## Somali Resource Center of Milwaukee hosts 'Community Halal Food Box Donation' event



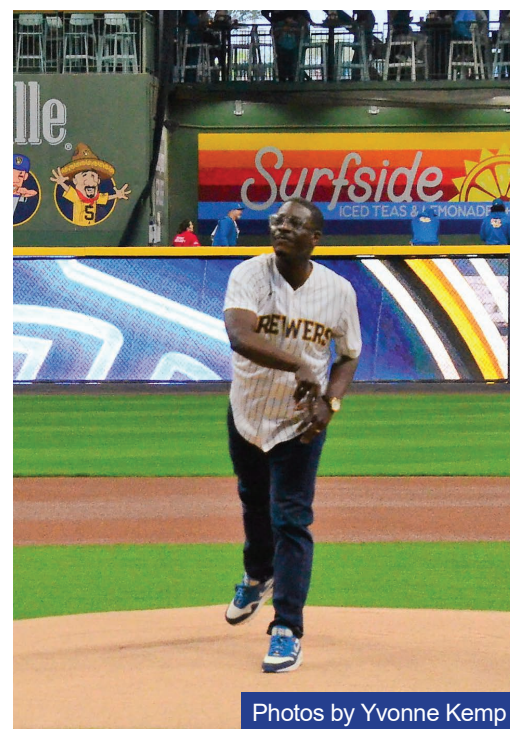
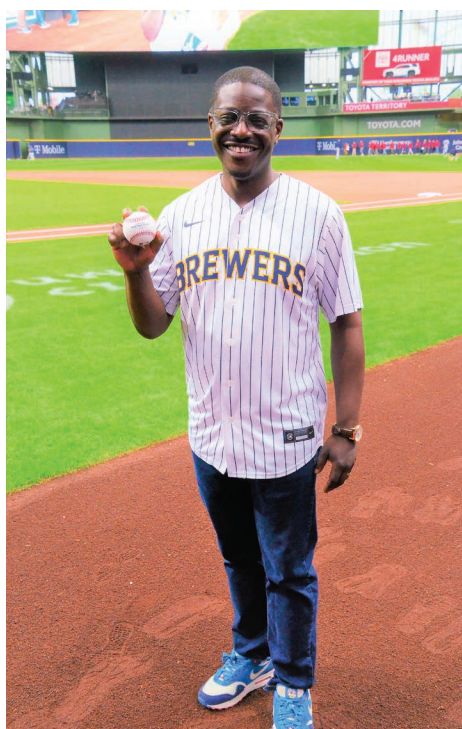

In Islam, foods are broadly classified as either halal (permissible) or haram (forbidden). # Lucille Berrien, courageous community leader, passes away

Lucille Berrien, a long-time community leader, political organizer, and beloved family matriarch, passed away on Friday, May 22, 2026, surrounded by family. Berrien was 98 years young.

Berrien was the first Black woman to run for mayor of Milwaukee in 1972 and worked alongside Father James Groppi during Milwaukee's fair housing marches and civil rights movement. She was also a former member of the Black Panther Party and helped found the Milwaukee Alliance Against Racist and Political Repression.

Beyond politics and protest lines, Berrien spent decades serving low-income families and welfare recipients while fostering more than 90 children.

In an interview with *TMJ4 News* Berrien's first granddaughter, Faithe Colas said, "To have my grandmother be part of the fair housing marches in Milwaukee, to be part of Milwaukee's civil rights movement, empowering mothers on welfare — how could you not appreciate someone's passion."

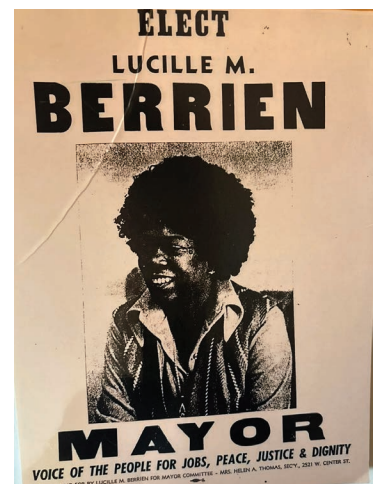
Family members said Berrien's passion for helping others was rooted in her faith and belief in service. Colas described her grandmother as a woman who constantly reminded people to love one another, respect each other and continue working together even through dis-

agreement.

"She was a woman of God," Colas explained. "She believed in the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit. She believed you have to love like Jesus, do like Jesus and treat people the way you want to be treated. She believed in dignity and respect."

Her family, friends, and the many communities she served mourn her loss.

## The legacy of a Godly woman: Dr. Louise A. Mormon

It was on May 29, 1931 that God saw fit to bring into this world a tiny little girl in a tiny little city called England, Arkansas. Her parents were Ulysses and Corrine Turner, and she was the oldest of 5 girls: Lucy B., Mae Doris, Artellis, and Erlene. Ulysses and Corrine gave the name of Anna Louise to their little bundle of joy. At some point in life, Anna Louise decided she didn't like her name the way it was, so she changed it to Louise Anna. The family relocated to Milwaukee, Wisconsin with dreams of a better life. A better life was achieved and the family flourished.

Louise received her early education in the Milwaukee Public School System. After having graduated from 4th Street Elementary School (now Golda Meir), she proceeded and graduated from Lincoln High School. Her lifelong dream of loving and caring for people inspired her to continue her education and press toward that goal. She entered and graduated from the Milwaukee Area

Technical College. That degree prepared her to take the State Board Medical Exam, which she passed, and consequently received her license to become a Licensed Practical Nurse.

She was united in holy matrimony with Oliver Strozier Bey and God blessed the two of them with four children; Jeffrey L., Brenda M., Paricia L., and Areatha G. After 7 years of marriage, Oliver's earthly life came to an end, and Louise became a widow with four small children. But, God said she was not to be alone. He orchestrated her meeting and later being married to a gentleman named Lilton Mormon, and they lovingly reared the children together. Their's was a loving, happy and holy marriage for 46 years until the Lord called Lilton home.

At the age of 15, Louise united and was baptized by the founder of the Canaan Missionary Baptist Church, Rev. Sylvester Norton. Being a Licensed Practical Nurse was her cherished profes-

sion, her profession in the secular arena. However, God had another job for her to do in the spiritual realm. It was at Canaan that she began her Christian Education career. She started as the Sunday school secretary, and then became a Sunday school teacher, and eventually became a Sunday school superintendent. Louise recognized her spiritual calling and to that end she dedicated herself in preparation of her assigned task from God. She travelled to various cities and states attending Congress-

es of Christian Education, National Conventions, and December Conferences of Christian Education to take whatever courses were available and appropriate to fulfill her calling. After taking the required courses, she entered into a four year program and graduated from the Christian Education Administrative Workshop. She was also certified by the Sunday School Publishing Board (an auxiliary of the National Baptist Convention, U.S.A., Inc.) to teach a number of classes on the national level. In the process of equipping herself, she realized that the knowledge she was gaining was not just for her to keep, so she became an encourager. She disciplined others and urged them to equip themselves, take classes, seek "Certificates of Progress", and apply what they learned to their every day lives. She was a teacher, counselor, and mentor who helped many other people to aspire and achieve their Christ centered endeavors. Many lives were touched and many hearts were transformed because of Louise Mormon.

Mrs. Mormon was the Christian Education director of the Canaan Baptist Church for over 30 years. It was her responsibility to guide and direct the various ministries of the church to ensure that they functioned effectively and efficiently. Additionally, she was the New Members Class Instructor and Director of Membership Services. She also took courses in the Adult Vocational Division of the Milwaukee Area Technical College to receive her Young Child Personal Training certificate. This enable her to become the operations manager of the Canaan Day Care Center during its operation. She also attended the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee and received her Certification in Early Childhood Education.

Her's was a life well lived. She enjoyed teaching the Word of God, and training others in leadership roles in

the church community. She loved family, helping people, traveling, cooking, and baking, especially turkey and dressing, chicken and dumplings, chocolate cake, German chocolate cake, coconut cake, banana pudding, and the all time favorite, peach cobbler (just to name a few).

She received her heavenly crown that we are sure was studded with many jewels on May 7, 2026, just 22 days shy of her 95th birthday. Plans were already underway for a party of at least 100 people (her words), where there would have to be many turkeys cooked (again, her words). But, that was not to be. God called and Louise answered His call peacefully.

She transitioned from her temporary earthly residence and entered into the fullness of eternal life. Loved ones who preceded her in death include: her parents, Ulysses and Corrine Turner; husbands, Oliver Strozier Bey and Lilton Mormon; two daughters, Brenda M. Catheren and Areatha G. 



## Why we need to keep talking about mental health

Cecilia Tenorio is honored to work in community-based mental health as the Health and Wellness Coordinator at Community Advocates Public Policy Institute. She came to this work with personal experience, having navigated suicidal ideation, major depressive disorder, and PTSD, with a steadfast belief that recovery is possible—and sustained when families and the community support people who need a helping hand.

When she was a teenager, mental health issues were not spoken about openly. It was often misunderstood, minimized, or hidden. Conversations are more common to-

day, in the post-COVID-19 era, but there is still a long way to go.

The reality facing our young people in Wisconsin is urgent and impossible to ignore. According to the Office of Children's Mental Health 2025 Annual Report, 60 percent of Wisconsin children with a mental health concern, such as depression, anxiety, or behavioral challenges, had difficulty getting the treatment they needed.

This is why Cecilia chose to be part of the solution. Through her facilitation of Youth Mental Health First Aid workshops, she works



to empower adults—whether parents, caregivers, educators, or mentors—to feel more confident when supporting youth. The training provides practical tools to recognize signs of struggle,

respond with care, and connect young people to help.

Through her personal and professional experiences, Cecilia has learned that being a trusted adult is not about having all the answers. It's about listening without judgment, challenging stigma, and creating space for honest conversations. In every Youth Mental Health First Aid course, she sees how powerful it is when adults reflect on their own mental health and commit to showing up differently for the youth in their lives. Continuing to talk about mental health is how we save lives. It's how we build trust, reduce stigma,

and remind young people—and each other—that no one has to struggle alone.

If you want to learn how to support the young people in your life, Cecilia invites you to take the next step and be part of the solution. A Youth Mental Health First Aid training will be held in June. Keep an eye out on the RISE Drug Free MKE calendar to join.

## Why HBCUs May Be Better for Black Students, According to Science

Recent studies suggest that where you go to college can shape more than your career. It may also affect your long-term brain health.

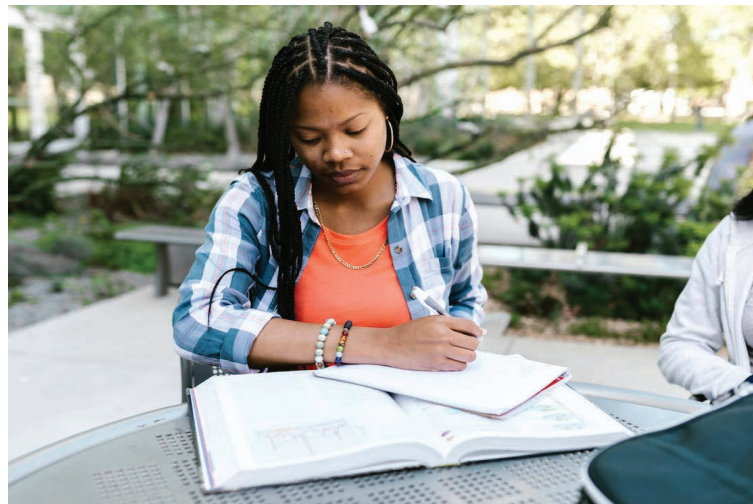
A study, published in JAMA Network Open, found that Black adults who attended historically Black colleges and universities, or HBCUs, had better memory and cognitive function later in life than those who attended predominantly white institutions.

Researchers say the findings point to the effectiveness of supportive learning environments. They add that reducing stress tied to discrimination during early adulthood may help protect cognitive health over time.

### Study finds long-term cognitive benefits

The study analyzed nearly 2,000 Black adults who attended college between 1940 and 1980. About 35 percent of participants went to HBCUs.

Around age 62 — the average age in the study — people who attended HBCUs



showed stronger memory and cognitive performance than those who attended predominantly white institutions (PWIs). Researchers found that differences in educational environment, especially during segregation and early integration, may have played a role.

The study looked at how exposure to what it called “state-sanctioned racialized education policies” shaped long-term outcomes. Those experiences, researchers said, may influence stress levels, access to support systems and overall health.

“Participants who attended HBCUs were more likely,

for example, to have mothers or female caregivers that had a college education,” Dr. Marilyn Thomas, an assistant professor of medicine at the University of California, San Francisco, told The Guardian.

“They were also more likely to have reported being shown affection when they were growing up, love and affection.”

Researchers have long linked chronic stress, including racism, to worse health outcomes. Over time, repeated stress can affect the body's systems, including those tied to aging and brain health.

“It didn't matter what form of racism I was looking at ... exposure to racism was associated with worse health,” Thomas said, according to The Guardian.

### What it means for long-term health

The study adds to growing evidence that social and environmental factors shape health in lasting ways. While individual choices matter, researchers say broader conditions like education, community and exposure to stress all play a role. They also

note that the findings show a strong correlation, not causation, meaning the study cannot prove that any single factor directly leads to better or worse sleep.

For Black Americans in particular, the findings highlight how culturally supportive spaces may help counter some of the long-term effects of systemic inequality.

Researchers caution that more study is needed to fully understand the link between education and cognitive aging. Still, the results suggest that the benefits of HBCUs may extend far beyond the classroom, influencing health and quality of life decades later.

### Why environment matters

HBCUs have historically provided spaces where Black students can learn in culturally affirming environments. Experts say that a sense of belonging can reduce stress and support both academic and personal development.

During the mid-20th century, when many of the study's participants were in school, segregation and discrimination limited access to many colleges. HBCUs often served as critical institutions for education, mentorship and community.

Researchers suggest that these environments may serve as protective factors. Lower exposure to discrimination in daily campus life, combined with stronger social support, may help reduce long-term strain on the body and brain.

### A sense of pride and connection

Beyond academics, many

HBCU graduates describe a strong sense of identity and pride tied to their schools. Alumni networks are often tight-knit, with graduates quick to support and defend their institutions.

That connection can extend well beyond graduation. From homecoming traditions to professional networks, HBCU alumni often maintain lifelong ties that reinforce community and a sense of belonging.

Health experts say that kind of social connection can also play a role in overall well-being. Strong relationships and a sense of purpose are linked to better mental health and, in some cases, improved physical health outcomes.
