Mandela Barnes drops out of the Democratic primary for Wisconsin governor

Mandela Barnes dropped out of the Democratic primary for Wisconsin governor on Thursday amid news that the state party had reviewed past allegations of inappropriate behavior, further shaking up the race less than two weeks before the Aug. 11 election.

The former lieutenant governor made the announcement in a video posted on his Facebook page as democratic socialist Francesca Hong has garnered strong support from the liberal wing of the party.

Barnes' decision to drop out came a day after the release of a Marquette Law School poll of Wisconsin Democratic primary voters that found Hong leading Barnes and the other candidates by a significant margin, although about one-third of primary voters remained undecided.

"It's become very clear who our nominee is going to be," Barnes said.

Barnes' move came on the same day that the Milwaukee Journal Sentinel reported that it had asked him about allegations of inappropriate behavior lodged with the state Democratic Party, local party officials and others against him.

The Wisconsin Democratic Party received an anonymous

letter in 2024 and again in 2025 making allegations against Barnes, a person with direct knowledge of the party's actions told The Associated Press. The person was not authorized to speak publicly about the review.

The party hired a law firm in 2025 to look into claims that Barnes used his position in the party to seek out inappropriate relationships with young adult women, the person said. The review found nothing actionable because the allegations were anonymous and unspecific, the person with knowledge of the probe said.

Barnes' campaign issued a statement saying, "There are no allegations of misconduct or wrongdoing against Mandela."

Barnes is the third Democrat to withdraw from the race. Lt. Gov. Sara Rodriguez ended her run amid a campaign finance scandal two weeks ago and former state economic development director Missy Hughes dropped out in June.

After Rodriguez ended her campaign, Milwaukee County Executive David Crowley rejoined the race with the endorsement of Gov. Tony Evers.

Crowley made a direct plea to Barnes' supporters to back



him.

"There's a place for you in what we're building," he posted on social media.

Evers told reporters Thursday that he was surprised by Barnes' move.

"But he needs to do what he needs to do," Evers said. "I don't know why he's getting out. I have to believe it's something relatively important."

Evers said he stuck by his endorsement of Crowley, who worked closely with Evers and Republican lawmakers on a deal to increase funding for local communities. Evers chose to endorse him over Barnes, who served as his lieutenant governor in his first term.

Evers said Crowley was the best candidate "even if Man-

dela was in."

Hong did not immediately return a text message seeking comment.

Joel Brennan, a long-shot candidate in the race, said, "It's unfortunate for voters that this primary has gotten more attention for chaos than the stakes of this election."

The shake-up comes after nearly 128,000 voters have already returned absentee ballots and on the third day of in-person early voting. On Wednesday, a judge rejected a lawsuit supported by the Democratic Party seeking to allow voters who have already returned their absentee ballots to cancel them and vote again.

The winner of the Democratic primary is expected to face U.S. Rep. Tom Tiffany, who faces only nominal opposition in the Republican primary. Tiffany, who has the endorsement of President Donald Trump, said it's become clear the race will be a choice between a "socialist agenda" or "common sense."

"This election is not about red versus blue," he said. "It is about whether Wisconsin stays Wisconsin."

Barnes ending his campaign comes after he benefited from other candidates dropping out in the Democratic primary race for Senate in 2022 to clear the field for him. He ended up losing by under 27,000 votes that year to Republican U.S. Sen. Ron Johnson.

Community rallies to support Lincoln Avenue School teachers after fire destroyed building

The community is stepping up to support teachers from Lincoln Avenue School as they work to rebuild their classrooms after a fire in June left the building a total loss.

With the school year approaching in September, teachers are starting from scratch on classroom supplies. Several donation drives are now underway to help.

Azora Books is asking people to drop off supplies not commonly offered elsewhere, including English and Spanish books and cleaning and teaching supplies.



Milwaukee Public Schools is also accepting school supply donations at its Central Services Building during business hours. Milwaukee Police Department's District 2 is hosting a drive through

Aug. 24 as well. Donation boxes will be available at every district.

Todd Gross, a Lincoln Avenue School alumnus, said the response from the communi-

ty has been overwhelming.

"Really a true thank you to everyone that is stepping up to help out to bring something together for these kids. I mean they're kind of scratching from nothing here to build something, to give these kids a home, you know, so that they actually have a comfortable spot to learn in," Gross said.

A month after the fire, the community is also finding ways to honor the school's legacy. There are plans to light up the Hoan Bridge in blue, white and yellow for one day during the first week

of September, aligning with the start of the school year.

Gross said the tribute is a chance for the city to see the community spirit he feels.

"The lighting of the Hoan Bridge is just so symbolic to start the school year and really give them motivation to carry through," Gross said. "It's a connection of community, of perseverance and pushing through and just showing the support through Lincoln all just in one light show. It's such an amazing thing to have going there with the Hoan Bridge and lighting it up. It's so cool."

Milwaukee woman's persistence leads to cleanup of neglected city-owned lots near family home

After weeks of reporting trash, overgrown grass and hazardous trees on neighboring city-owned lots, Monica Leflore says persistence finally brought results.

A Milwaukee woman says weeks of persistence paid off after city crews cleaned up two neglected city-owned lots next to her family's home.

Monica Leflore spent weeks reporting trash, overgrown grass and hazardous trees on the vacant properties before

city-contracted crews arrived Tuesday to mow the lots, remove debris and mark trees for removal.

She said after repeatedly contacting the city, she decided it was time to escalate her concerns.

"I did tell them I was going to reach out to the news. I was reaching out to the

health department because it was going to bring rats and vermin, and it's about to start getting cold, so I definitely don't want rats, you know, harboring over here trying to get into our home," Leflore said.

Leflore also contacted her alderperson, saying she wanted action before the neglected lots became a

bigger problem.

"I finally reached out to the alderperson ... now there's going to be an order for them to trim the trees that are over the power lines," Leflore said.

She said the overgrown lots had become an eyesore and encouraged illegal dumping.

"People see it's trash, so then they'll just assume it's trash and just start throwing things over here, and we don't want that for this community," Leflore said.

When crews arrived, she said it was a welcome sight.

"Yes, I'm happy. My husband's going to be very happy," Leflore said.

Leflore said she wasn't looking for special treatment. She simply wanted the city-owned property maintained and said she turned to the media only after feeling like she had exhausted other options.

"I wasn't getting anywhere, and I know that you're a voice for the community, and I just reached out to you so that you could try and help us," Leflore said.

Johnny Jennings, sanitation area manager for the City of Milwaukee's central area, said

routinely patrol city-owned vacant lots, but reports from residents remain the fastest way to identify new problems.

"Having it called in as it's happening is the best way we can get to it quickly," Jennings said.

Residents can report illegal dumping, overgrown grass and other issues on city-owned property through the MKE Mobile app, the city's website or by calling 286-CITY. Complaints involving privately owned properties are handled by the Department of Neighborhood Services.

For Leflore, the cleanup is about more than freshly cut grass.

"Just keep calling, just keep being persistent because this is our community," Leflore said.

OFFICE OF THE MILWAUKEE COUNTY ELECTION COMMISSION:

TO THE VOTERS OF THE CITY OF MILWAUKEE:

Notice is hereby given of a partisan primary to be held in the City of Milwaukee on August 11, 2026, at which the nominees for the offices named below shall be chosen. The names of the candidates for each office, whose nominations have been certified to or filed in this office, are given under the title of the office under the appropriate party, each in its proper column, together with the questions submitted to a vote, if any, in the sample ballot below.

Information to Voters

- Upon entering the polling place and before being permitted to vote, a voter shall:
- state their name and address
 - show an acceptable form of photo identification*
 - sign the poll book**

***If a voter does not have acceptable photo identification, the voter may obtain a free photo ID for voting from the Division of Motor Vehicles.**

****If the voter is unable to sign the poll book due to disability, a poll worker may write the word “exempt.”**

If a voter is not registered to vote, they may register to vote at the polling place serving their residence if the voter provides proof of residence.

Where ballots are distributed to voters, the initials of two inspectors must appear on the ballot.

Upon being permitted to vote, the voter shall enter a voting booth or go to a machine and cast their ballot. The vote should not be cast in any manner other than specified here. Sample ballots or other materials to assist the voter in marking their ballot may be taken into the booth and copied. The sample ballot shall not be shown to anyone so as to reveal how the ballot is marked.

A voter who is a parent or guardian may be accompanied by the voter’s minor child or minor ward.

An election official may inform the voter of the proper manner for casting a vote, but the official may not advise or indicate a particular voting choice.

Assistance for Voting

A voter may select an individual to assist in casting their vote if the voter declares to the presiding official that they are unable to read, have difficulty reading, writing, or understanding English, or that due to disability are unable to cast their ballot. The selected individual rendering assistance may not be the voter’s employer or an agent of that employer or an officer or agent of a labor organization which represents the voter. If a voter is unable to state their name and address, an assistant may also do so for the voter.

At the partisan primary, the voter shall select the party of their choice. Voting for candidates of more than one party may invalidate the ballot. The voter must cast a vote for individual candidates.

Where Optical Scan Voting is used

- If a party preference *is designated*, and votes are cast for ballot candidates of another party or write-in votes are cast in another party, only votes cast in the designated party will count.
- If a party preference *is not designated*, and votes are cast for candidates (or write-in votes are cast) in more than one party, no votes will be counted.

Within the party of their choice, the voter shall fill in the oval next to the name of the candidate of their choice for each office for which they intend to vote. To vote for a person whose name does not appear on the ballot, the voter shall write in the name of the person of their choice in the space provided for a write-in vote and fill in the oval next to the write-in line. On referendum questions, the voter shall fill in the oval next to “yes” if in favor of the question, or the voter shall fill in the oval or connect the arrow next to “no” if opposed to the question.

When using an *electronic ballot marking device (“Express Vote”)* to mark an **optical scan ballot**, the voter shall touch the screen or use the tactile pad to select the party of their choice. The voter shall then touch the screen at the name of the candidate of their choice for each office for which they intend to vote. To vote for a person whose name does not appear on the ballot, the voter shall type in the name of the person of their choice in the space provided for a write-in vote. On referendum questions, the voter shall touch the screen at “yes” if in favor of the question, or the voter shall touch the screen at “no” if opposed to the question.

Spoiling Ballots

If a voter spoils an **optical scan ballot**, they shall return it to an election official who shall issue another ballot in its place, but not more than three ballots shall be issued to any one voter. If the ballot has not been initialed by two inspectors or is defective in any other way, the voter shall return it to the election official, who shall issue a proper ballot in its place.

After Voting the Ballot

After an official **optical scan ballot** is marked, the voter shall insert the ballot in the voting device or deliver the ballot to an inspector for deposit. The voter shall leave the polling place promptly.
