### Giannis Antetokounmpo traded to Heat in blockbuster deal that spells the end of an era for Bucks

Giannis Antetokounmpo is being traded from the Milwaukee Bucks to the Miami Heat in a blockbuster deal that finally ends the perennial All-Star forward's turbulent relationship with the franchise he led to the 2021 NBA championship.

The Bucks are also sending Bobby Portis to Miami in the deal. In return, the Bucks will receive All-Star guard Tyler Herro, center Kel'el Ware,



forward Jaime Jaquez Jr., second-year guard Kasparas Jakučionis, three first-round draft picks (2026, '31 and '33), one pick swap (2030) and a 2033 second-round selection, ESPN's Shams Charania reported.

One of the three first-round picks is the No. 13 selection in Tuesday's NBA Draft. The other two first-round picks are unprotected.

The trade culminates more than a year of speculation that the two-time MVP and franchise stalwart wouldn't finish his career with the Bucks team that drafted him. It arrives on the heels of a 32-50 season in Milwaukee in which the Bucks finished nine games out of the playoffs.

The Boston Celtics were also reported to be among (Continued on page 2)

# Antetokounmpo traded to Heat

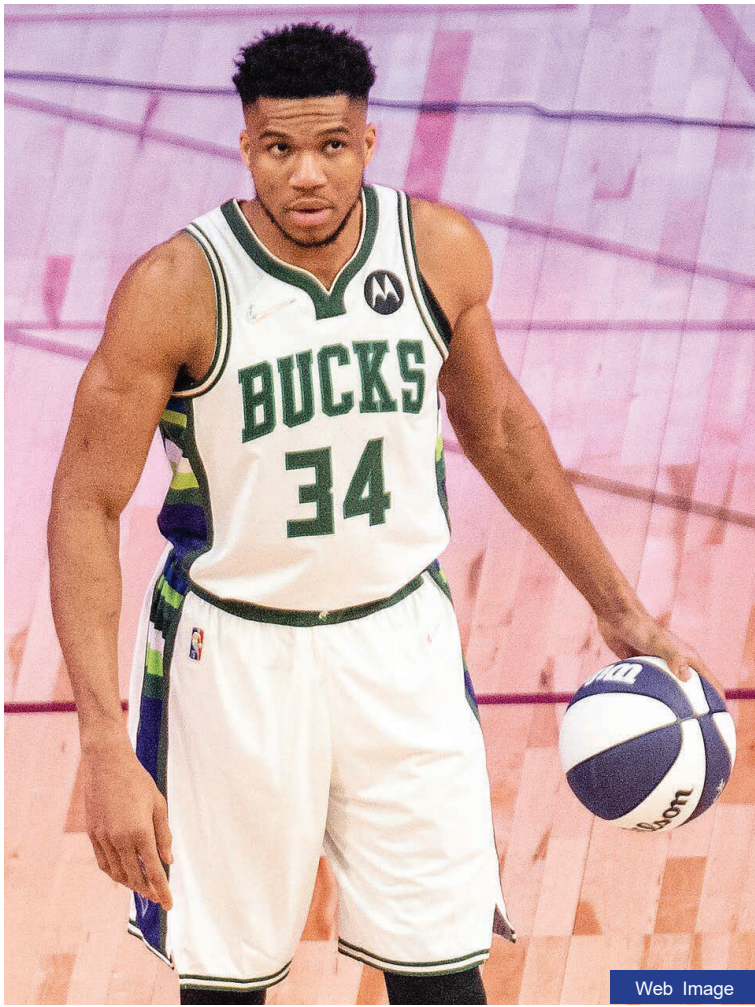
the final suitors for Antetokounmpo, reportedly offering All-NBA forward Jaylen Brown and two first-round picks, but will now have to look elsewhere as they seek to improve their roster and return to contention. Yahoo Sports' Kevin O'Connor reported that new Bucks co-owner Jimmy Haslem — who also owns the NFL's Cleveland Browns — ultimately preferred the Heat's offer to one centered around Brown because he was worried Brown would eventually want out of Milwaukee, similar to Antetokounmpo or what Browns defensive end Myles Garrett did in Cleveland.

## What Bucks, Heat get out of the deal

In parting with Antetokounmpo, the Bucks receive a talented young scoring guard in 26-year-old Herro and a two-way post presence in Ware, who was stuck behind Bam Adebayo in Miami but stuffed the stat sheet when given playing time. Alongside the role players and draft picks, the return sets Milwaukee up well for a rebuild in the post-Antetokounmpo era. The Bucks also could create a \$25.5 million trade exception with the deal.

The Heat gutted their depth and draft capital to acquire Antetokounmpo, but will field what projects as one of the most formidable defensive front lines in NBA history in return. Antetokounmpo and Adebayo have 11 All-Defensive Team selections between them, and Antetokounmpo is a former Defensive Player of the Year.

The acquisition of Por-

tis helps soften the blow of the roster and capital purge. And the Heat will hope the addition of the two-time MVP will elevate them into immediate contention in an Eastern Conference that's constantly shifting at the top.

Antetokounmpo likely gave the Heat assurances this will not be a short-term rental for the franchise. He will be eligible on Jan. 6, 2027, to sign a maximum extension with the Heat: four years, \$275 million if he opts out; or three years, \$214 million if he opts in.

## Trade was a long time coming

Speculation about Antetokounmpo's exit started before the 2025-26 season began. As the losses piled up, so did the tension in Milwaukee. After home fans booed the Bucks during a blowout loss to the Timberwolves on Jan. 13, Antetokounmpo

pointed two thumbs down and booed them back.

Antetokounmpo's final season in Milwaukee was also plagued by injury. He remained a force when available, averaging 27.6 points, 9.8 rebounds and 5.4 assists per game. But he was limited to a career-low 36 games at 31 years old.

Antetokounmpo sustained his second calf injury of the season in January. He returned to play six games in March but missed Milwaukee's final 15 games amid a lost Bucks season and the trade speculation that ultimately overwhelmed his final campaign in Milwaukee.

That speculation only amplified ahead of the NBA Draft amid reports that Antetokounmpo wanted out and had preferred destinations.

## Bitter end to one of Bucks' best eras

The deal marks an end to the franchise's most successful era since Kareem Abdul-Jabbar and Oscar Robertson led Milwaukee to two Finals appearances and an NBA championship in the early 1970s.

The Bucks selected Antetokounmpo with the No. 15 pick in the 2013 NBA Draft as a raw, high-upside prospect with an enormous physical tool set. He delivered on that upside and more.

Antetokounmpo spent his rookie season developing off the bench as a 19-year-old before joining the starting lineup full-time in his second NBA season. He made his first All-Star team in his fourth season in Milwaukee and has been an All-Star in eight seasons since, as a dominant two-way force.

Antetokounmpo won the first of his two consecutive NBA MVP awards after the 2018-19 season. He also won Defensive Player of the Year alongside his second MVP award the following season.

In 2020-21, Antetokounmpo completed his NBA resumé. Playing alongside Kris Middleton and Jrue Holiday, Antetokounmpo led the Bucks to the franchise's second NBA cham-

pionship. The only major accomplishment now missing from his career as a pro is entry into the Hall of Fame, which is a certainty as soon as he's put on the ballot.

## Milwaukee's decline preceded Antetokounmpo's exit

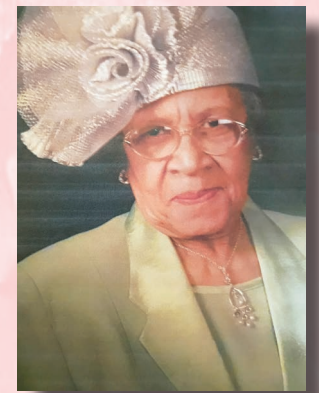
Milwaukee didn't maintain its contender status after winning the 2021 championship and hasn't advanced past the second round of the playoffs since. It's suffered first-round playoff exits in each of the last three postseasons.

Middleton and Holiday are both gone, and Milwaukee's attempts to rebuild another contender around Antetokounmpo fizzled with Damian Lillard's Achilles tendon tear during the 2025 postseason.

The Bucks exceeded expectations early in the 2025-26 season with a 6-3 start. But they quickly faded out of contention as the drama around Antetokounmpo's status took over. Now they'll engage in a full-blown rebuild following the exit of a franchise icon.

Antetokounmpo is playing on a three-year, \$186 million contract extension he signed in 2023 in the aftermath of Milwaukee's trade to acquire Lillard. That extension includes a player option for the 2027-28 season.

# Obituaries

## Clive Davis, monumental music producer and record industry titan, has passed

Clive Davis, the legendary music producer of industry icons from Janis Joplin and Whitney Houston to Billy Joel and Santana, has died.

Davis, famously dubbed “the man with the golden ears,” was 94. His family confirmed his death in a social media post. His publicist also confirmed his death to CNN.

Davis’s family remembered him as both “a towering figure whose influence changed music forever” as well as “the man who led our family with grace, generosity, and kindness.”

He was hospitalized in late May for an upper respiratory issue, Rolling Stone reported, but was discharged earlier this month.

Clive Davis, then a lawyer at Columbia Records, with Johnny Cash as he signs a record contract around 1960, seven years before Davis would become president of the record label.

The Brooklyn-born Davis never intended to lead a life in music, let alone shape pop culture’s musical tastes for decades. After his parents died in his late teens, he graduated from Harvard Law School and became a lawyer before going to work for Columbia Records in 1960. Five years later, Davis had ascended to be the record label’s top

lawyer and was soon named Columbia’s president.

“I was thrust into it,” he told CNN in 2013. “Never knowing I had a natural ear and gift for music that,” he said, “would become the passion of my life.”

### Instinct for talent

Davis’ first major signing was Janis Joplin, whom he first saw perform at the Monterey Pop Festival in 1967. In his 2013 memoir “The Soundtrack of my Life,” Davis described Joplin’s stage presence as “not conventionally beautiful,” but “her body seemed to vibrate with the modulations of her voice, which struck with equal impact whether she was wailing at the top of her lungs or delivering an intimate whisper.”

His instinct for talent led Davis to discover and sign eventual megastars like Bruce Springsteen, Carlos Santana, Chicago, Earth, Wind and Fire, Aerosmith and Barry Manilow. Billy Joel was floundering as a recording artist when Davis signed him in 1973. “Piano Man” was Joel’s first album at Columbia and paved his way to superstardom.

“When they all hit, one after another and I was there, making that judgment... it obviously gave me confidence to keep going,” Davis said.

The 1980s brought perhaps Davis’ most storied discovery: 19-year-old pop sensation Whitney Houston. Their collaboration led to a record-setting seven consecutive No. 1 singles, including “Saving All My Love for You,” “How Will I Know,” “I Wanna Dance with Somebody (Who Loves Me)” and “Where Do Broken Hearts Go.”

Houston’s drug-related death in 2012 led to one of Davis’ greatest heartbreaks. The 48-year-old died in her Beverly Hills hotel room the night of Davis’ famed pre-Grammy gala. He told CNN he had seen Houston just two days before and the pair had planned to explore new music.

“She was vital, optimistic, looking forward to the future,” Davis said in 2024.

If Davis didn’t discover a star, there was a good chance he nurtured them along the way. Simon and Garfunkel, The Grateful Dead, Dionne Warwick, Miles Davis, Rod Stewart and Luther Vandross all crossed his path.

When Aretha Franklin’s career stalled in later years, Davis contemporized her style. In 1987, Franklin went to number one on Billboard’s Hot 100 chart with “I Knew You were Waiting (For Me),” a duet with George Michael that marked her first number one hit since 1967’s “Respect.”

### ‘You’ve got to be a survivor’

The accolades didn’t come without struggles. Davis was pushed out of Columbia Records in 1973 over accusations he used company funds for personal uses. He later said in his memoir that the expenses were always meant to be reimbursed. The scandal came at the same time as a federal investigation of alleged “payola” at Columbia, of which Davis was cleared, but he was still charged with tax evasion on unreimbursed expenses. Five of the six charges were later dropped.

“This virtually complete exoneration received nothing like the coverage of all the baseless charges, rumors, and guilt-by-association whispers that I had lived with since leaving Columbia,” Davis wrote in 2013.

He responded by starting Arista Records and continuing his unprecedented hot streak. Later, in 1989, Arista expanded into country music and struck big with Alan Jackson and Brooks & Dunn.

“You’ve got to be a survivor,” Davis once said of show business. “You’ve got to rise above cold periods, you’ve got to come back.”

Davis himself won four Grammy awards and was inducted into the Rock and Roll Hall of Fame in 2000. That same year he formed J Records and launched the career of Alicia Keys, whose debut album “Songs In A Minor” sold more than 10 million copies and won her five Grammy Awards.

### Further growth

Davis expanded into hip-hop in the ’90s, partially acquiring Sean Combs’ label Bad Boy Records, which spawned enormous hits from Notorious B.I.G., Faith Evans and others.

Davis’ relationship with Combs was the subject of scrutiny in his later years. Combs was found guilty of transportation to engage in prostitution in a 2025 federal trial and not guilty of more serious charges, including sex trafficking.

Davis married twice and had four children. In his 2013 book, he revealed he was bisexual, telling CNN he only explored this after the failure of his second marriage.

“I opened myself up to the possibility of having a relationship with a person, rather than a gender,” he said.

Davis continued to be active in music until the end of his life, continuing to host his yearly pre-Grammy party the night before the ceremony and holding the title of chief creative officer at Sony Music.

In a statement on Monday, the label paid tribute to Davis, who it said was “responsible for a huge part of the recorded legacy of the company.”

“Not only are many, many artists we represent continuously indebted to his service but so many staff members have been influenced and mentored by his deep love and respect for our company which he carried right up until today,” the statement read.

But those “golden ears” are what Davis will most be remembered for, even if he believed that simply recognizing opportunity was the real secret to his success.

“I’m not being modest, it was luck that I got the opportunity,” he said. “I think life is seizing those opportunities.”

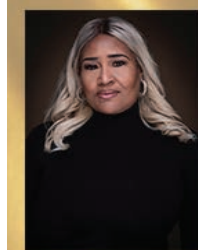





## Free evening activities for young people at new Safe Summer Sites

Thanks to the initiative of students, the new Safe Summer Sites program is providing free evening activities for young people ages 12 to 20 in Milwaukee — activities such as 3-on-3 basketball and other athletics, DJs and dancing, access to mobile recording studios, table games including table tennis, video games, and more.

Safe Summer Sites is made possible by civic and community partners backing the program with an investment of more than \$1.5 million. That includes \$500,000 each from the City of Milwaukee and Milwaukee County DHHS, and \$400,000 in in-kind support by MPS through the use of its Twilight Centers, where hours will be extended for the program.

Children's Wisconsin and the Medical College of Wis-

consin's Violence Response Public Health and Safety Team also are helping fund Safe Summer Sites, among other community partners participating.

The program grew out of Milwaukee leaders meeting with MPS students.

**Listening to student voice**  
"We heard a clear message: that young people want safe

places to go; they want trusted, caring, responsible adults in their lives; they want positive activities and opportunities to connect and thrive; and a real voice in shaping the programs and experiences designed for them," David Muhammad, deputy director of the Milwaukee County Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS), said.

Muhammad and other community leaders including Milwaukee Mayor Cavalier Johnson and Milwaukee County Executive David Crowley announced the new program at an event Tuesday, June 16, at James Madison Academic Campus. Madison is the site of one of the Twilight Centers.

"It makes me feel seen, knowing we have so many adults wanting to give us a better future and making sure that we're safe," said Leilanna McAllister, who is graduating from Madison on June 23. "It's really nice, honestly, to know that a lot of people that have our backs and want us to be better."

### Monday to Saturday evenings

Expected to serve about 1,000 young people a day, Safe Summer Sites will be open from 5:30 to 10:30 p.m. Monday through Saturday.

Anthony Williams, a rising senior at Madison, said, "These are more than just programs. These are spaces where young people can feel welcomed, respected, valued, and can encounter things that can bring them happiness."

He added, "Just come along with us, hang out, feel free, feel safe in an environment where you're going to be heard."

Safe Summer Sites will be expanding outdoors to parks, as well. Programming will be available for a span of age groups within the 12-to-20 range; activities for young people 18 to 20 will include Milwaukee Recreation's Late Night Leagues.

### Easing worries for parents

"If you're a parent, especially the parent of a teenager, you know summer can bring more independence and also a few extra worries," said Missy Zombor, president of the Milwaukee Board

of School Directors and the parent of a 16-year-old. "We find ourselves constantly asking, who are our kids with, what are they doing, and, most importantly, are they safe?"

"Opportunities outside of school during summer give parents peace of mind because we know they're not just staying busy; they're building friendships, learning new things, and spending time with caring, trusted adults who support them, and that's where Safe Summer Sites come in," she added.

"This work is another way that we can come together as a community to provide the support our young people need to stay busy, especially during the summer months, because we know that the evening hours can either be a time of opportunity or a time of risk."

"Together, we can help tip the balance toward opportunity," President Zombor said.

One of the goals of having Safe Summer Sites is prevention. "Violence is not just a public safety issue but also a public health crisis," said Reggie Moore, director of Community Safety Policy and Engagement for the Medical College of Wisconsin Comprehensive Injury Center.

"The research is clear: Young people who have access to structured programming, caring mentors, and safe environments are significantly less likely to be involved in or become victims of violence. Safe Summer Sites is our community's commitment to turning that evidence into action," he said.
