see music students studying alongside science students. They trade strengths. Nobody fails alone. That's exactly how a healthy workplace functions.

LD: Tiffany, from an alumni perspective, the work you're doing reminded me of business development and market expansion. How do you see it?

Tiffany Staples: That's exactly what it is. The International Alumni Club has a 10-10-10 initiative—recruit 10 students, recruit 10 alumni, and raise \$10,000 annually. That's goal setting. Which is a measurable impact.

We're also focused on branding Rust College throughout Milwaukee and surrounding communities.

In business, if people don't know your name, they can't invest in you. The same applies here.

Rust is a small HBCU, but

small doesn't mean insignificant. Sometimes it means agile, personal, and deeply connected—which many businesses strive to be.

LD: And the personal piece really matters.

Tiffany Staples: It does. At Rust, students aren't numbers. Faculty know their names. If something goes wrong, someone steps in. That kind of care builds loyalty—and loyal people become true ambassadors. That's true in education and business.

LD: Melaney, your focus on marketing and visibility felt very much like a brand strategy.

Melaney Paige: It is. We go into high schools, college fairs, alumni mixers, and community events because visibility matters. If you're not present where decisions are being made, you get overlooked.

We also recognize that timing and messaging are key. Next year, we want earlier media engagement—TV, print, radio—because awareness drives turnout, and turnout drives funding.

Just like a business launch, you can't show up after the sale is over.

LD: One thing I appreciated was how you all talked about the choir as ambassadors.

Melaney Paige: They are. When they walk into a city, they represent Rust College, the alumni, and the broader HBCU community. They're selling excellence without saying a word.

But behind that excellence is discipline. Standards matter. That's professionalism.

In closing: Education, arts, and business speak the same language

What this conversation reinforced is that successful education programs and successful businesses are built on the same foundation:

- Intentional leadership
- Strategic growth
- Brand awareness
- Relationship capital
- Long-term investment in people

Dr. Twyner isn't just directing a choir—he's developing a global brand rooted in excellence. The Milwaukee Alumni aren't just hosting concerts, they're expanding networks, pipelines, and opportunity.

And in a city like Milwaukee, where business, culture, and community are deeply intertwined, this is exactly the kind of model worth paying attention to.

Because whether you're talking about music or commerce, the truth remains the same: strong connections create lasting success.

MPS to add more teachers for 2026-27, with focus on class sizes

Milwaukee Public Schools (MPS) will have an estimated 89 more classroom teaching positions next year as part of a plan to manage and reduce class sizes while building a balanced 2026-27 budget, MPS Superintendent Brenda Cassellius, EdD, has announced.

As the district works to prepare a state-mandated balanced budget, it remains focused on protecting classrooms while eliminating a \$46-million deficit identified in the district's 2024-25 budget by external auditors.

Projected school staffing increases include:

These numbers are preliminary estimates and will continue to be reviewed as the district continues to review critical needs requests from schools and seek additional savings.

- 89 licensed classroom teachers next year, from 3,903 to 3,992, with staffing levels adjusted based on enrollment and student needs
- 63 paraprofessional positions, expanding from 1,319 to 1,382, including new guidelines that place paraprofessionals in early childhood classrooms and supporting schools that requested

flexibility around class size standards

- Five additional school psychologist positions supported by a newly acquired federal grant
- An increase of two children's health assistant positions

Additional key student support staffing includes:

- No change to the total number of art, music, and physical education teachers (443)
- No change to the number of library (118), nursing (111), and social work (203) positions
- A decrease of 10 school counselor positions due to enrollment (counselors will also move from 191 to 200 workdays to align with peer roles)

District staffing decisions are based on applying a consistent standard of care to meet student needs, while approving critical requests for additional classroom support.

School leaders also received their budgets for supplies and related expenses this spring.

To address the budget deficit and rising costs, MPS is identifying savings wherever possible. Read a detailed budget presentation on the district's 2026-27 budget planning page at <https://www.milwaukeepublicschools.org/about/directory/finance/budget-services/budget-planning>. Savings include:

- A soft hiring freeze on nonessential positions (classroom positions are essential)

- An estimated \$5 million to \$10 million in contract savings, found in a comprehensive review by the district's procurement and senior leadership teams

For next year, MPS has identified a projected \$160 million in new revenue and savings, including:

- \$47-million in additional referendum revenue
- \$30 million from reductions in Central Services and non-classroom positions
- \$11-million in increased state special education reimbursement
- \$40-million in short-term savings resulting from fewer charter schools, while noting that lost enrollment will decrease future revenue

At the same time, MPS anticipates a projected \$154 million to \$171-million in new expenses. Specific items include:

- Eliminating the \$46-million deficit
- \$25-million to \$42-million in wage increases, including step and lane increases for employee tenure and advanced degrees. It also includes a cost-of-living increase up to 2.63 percent, currently in active bargaining

with union partners; the offers presented would bring all employees to a 2.63 percent base wage increase by January 1.

- \$24.6-million for additional classroom positions to manage and reduce class size
- \$20-million in increased employee benefit costs, including healthcare

In addition, the district is meeting and conferring with union partners to seek to increase paraprofessional hours and address compensation for children's health assistants (\$3.6-million estimated cost).

The district is making its budget decisions amid long-standing external challenges faced by school districts statewide. Those include more than 15 years without inflation-adjusted increases in general state aid and no new general aid in the 2025-27 biennial state budget. Recent voter-approved referenda have offset but not replaced all lost funding.

The district will present its final budget to the Milwaukee Board of School Directors in May, remaining focused on its board-approved priorities: protecting classrooms, keeping schools safe, investing in student achievement, and restoring fiscal health.

Black Maternal Health Week 2026: What you need to know right now

Black Maternal Health Week is observed every year from April 11 through 17. It's not a health observance in the traditional sense — it's a week of grief and glory. Grief over the sisters we've lost, and glory in the movement that keeps fighting for the ones who are still here.

Every April, with breaking hearts, we acknowledge Black mothers and mothers-to-be. The question follows, heavy each time: how does childbirth still take Black women's lives?

This year, the stakes feel higher than ever before. The data confirms that the gaps are widening.

Federal support systems relied upon by Black mothers face sharp reductions. But our resistance is rising, too. And this year's theme says it all.

The theme: "Rooted in Justice and Joy"

The 2026 Black Maternal Health Week theme — "Rooted in Justice and Joy" — is both a declaration and a demand. Initiated by the Black Mamas Matter Alliance (BMMA), this moment marks their 10th year of organized advocacy that has shifted policy, changed narratives, and saved lives.

As one advocate put it: when Black women are discussed primarily through the lens of mortality and crisis, joy becomes an act of resistance. That focus shifts perception, and instead of seeing motherhood through loss alone, space opens up for other truths — affection exists here, as does resilience and connection, even as it demands that systems be held accountable.

BMMA describes the theme as a "liberated future rooted in restoration, justice, and joy" — one that acknowledges systemic oppression while calling for something better. Not just surviving, but thriving.

The numbers that cannot be ignored

Let's talk about what the data actually says. Because if we don't look it in the face, we cannot change it.

- 44.8 deaths per 100,000 live births — the Black maternal mortality rate in 2024
- 3x+ Black women are more than three times more likely to die from pregnancy-related causes than white women
- 80%+ of pregnancy-related deaths in the U.S. are preventable, according to the CDC

The most recent data from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), released in March 2026,



show a troubling trend. Though nationwide maternal deaths declined modestly — to 17.9 deaths per 100,000 live births — the number among Black women was 44.8. In contrast, white women experienced a rate of 14.2. Meanwhile, Hispanic women recorded 12.1.

Black women were the only group whose rate showed no statistically significant decline. The gap is not closing. In some measures, it is widening.

The leading causes of maternal death among Black women include preeclampsia and eclampsia, issues tied to post-delivery heart function (postpartum cardiomyopathy), along with severe bleeding during childbirth (obstetric hemorrhage). Though less common overall, preeclampsia appears in Black mothers about 60 percent more often compared to their white counterparts. Survival odds drop sharply — their risk of dying from it is roughly five times greater than that of white women.

Postpartum cardiomyopathy — a form of heart failure that can emerge in the weeks or months after delivery — claims Black women at five times the rate.

And here is a truth that many people don't know: most maternal deaths don't happen in the delivery room. More than half occur in the days, weeks, and months after birth. Among Black women, a larger portion of these losses happen in what's called the late postpartum period — 43 days to a year after delivery. This pattern reveals critical gaps in follow-up care that disproportionately leave Black mothers without a safety net when they need one most.

The mental health crisis no one is talking about enough

The physical toll on Black mothers is devastating, but the unseen mental health crisis deserves just as much attention.

According to the *Black Mamas Matter Alliance's 2026 Fact Sheet*, between 29 and 44 percent of Black women experience postpartum depressive symptoms, yet few are properly identified, and even fewer receive treatment.

Perinatal mood and anxiety disorders (PMADs) — which include postpartum depression, anxiety, obsessive-compulsive disorder, and PTSD — affect 1 in 5 pregnant and postpartum women nationally. But for Black women, the barriers to getting help are filled with obstacles.

There's the "Strong Black Woman" image, the deeply ingrained cultural expectation that we Black women handle pain in silence, without asking for help. Following that closely is health care provider distrust, born from generations of medical racism and the very real experience of being dismissed in clinical settings. Close to that are the culturally sensitive screening tools that don't account for the ways Black women experience and describe depression.

And there's the looming threat of Medicaid cuts in 2026. Medicaid covers more than 60 percent of births to Black mothers in the U.S. It is also the primary payer for mental health services. The One Big Beautiful Bill Act threatens that support through almost a trillion-dollar reduction in funds across 10 years, putting both maternal and mental health coverage for Black families in serious jeopardy.

Women we're honoring this week

One of the most heartbreaking aspects of this crisis is that it does not spare advocates, healers, and those who have devoted their lives to protecting other Black women in childbirth.

At 31-years-old, Dr. Janell Green Smith carried deep purpose into her work. She was known as The Loc'd Midwife — a certified nurse-midwife from South Carolina who spent her career fighting racial disparities in maternal care, supporting women through their reproductive journeys, and encouraging other Black women to pursue their dreams in medicine. She earned her Doctor of Nursing Practice degree in 2024 and was excited, her family said, about her February due date.

Dr. Green Smith died on New Year's Day 2026, less than a week after giving birth

to her daughter, Eden, after developing preeclampsia. She knew the statistics and spoke about them regularly on social media. Smith shared that she became a midwife because she wanted to be part of the solution. Her worst fear, her sister said, had come to pass.

We also carry Shamony Gibson, who died in 2019 after her concerns about postpartum symptoms were dismissed. Her mother, Shawnee Benton Gibson, has since become one of the most powerful advocates for Black maternal health in the country, co-founding The ARIAH Foundation to honor her daughter's name. Shamony's story — and the art installation "In Her Honor" unveiled in Congress just last year — reminds us that this is real breath and real grief.

These are our people. We carry all the women whose names we may never know. The ones who died in intensive care, at home, in emergency rooms, whose deaths were preventable, and who deserved better.

Why wealth and education don't protect black women

One of the most important things to understand about this crisis is that it's not about individual health choices, education, or poverty alone.

In 2023, groundbreaking research from the National Bureau of Economic Research found that the wealthiest Black woman in California faces a higher risk of maternal death than the least wealthy white woman. A college degree does not close the gap. A good job does not close the gap.

This study showed how Black families, no matter their socioeconomic status, are disproportionately affected by structural racism in medical settings.

One out of three Black and Hispanic women who gave birth in a hospital reported provider mistreatment, while one in five white women did. Our concerns and symptoms are dismissed. Doctors downplay our pain.

Unfortunately, this is not a glitch in the system; it's how the system was designed.

What you can do right now

Black Maternal Health Week is about awareness and action. Here's how you can show up this week and beyond.

1. Learn the warning signs. Watch for symptoms of postpartum preeclampsia, postpartum depression, and cardiomyopathy that can appear weeks after delivery. Share what you know; you could

save a life.

2. Support a Black birth worker. Doulas, midwives, and community health workers are often self-funded and under-resourced. Many have community fundraisers and ways you can donate.

3. Find your local BMHW events. Events are happening across the country this week — from Atlanta to Philadelphia to New York to California. See our sidebar for details.

4. Contact your representatives. The Medicaid cuts are hitting Black mothers harder than others. Use BMMA's advocacy tools to make your voice heard.

5. Donate to Black-led maternal health organizations. Organizations like the Black Mamas Matter Alliance, Sisters in Loss, Shades of Blue Project, and Oshun Family Center are doing life-saving work with small budgets.




